III PRESIDENT REPORT

Kathy Knapp's "retirement": We appreciate all the work she did & she will be sorely missed.

New Member Orientation Classes: have been going well. Terry Humbargar has done an outstanding job. Would also like to thank all the Board members that have helped with this.

Financials: Great job that Mike has done and we all appreciate his hard work.

M1A/M14 Match Dates: 3 match dates: April 28, May 26, June 23 9am. 03.13.07.a Motion to approve those dates for the M1A/M14 matches. Seconded. Motion passed

AGC Member, Dean Ames:

Wednesday Trap: asked why was trap raised \$1? Would like a copy of the figures to determine the increase in cost. Would like a copy of the paperwork of profit/loss, Wednesday shoots, Sunday shoots, etc. He would like his answers in writing, Rob offered to reply in writing.

V FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer's report, Mike Miller:

As of Dec 31, 2005-Dec 31, 2006: revenue \$252,216.39 expenses \$191,105.41 change of \$61,110.98.

CPA has done a spreading of income (membership dues) for proper accounting purposes, as income per month.

January balance sheet (including 1/12 dues rev 12409) \$13,835.30 expenses \$17,348.25 loss \$3,512.95.

Trap expenses & clay \$881.94. Management in general \$16,466.

Operating budget question from Rob: 2006 budget \$217,800, spent \$173,100 (high in legal expenses and low in maintenance). Mike did create a potential budget (based on last year's budget) potentially \$10,000 higher, based on last year's results & our total revenues for memberships if the rest of the club operates basically the same.

Two members bounced membership check: Would like to suspend them. They were mailed a letter Feb 15 requesting that they clear the bad checks. No response from either one. Has letters to notify them of their suspension. 03.13.07.b Motion to suspend these 2 members who bounced membership checks. Seconded. Motion passed.

VI OLD BUSINESS

1st Vice President, Terry Humbargar:

Review Membership: Would like to thank Karen for keeping this all going, printing cards, etc. It's a big job & we appreciate all her hard work. We are within 15 of our 1000 cap. Did get a call from a previous AGC member who hasn't renewed yet. Would like the Board to consider a \$25 late fee. It creates a ton of extra work for late renewals, orientations, etc. Will have it on the agenda for next month and would like feedback about.

Relocation: got a phone call from a current AGC member Dan Arizumi. He offered his thoughts on relocation – to think outside the box. To go into conjunction with possibly another business. It was a good thought and Terry appreciates his efforts.

2nd Vice President, A J Davis:

New Tractor Purchase Discussion: Jim Compton brought up looking at the used New Holland tractor. It comes from an Arizona dealership. AJ is leery. When it comes time to sell it, we'll get back more money back from a John Deere. We have a big John Deere parts house here in town and several dealers around here. 03.13.07.c *Motion to purchase this tractor, diesel, 4WD, \$26,000 cap. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed.* Rob would like anyone who operates this tractor to be trained by AJ or Jim before using it.

Treasurer, Mike Miller:

Black Powder Trap: we raised Wednesday trap based on the financials we saw. 03.13.07.d *Motion to increase the cost of Black Powder Trap to match Wednesday Trap (\$3/members, \$5/nonmembers). Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed.*

AGC Member, Debra Caldwell:

Training Dates: submit her range schedule for the year for approval. Mar 17, Apr 21, May 19 June 23, July 21, Aug 18, Sept 22, Oct 13, pistol only, magnum berm, 2:30pm-5:30pm, class size no more than 8 averaging 6, 2 shooters at a time. Rich does not see any conflicts. 03.13.07.e *Motion to approve 2007 pistol training dates. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed.* Would like to advertise this to current AGC members in the newsletter. Bill recommended putting up a flyer in the clubhouse instead of the newsletter. Debra has provided proof of insurance.

VII NEW BUSINESS

1st Vice President, Terry Humbargar:

Black Powder Trophy request: Al Main was unable to be here tonight. He would like \$170 for the black powder club championships. Eight plaques. 03.13.07.f *Motion to approve a maximum \$170 for 8 plaques. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed.*

2nd Vice President, AJ Davis:

Office: The cost for building an office in the double wide trailer would be under \$500. This could come out of AJ's maintenance budget. 03.13.07.g *Motion to allot \$500 for building a partition in the double wide. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed.*

Board of Directors, Randy Still:

Tractor show & Trap Shoot: would like to sponsor and show 20-25 tractors, something different for the club. Give the tractor club the opportunity to shoot trap and have a potluck. All we are providing is the ground to put it on. 03.13.07.h *Motion to set a date for this tractor show with 2 tractor clubs. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed.*

Deliberator Purchase: a friend of his will give him a price on the machines. Just in case someone had a heart attack. Discussion tabled until next BoD meeting.

Board of Directors, Martin Visnak:

RO class training topics and April Dates: decision was made to do range officer's classes every 2 years. Current range officers will continue to serve. New people can come in next year. Terry recommended a rotating class every year, cards are good for 2 years. Martin passed out an itinerary and would like feedback. He would also like to get on the schedule. AJ mentioned that if the members do not serve during those 2 years, they need to apply again. Also, no new AGC members. Bill recommended having at least one range officer at the range every Saturday/Sunday. Terry recommends that this is program be driven by one person, and limit the number of ROs per day.

Suggestion to put first aid kit/contained in marked boxes around the range, combination lock on it that matches the gate code. Costco has first aid kits for \$20. 03.13.07.i *Motion to install a minimum of 4 1st aid kits on the range, dispersed throughout the various places, not to exceed \$500. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed.* Current ROs are 41. Still necessary to have a class this year.

AGC Member, Steve Knoll:

PSAC safety class dates: getting a lot of requests for safety classes. Minimum of 10 per class, possibly needing 2 classes. Would like to know if he can hold one on the 5th Saturday of March (Mar 31st) and April 29th (also a 5th Saturday), 8am-4pm, berm 4 or 5. Be given an exception to shoot into the side berms for those classes. 03.13.07.j Motion to approve these 2 dates. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed. 03.13.07.k Motion that they can shoot into the side berms only during classes. Notifying the attendees that they can only do this during the class or organized shoots only. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed.

AGC Member, Denise & Gerald (JJ) Johnson,

Range dates for 3-Gun on 200 yd line: concerned on attendance with conflicting dates at another place. 1st Saturdays, pistol berms, after military shooters are completely done, in afternoons. Motion to make Gerald (JJ) Johnson 3-Gun chairman. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed. Bill mentioned that they don't want to tie up the 200 yd range the entire day, to allow time for the members to use it. Terry suggested 3-gun to possibly schedule dates for next year.
