MINUTES OF THE AGC BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING 01/11/05

Meeting called to order at 7pm by president Rob Rathburn.

Present: Rob Rathburn, Terry Humbargar, AJ Davis, Bill Chin, John Steinmeyer, Joseph Huber, Greg Sether, Gary Ames, Steve Fowler, Richard Immel, Bill Hall, Michael Miller, Cary Smallegan, Randy Still, Martin Visnak

I CALL TO ORDER

II MINUTES

Minutes corrections:

Some members of the board would like to see the minutes in a narrative form.

Hall's "Old Business" did not mention the member's name, Steve Morgan.

Treasurer's report under "Financial report" correction: Jim Ashmore was asked to assist, which he granted. Also regarding CommFed: we changed accounts because it was generating bank charges.

Motion correction: 12.14.04.b – To spend funds for legal council. Sand Creek Raiders contract will serve as a basis for master contract for AGC general use, rewriting AGC by-laws, and consultation on legal issues from time-to-time as deemed necessary by the executive committee.

It was confirmed that our Workparty is scheduled for May 15th, Sunday.

Correction of member's name under "Other Business": Dave Olive, not Dave Oliver.

III MEMBERS FORUM

Rathburn - Suggestion to suspend smoking through the length of the meeting, to make it comfortable for the members. Board members agreed.

Member noticed that on January's calendar, Wednesday Trap was omitted on second half of month. Immel & Sudduth noted omission and it will be corrected in future newsletters.

Fields – Discussion about a discipline shoot, with flag down & men walking around with firearms with open actions on silhouette range. Chin said they will address it, and straighten things out. Davis suggested the flagpole on the silhouette range needs to be moved to make the flag more visible.

West – Question during 3-Gun matches at 200yd range: should they also use the flag? (Answer was affirmative.) Also questioned steel target at 200yd range: range rules stated lead bullets only, can they still use jacketed bullets. Adams said lead bullets are for normal members without a range officer present. For matches only, jacketed bullets are approved with the steel target with bullet trap (see range rule 22). Also, question regarding dates for 3-gun matches.

Member would like to have the times listed for each match in the club calendar. Immel wasn't given the times for some matches, and will track that down.

Young – Completed laying out location of the proposed skeet range. Young also provided info regarding our current traps, how many birds they've thrown and the profit each trap has generated:

Trap #1 715,400 targets, \$100,156 gross, \$6,477 net
Trap #2 – 1,700,000 targets, \$247,803 gross, \$160,000 net
Trap #0 – 1,415,000 targets, \$198,000 gross, \$126,907 net
Trap #3 – 59,000 targets, \$830,000 gross, \$49,000 net
Trap #4 – 50,000 targets, \$70,000 gross, \$40,000 net
Total \$500,000 since the 5 traps have been in over a period of 5 years. \$6.14 per box, \$12.76 AGC profit.

IV PRESIDENT REPORT

Reminder to send agenda items in advance. Rob will try to get the agenda to the Board members prior to the meeting.

Paula Ray Bill – Rob cannot reconcile this bill compared to the total bill, along with the interest on the old bill. We're going to send her a letter, requesting to sit down & get a complete reconciliation of what NRA & AGC has paid and what we owe.

Rob asked the feeling of the board about contacting Winchester and asking for all material that was generated from this lawsuit. Consensus is - it's AGC property. Steinmeyer will handle the letters to Winchester & Ray. Rob will give any member a copy of this bill if asked for, since the members paid for it.

Mr. Winchester told us that he received the \$5,000 back from arbitration. We received \$5,000 and were charged approximately \$1300 by Paula Ray for attorney fees, so we received approximately \$3700 back..

Tom Tedesco – request of an installation of a hand trap. Board agreed that we cannot grant this request.

V FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer's Report – The deferred income has now been corrected which removes the negative status of our budget. All checking & money market accounts from Bellco have been closed (\$112,000). It has been moved to CommFed which has a higher interest rate for our new money market account.

Admin Assistant – Board manual contact information & quarterly financial reports (as of 12/31/04) were passed out.

VI OLD BUSINESS

1st VP – The Rocky Mountain Vintagers (Vintage Shotgun Organization) had 15 shooters, \$125 usage fee, \$267 profit. They were unhappy because of price, but they had fun and some signed up on the waiting list to become members.

Humbargar sent certified letter to Steve Morgan and had a phone conversation. Morgan had been questioned regarding a safety violation. They agreed that upon receipt of Morgan's 2005 card, AGC would refund his dues. With a waiting list of almost 400 people, Terry felt we could fill his spot.

2nd VP – The new well filtration and water purification system has been installed. The trees will be cut down beginning the end of the month. A J has had several calls about the unauthorized range closure. Twenty-four hour contact and the range closure signs had been delivered by the city per our agreement. The city apologized and won't do anything until the signs are here. The adjustor mis-measured the roofs regarding hail damage. A J has re-contacted Ohio Casualty and they will re-evaluate our claim.

Secretary – nothing

Treasurer – correction, we are \$3,000 in the red.

Fowler – Question on the status with the attorney contract with Sand Creek. Steinmeyer said nothing has happened to date.

VII NEW BUSINESS

Rathburn - Terry Rhodes, Longmont Police Citizen's Academy, submitted a letter, requesting the use of a pistol berm for a firearms class. Rob will advise Terry that if Longmont is making the request they will need to address the Board.

1st VP – There are 700 paid members, approximately 350 wait list. New member orientation classes: Feb 12th noon-2, Feb 13th noon-2, Feb 26th noon-2, scheduling approximately 35-40 in each one.

2nd VP – Purchasing another trailer for an office is too expensive. A J needs another door for the small trailer (\$140). **01.11.05.A MOTION TO BUY A DOOR FOR THE SMALL TRAILER. SECONDED. PASSES.** A J said he'd like to clean the small trailer out. Also, Davis discussed problem of range closure rumors, answering machine wording, members shooting on the range when the range was closed.

Treasurer – John wants to hire a bookkeeping firm to take care of payroll & taxes. He has talked to 3 firms, cost is \$6,000 - \$6,500 per year. He would like it to be put in place immediately. We spend \$6,000 for accounting and admin salary allocated. Marvin Pugh retained to do 2004 taxes, and no further. Correction by Sudduth was pointed out, per the 12/31/04 Income Statement, that we spent \$2176 on accounting for the 2004 year.

Motion to approve funding not to exceed \$8,000 for 2005 for a bookkeeping firm to do all of our financial activities – including payroll, taxes, and check writing, monthly reporting. Seconded. Request for results to be provided next month. Motion withdrawn.

01.11.05.B MOTION TO HAVE THE CLUB (KAREN & STEINMEYER), TALK TO OUR CURRENT ACCOUNTANT TO SEE IF HE'S CAPABLE TO PROVIDE THE SERVICES REQUIRED AT THIS TIME, FOR A BID. SECONDED. 11 FOR, 2 OPPOSED, 2 ABSTAIN. PASSES.

Secretary – no new business.

Smallegan – He has received messages and phone calls regarding club closure. A J will handle that. Davis gets 24 hours notice from the city for club closure, and will record the appropriate phone machine message.

Fowler – Had a question on the follow-up on member receiving a refund, due to deteriorating health and few months left to live. Sudduth confirmed that letter was sent, and will issue a refund once the 2005 card is returned.

Still – Clarified that Magnum (& Black powder) 10am start time, (through March or April). He wanted to know if other disciplines could add their times for the club calendar. He would like chairmen to show up to board meetings occasionally for their input. Randy will contact them. Randy also wants chairmen to write things in the newsletter.

Immel – Range activity calendar passed out this evening. There are over 200 events, not including trap shoots. There are conflicts during Raid. Military Rifle was cancelled per Adams and PSAC was cancelled per Hall. Does Black powder needs to be re-scheduled in August? Conflict on D-Day shoot, Military Rifle was moved to Saturday June 4th.

Motion that we use the classroom trailer for meetings, classes & shoot registrations instead of the clubhouse. Seconded. Amended that all meetings, classes, & shoot registrations where money is not collected at AGC cash register be held in the new classroom building. Such meetings used to be approved in advance by AGC Board and placed on activity calendar.

01.11.05.C MOTION: ALL ACTIVITIES (I.E. MEETINGS, CLASSES, ETC) HELD AT THE AGC MUST HAVE BOARD APPROVAL AND PLACED ON THE CLUB CALENDAR BY THE ACTIVITIES COORDINATOR. SECONDED. PASSED.

01.11.05.D MOTION: THAT DISCIPLINE REGISTRATIONS THAT HAPPEN ON SATURDAYS & SUNDAYS MUST BE DONE OTHER THAN THE CLUBHOUSE (I.E., CLASSES, TRAINING SESSIONS, SHOOT REGISTRATIONS, MEETINGS) WITH THE OBVIOUS EXCLUSION OF TRAP. SECONDED. PASSED.

01.11.05.E MOTION: USERS OF CLUB FACILITIES ARE RESPONSIBLE TO CLEAN THE FACILITY WHEN FINISHED AND REPORT ANY DAMAGE THAT OCCURS TO CLUB PROPERTY. SECONDED. PASSED.

Immel has updated & added newsletters to the website. He would like to get new pictures, have lost links, and schedule updates. He has talked to some people for doing it for us, cost is \$35/hr & up. Visnak has a contact in the same price range. Visnak has an example of his contact's web site on his laptop at tonight's meeting. Immel thinks website changes need to be made, but it will work for the time being. Immel suggested tabling it for now.

Ames – Had question about badges: he found out that he needs to fill out his dues renewal notice to get his new card & Board card.

Hall – Confirmed date of when to change gate combination: February 7th.

OTHER BUSINESS

Fowler – Alcohol issued tabled until we receive a liability opinion on alcohol use on the club property from an attorney.

VIII ADJOURNMENT
