BOARD MEETING MINUTES 4/12/2022

Meeting called to order at 7pm by President Tom Desmond

Present: Boyd, Desmond, Kohler, Baker, Dobbs, Hay, and Faingold

Excused absence – Caraway – Proxy goes to Dobbs

I. CALL TO ORDER

Pledge of Allegiance

II. AGENDA

4.12.2022 a. Motion to approve revised agenda – Remove Mel Caraway and Dave Dixon from Old Business – Clubhouse Renovation Status and replacing presenter with President, Tom Desmond

Motion seconded and passed

III. MINUTES

4.12.2022 b. Motion to approve minutes from 3/8/2022 BOD meeting

Motion seconded and passed

IV. MEMBERS FORUM

Harold Lee – Harold said he would like to thank Nicole for a good job in reporting the minutes in the last meeting and getting the information correct.

Mike Benskin – Mike said he got approval to get a quote for new silhouette targets at the February board meeting. The guy he talked to was less than Mike can get them anywhere else but advised Mike to wait 4 – 6 months until the cost of steel goes down.

Rich Dimisko – Rich said the club has been buying clay targets from White Flyer for a while. He received an email from White Flyer indicating that due to the cost of materials and fuel, clay targets will go up in May to about \$1.60 per case and the club's next order will be impacted so we need to be prepared for the increase. Dave Hay asked if they would deliver less than a full trailer and Rich said the cost is better to buy in volume. The club currently has 2 price tiers for trap - \$4.50 on weekends and \$5.00 on weekdays and it was discussed moving to a single tier price of \$5.00 every day. It was discussed and decided it would be a good to have only a single tier price for trap. Tom Desmond said the price increase would not go into effect until June 1, 2022, to allow for proper notification to go out to membership in the May newsletter. Bill Branowitz asked if the supply of birds is good until December/January then why not wait until January to do a price increase. The price increase will be discussed again at the May meeting.

Dave Bonner – Dave said he had concerns last month about the trap personnel hours verses what the club is bringing in and wanted to know if anyone had looked at it. David Faingold said there was not a lot of activity over the last 2 weeks with about 20 coins sold during that time. Dave B. said if the trap kids are making minimum wage, then the club is only making a profit of \$2.50. Dave B. thinks we should conserve what we have and look where we can save money and also asked about Sonny's wages and how they are allocated. Tom Desmond said that trap makes money every year. It was said we should include a line item for trap on the financials to help people understand. Rich Dimisko said that the trap personnel do more for the club than only trap like setting up tables for meeting, cleaning up around the club, emptying trash cans, watering the saplings, etc. and their wages only hit trap profit. Tom Desmond said their wages are paid against the trap account in the

payroll system and it may be difficult to allocate some of their wages elsewhere in the financials. Bill Branowitzer asked about rifle and pistol disciplines, and what they are bringing in compared to what goes out for trophies. Loren said they allocate cost for targets and trophies and YTD we spent \$37 on awards/trophies because there has not been a lot going on yet this time of year. Chris Baker said if it's a reasonable discipline expense then he does not think we should nitpick every penny unless trap is way out of line.

Bob Smith – Bob said he has been trying to shoot lately and getting over the bridge has been a challenge because part of it has been in the creek. He would be willing to fix the bridges with some help. Dave Hay said we can extend the stringers on each end and raise the height of the bridge on the banks. Tom Desmond asked David Faingold to add an action item to fix the bridge at the work party. Some of the members may get together to fix the bridge sooner.

Matthew Hess – Matthew said a few band-aids were used from one of the first aid kits at his last match and asked if anyone tracks that or replenishes. Chris Baker said there would be a meeting in a few weeks to discuss the first aid kits.

V. OLD BUSINESS

Financial Report — Treasurer, Loren Kohler - March revenues were \$46,306 and our expenses were \$28,242 with a gain of \$18,064. Our YTD revenue is \$91,239 and our YTD expenses are \$69,197 with a gain of \$22,042. Account balances: Chase Checking Account \$74,290; Chase Payroll Account \$9,564 and Chase Savings Account \$461,977; Bank of the West Money market account \$208,547.

Maintenance Update – 2nd VP of Maintenance, David Faingold – David said the weeds were sprayed with Pre-Emergent recently and railroad ties had been purchased for the silhouette range but he and Richard Parker need assistance getting them off the truck. He also said there was a survey crew that went along the south side of the property. David called the guy that was in charge and he said he could not tell him who he was working for, for confidentiality reasons. David ordered the front loader for the work party and they are coming out on April 28th and 29th to do work in the berms. Nicole asked David if he wanted lunch for the work party and David said yes. Tom Desmond also mentioned that the copier in the education trailer office is getting old and has had a lot of issues lately. He said Nicole looked at getting the club a new copy machine. The quote included a lease option for \$75/month (\$25 for the equipment and \$50 for maintenance/toner) or to purchase the machine for \$3,700 plus \$50/month for maintenance/toner. Dave Bonner offered to look at the copy machine during the meeting and repair if he can.

4.12.2022 c. Motion to lease the new copy machine if Dave Bonner is unable to get the current machine working this evening after the meeting

Motion seconded and passed

WWII Shoot – Trap Assistant, Logan Trujillo – Logan said he was able to get a lot of answers to the questions from the March meeting. He would like to hold the shoot on May 22 at 9:00 am and charge a fee of \$10 per guest. He thinks there will be about 15 people at most. He would like to do paper targets and he will get them. Logan asked if we have stands he can use. Chris Baker said to talk to the disciplines to get some stands and then offered Logan to use the muzzle loader target stands if he would like to. Logan said he may need about a dozen or so. Pete Benoit is Logan's sponsor, and he will be there to RO for the shoot. Tom Desmond asked Logan how many targets per person and Logan said 1.

4.12.2022 d. Motion to approve WWII event as scheduled

Motion seconded and passed

Clubhouse Renovation Status – President, Tom Desmond – Tom indicated that Mel Caraway and the contractor were unable to attend the meeting so he would provide the update. He said Mel would like to designate member, Dave Leiker as the project lead for the renovation due to Mel's health. Mel forwarded an email update from the contractor to the board. The email indicated that the contractor has an accepted set of plans with the city. He spoke to Stanley Turner with the county and he assured him that they were going to push this through as quickly as possible. The contractor also said that none of the renovation is structural except the women's bathroom and once the underground plumbing was inspected it can be covered by concrete and framing can take place. The concrete will take 28 days to cure and once that is done the Ninja flooring can be done. Bill Branowitzer asked if they were going to install a water dispenser and Tom Desmond said yes with a bottle filter. Tom Meisheid asked what the time span was for the permits. Tom Foster then asked if we need to go another month and have not seen the guy and what the plan of action is. Tom Desmond said the contractor will have a crew out later this week to clean up some stuff and the dumpster will be dropped off. Members were curious what the hold up has been and Tom Desmond said primarily the permits. Paul Fields asked how much money has been given to the contractor and Tom Desmond said around \$100,000. Jim Ashmore said that Tom Desmond needs to step up as the President and take charge of the situation to get it done. Bob Smith said the whole process seems like nothing but promises. Tom Desmond said he is not happy with it either. Bob Smith said the contractor would have people out the following week and no one has been out after the last meeting and that the contractor is just stringing us along. Tom Desmond said that the board has spoken with Nick Norman and he would not advise the board to sue the contractor due to the contractual agreement with the contractor for delays. Jim Ashmore asked what is being done. Tom Desmond said that an arbitrator will just tell him to finish up the job. Spud Renzelman said he's confused about the permitting and asked if it was in the process and do we know what has been issued. Tom Desmond said all the documents have been submitted to the county and the hold up is the plumbing document had too many edits. Dave Hay asked who Stanley Turner was and Tom Desmond said he's an employee with the county. Spud Renzelman asked Jim Ashmore to talk to the County Commissioner and Jim agreed. Spud then asked if once we get the permits will it be done in 30 days and Tom Desmond said no more like 45 days. Paul Fields said he was going to say something that will not sit right with the board but he feels that some of the board members feel that the club's money is their money to spend. Chris Baker said the building is old and everything was out of code. The club has asked for members help in the past and the work performed was also out of code and done without permits. Paul then asked why the board had to go to a company in Pennsylvania for the 100 yd range covers and why they didn't ask the club members for help with the renovation? Paul also asked who looked into the company used for the 100 yd range. Bob Smith said that David Faingold said he was shopping around for quotes for the 100 yd range cover. David Faingold said he is always diligent when looking at vendors and he was told to look for someone that was licensed, bonded and insured. He was completely unaware of the fees that SEMSWA would charge for engineering reports, permits and inspections that were added to the bill and we had to build the structure according to SEMSWA guidelines. David Faingold went by the book and has nothing to regret. Willie Chatman said he has bit his tongue and the clubhouse could be half done by now. Willie said he sent an email to Tom Desmond at 7:00 am the morning after the last board meeting and Tom told him to email the Treasurer and 1st VP. Willie sent them an email about a friend that he knows that could help get a portion of the club's money back and work on the clubhouse. He said his friend asked about it and 2 weeks had gone by and he had not heard anything back from his email. Willie is upset because he went out of his way to help and never heard back, and said we will probably get another letter from the contractor in a month with another explanation as to why nothing has been done.

2022 New Membership Update – Administrative Assistant, Nicole Quiring – Nicole said we have orientations coming up this Saturday at 9 am, 10:30 am and noon for 21 new members and spouses. Waiting on paperwork for 4 people and we have 8 people need an orientation in May/June. All spots have been filled and we made it through 230 on the wait list.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

Incident Report – President, Tom Desmond – No reports this month.

Board Member Opening – President, Tom Desmond – Tom said that one bio was submitted for the board opening after the newsletter announcement from Dietrich Whitesides. Dietrich was unable to attend the meeting due to a family engagement. Tom read the bio out loud “I have been a member of the ACG since 1990, and I have served one term on the AGC Board of Directors. I am seeking reelection to another term. During my first term we refurbished and upgraded the Club’s first aid kits, purchased and installed coin-operated trap machines, repaved and improved the parking lot, and began the remodeling of the clubhouse. I am a veteran of the U.S. Marine Corps and the Indiana Army Reserve National Guard. Shooting comes naturally to me, first as an Indiana farm boy, then as a serviceman, and now for recreation. I recognize the importance of a safe place to practice our chosen activity. My interests span high-power rifle, muzzle loading, and handgun. I mostly shoot NRA Action Pistol and compete in the discipline locally, regionally, and nationally.” Spud Renzelman asked why we need to fill the open spot and Tom D. said it is so we have an odd number if a tiebreaker is needed. Chris Baker said to the board to think about who could be the new secretary. Dave Hay said that a member could even be the secretary and read through 4.2 and 4.6 of the bylaws and later said he was wrong and it must be a board member.

4.12.2022 e. Motion to accept Dietrich Whitesides to fill the open board position

Motion seconded and passed 7 to 1, Dave Hay abstained

2022 Elections – Election Chairman, Dave Carriker – Dave said we are having an annual meeting and election first Sunday in October. We need to vote in 3 existing board members or need new members to run and ask that people turn in their bios by August. He will get the notice from Nicole and post it in a few local places at the club. Chris Baker reminded everyone that we will not shut down the range for the annual meeting.

Review May Calendar – Nicole Quiring reviewed the May calendar and added the WWII Shoot to the calendar on May 22.

Note: Dave Bonner announced at the meeting that he repaired the copy machine.

VII. BOARD ROUND TABLE

Loren Kohler – Loren asked Matthew Hess if he had a PSAC match in March. Matthew replied that he did not and it was canceled due to weather and the last match they held before April was in November/December.

Dave Hay – Dave would like to re-address the PSAC Conex container. David Faingold thought the location may be in the way of the trap birds delivery truck and suggested moving it closer to the archery range. There will need to be railroad ties under it for added support. Tom D. asked Matthew to show them where he wants to put it. Dave Hay said he also saw some members using the bottled water from the cooler to fill the coffee pots instead of filling up from the large water dispense. Tom D. said if members use the bottled water then they should be paying for it.

Monthly Member Trap Shoot Info

I wanted to thank Jack R., Mike R., and Ted O. for coming out to participate in the April shoot. As I mentioned before, until we can get back on track with our normal monthly shoots, we will hold these more as "targets only" with a few bonus birds thrown in for free rounds of trap. We'll hold the next get-together on May 22 starting at 9:00 AM and I hope we get a few more members coming out.

I attended the April AGC meeting and discussed the issue of rising prices for clay targets. White Flyer targets has indicated the cost of targets will be increasing in May by \$1.60 per case of 135 birds. Also, if the price of fuel remains at high levels, transportations costs will also increase. While we are fairly well set on targets at this time, I proposed we set our cost of targets to a \$5.00 single price for members. I think we will also need to address the price for non-members and move to \$8.00. I will talk with Loren to get his opinion on raising targets for his ATA shooters to see if he wants to raise ATA target prices mid-season. I checked some local ranges and their prices are as follows for 25 birds:

Golden Gun Club: Members - \$7.00 / Non-Members - \$9.00

Colorado Clays: \$7.50

Family Shooting Center: \$8.75

Keep in mind that members can purchase 10 cards or tokens for \$50 and get the 11th round free, which makes the cost \$4.55 per round.

At the meeting, an AGC member commented that the wages for trap personnel were basically making the overall trap operation unprofitable. I countered that trap personnel do more than just tend to trap - they also empty trashcans, sweep the clubhouse, water the saplings that we planted a couple years ago, set up the tables and chairs for meetings, etc. For a small club it would not be feasible to try to separate their trap wages to overall club expenses. Along the line of trap operations, I want to point out that in the last 15 years, AGC has benefitted from hiring a contractor to reclaim lead from the trap fields. Of 2 lead reclamations, and I would have to go through club records for exact dates and amounts, in 2007 AGC received \$97,000 and in 2015 AGC received another \$21,000 as our portion of the recovery. These recovery payments went directly to the AGC general fund. I do not recall any other discipline reclaiming lead.

Please feel free to let me know if any questions or comments or corrections. I appreciate the involvement and support of AGC members not only for trap, but for the club as a whole.
