Minutes

BOARD MEETING MINUTES 1/11/2022

Meeting called to order at 7pm by President Tom Desmond

Present: Boyd, Desmond, Kohler, Caraway, Baker, Dobbs, Hay, Faingold and Quiring

I. CALL TO ORDER

Pledge of Allegiance

II. AGENDA

1.11.2022 a. Motion to approve amended agenda – Add Employee Sick Leave to New Business, Add NRA Action Pistol Shed to Old Business

Motion seconded and passed

III. MINUTES

1.11.2022 b. Motion to approve minutes from 12/14/2021 BOD meeting Motion seconded and passed

IV. MEMBERS FORUM

Bob Smith – Bob spoke during the Member's Forum at the December meeting about club spending and cash/liquid assets. He felt that his discussion was not reflected accurately in the minutes and was brushed off. Bob is very displeased with the financials and has spoken to other members that feel the same. He asked for copies of the financials to review in his own time which he has not received yet. Loren said he would give Bob the information he has requested for 2019, 2020 and 2021, which he gave to Bob at the end of the meeting along with 2019 and 2020 tax returns. Michael mentioned to Bob that he may want to attend the next AGC Financial Review, so he has more insight into the club's financials, and Bob agreed and may attend. Bob is not against capital improvements, but he is against paying double for the improvements that are being done.

Nicole Quiring – Nicole received an email from a member asking if AGC had a Facebook page and he offered to create a page if one did not exist. The board thought there may have been an unsponsored page in existence at one time but not that they are aware of now. AGC is not interested in creating or maintaining a Facebook page due to a conflict of interest with Facebook as a company and no control over content or ads that could appear on the page. Nicole also received an email from an RSO that was approached by a member regarding an expansion first aid pack that he recommended adding to the existing first aid kits. The expansion pack is used for gunshot wounds specifically. The board explained that the existing first aid kits have all the same items that the expansion pack has and is not needed but appreciates the member's feedback. Chris suggested putting an announcement in the newsletter looking for a member that has experience with first aid or possibly first responder experience that could review the first aid kits and keep the items up to date, and report back to the board quarterly with updates for work party credits.

V. OLD BUSINESS

<u>Financial Report</u> — Treasurer, Loren Kohler - December revenues were \$18,764 and our expenses were \$16,164 leaving a net gain of \$2,600. Our YTD revenue is \$222,757 and our YTD expenses are \$283,828 leaving a loss of (\$61,071). Account balances: Chase Checking Account \$65,939; Chase Payroll Account \$10,203 and Chase Savings Account \$446,954; Bank of the West Money market account \$208,542; Bank of the West CD - closed; Chase Bank CD \$201,939. Loren said that all CDs have been closed and he would like to schedule the investment committee meeting in January to look at how to invest the money now that the CDs are closed. He reviewed the financials and there was nothing out of the ordinary to report. He noticed that the year-to-date utilities expenses have gone down compared to last year and the propane can fluctuate from \$2,000/month up to \$5,000/month during the winter months. Michael asked when the 100-yard cover is depreciated and Loren said it had already depreciated.

<u>Maintenance Update</u> – 2nd VP of Maintenance, David Faingold – David would like to address the weeds and goat heads all throughout the range because last year was extremely bad. He will look at weed control costs and report back at a later meeting. Dave Hay's understanding is that the weed control treatment must be done right away before they begin to grow. David also feels that having the front loaders come out to the club 2 times a year is sufficient. Tom asked David to add a timer switch in the benchrest trailer.

NRA Action Pistol Shed – President, Tom Desmond – NRA Action Pistol asked for a 10x12 shed at the December board meeting. Tom asked David to look at getting a quote for a Tuff Shed. David will also call Matthew Hess to discuss with him about the PSAC Conex shed they requested.

New Oil Lease – President, Tom Desmond – Tom reviewed the contract and sent a copy to the board to review as well. The acres listed in the contract is different than what was quoted by phone at 18 acres instead of 31.5 originally quoted. Tom asked David to review the contract in more detail and reach out to the person he spoke to and ask about the number of acres. David agreed to call.

<u>Clubhouse Renovation Status</u> – Board Member, Mel Caraway – Mel mentioned some issues that needed to be addressed by the contractor at the December meeting and all 12 issues have been addressed at this time. Mr. Turner, the Chief Examiner is insisting that we have an electrical engineer certification and a mechanical/plumbing certification in order for the county to consider the permit. The contractor is working on that and knows that will cost another \$2,500 which will be taken out of his own budget and the club will not pay extra. The hole in the building has not been closed on the west side. The contractor has ordered the material to do the siding.

Membership Renewal Update – Admin Assistant, Nicole Quiring – Nicole provided the following update – 952 members renewed for 2022. 1 member is pending a copy of his NRA verification. 98 members did not renew. All 27 life members renewed. We had a challenge getting paperwork back from members that paid by credit card. 2022 badge stickers will be mailed to members on 1/29/22.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

Incident Report – President, Tom Desmond – No reports this month.

Online Signature of Membership Renewal Documents – President, Tom Desmond – Tom and Michael will look at the capabilities of the member database to see if the paperwork can be completed/submitted online by members when they pay by credit card. They hope to have a solution in place before 2023 renewals.

<u>2022 New Member Orientations</u> – 1st VP, Chris Baker – Chris would like to conduct new member orientations on 2/26, 2/27, 3/5 and 3/12 in the education trailer.

Employee Sick Leave – 1st VP, Chris Baker – Tom found that according to a new employment law passed in 2021 that companies with more than 16 employees must provide 1 hour of sick leave for every 30 hours worked. The law was updated in 2022 to include all companies regardless of the number of employees. Nicole offered to help and ask Paychex for a report of hours worked in 2021 so AGC can comply with the new law.

Review February Calendar – Nicole Quiring reviewed the February calendar.

VII. BOARD ROUND TABLE

Mel Caraway – Mel was notified by Wednesday Trap chairman, Don Philips that he would like to resign as chairman. Mel will work with Nicole to create an announcement for the newsletter to look for a new chairman for Wednesday Trap.

Michael Quiring – Michael asked about document retention and how long the club should retain certain documents he holds in the secretary position. Loren told Michael we need to hold contracts for 5 years past the contract end date and we are not obligated to hold receipts and financial reports for longer than 3 years.

Dave Hay – Dave talked to two members with air soft guns that wanted to use them in the berms to practice. The members wanted to setup targets at an angle like they do at matches. The board discussed and determined that it is ok for members to use air soft guns at the club but the ROs need to ensure that members not using an air soft gun setup their targets in the berms per the rules. Chris made a note for the rules committee later this year to address again at that time. Dave also noticed that members moved the tire stands on the 100-yard range and did not want to move them back. Members are responsible for moving the targets back as they found them if they are moved.

Tom Desmond – Tom mentioned that trap employee, Maryssa is in ROTC at her school, and she asked if they can put together a marksmanship team and use the range a couple times a month for air soft guns. They will need a member to sponsor/support the team in order to use the club.

Loren Kohler – Loren would like to find a way to assist Don Philips with his membership in light of him retiring from the Wednesday Trap chairman position and for all his years of service in this role. Tom will reach out to Don directly to talk to him.

David Faingold – David mentioned that his son's friend left a metal target in one of the berms and it was stolen. Reminder to members – if you find someone else's property on site, please turn in to an RO or the clubhouse rather than taking something that is not yours.
