Report presented on the progress of the pipeline access litigation concerning AGC property. Aurora City has been working in good faith with AGC. Hopefully, with a little cooperation from the membership of AGC, this digging project across the AGC property will go smoothly. No dates at this time have been set for the digging.

Fred Hamblen conducted two reloading classes in the AGC instruction building. Thanks Fred for a job well done.

The new Range Officer hats are in, you can only get one if you have been to the training class and actually show up to work at the AGC ranges.

Problems exist on the 22 Silhouette Berm. Read the rules, YOU MAY ONLY USE THE FAR LEFT SIDE OF THE

BERM. (RULE # 50) Damage is occurring to the railroad ties and the valve stems, which are used as target stands. THERE IS NOT TO BE ANYTHING FIRED ON THE 22 SILHOUETTE RANGE BUT PISTOL CALIBER ARMS.

05.11.04.a Motion: Revise Rule # 50: Remove the word, rim fire; Remove exception # 2; add shotgun. Add wording: Paper and approved silhouette targets may be shot from the covered firing line at the 40 meter, 60 meter, 77 meter and 100 meter berms. Seconded. Passed.

Treasurer's Report: Club is solvent.

Old Business: The sign in the front gate area that says, "All Guns are Loaded"; this line on that sign should be removed. Approved

The AGC "Open House" on 13 June is still being planned.

We need to have a "Work Party", but there are very few open calendar dates suitable.

Meeting was called to order at 7:02pm by President Rob Rathburn.

Minutes of the March BoD. Meeting were approved and accepted as published.

Board Member Tom Matthews has resigned due to personal reasons. Aurora Gun Club wishes Mr. Matthews the best, he will be missed. President, Rob Rathburn, appointed Mr. Bill Chin to fill the vacated seat. Bill will fulfill the remainder of Mr. Matthews term to the Board of AGC. Approved Accepted

Note: All requests for Karen Sudduth's time should be funneled through Rob Rathburn. The exceptions to this are: Dave Allen in capacity of Treasurer, and Steve Fowler in capacity of 1st V.P. (membership).

1st V.P. Report: There are 14 vacancies to the 1000 paid membership limit of AGC. To get on the waiting list, you may sign-up at the club desk or call Karen Sudduth. Wednesday, May 19, 2004 at 7pm, the final 14 slots will be filled and inducted.

2nd V.P. Report: A report on the pipeline project of the Aurora City & County was presented. The water quality report was received back, AGC has good quality water and it is safe to drink.

04.13.04.a Motion: The Aurora Gun Club House will be named the "Dick Hebert Club House". Seconded. Passed.

A plaque with the new name will be made and attached to the club house. Approved

Treasurer's Report: AGC has hired a lawyer from the firm of Fagre & Bensen @ \$300/hour to represent AGC in the pipeline access rights litigation for crossing the AGC property. The work on the pipeline is temporarily scheduled for September, 2004.

Karen Sudduth asked what is to be done with the old AGC computer.

04.13.04.b Motion: AGC's old computer is to be donated to the Galilee Church. Seconded. Passed.

Karen continued to notify the B.O.D. of issues coming to light. A printed handout was given to each B.O.D. member titled "Administrative Assistant Report to the BoD."

Legal Report: Mediation on the return of funds is still in progress. Litigation with AGC vs. Denver is moving slowly, Denver has assigned a new lawyer to the case. Denver has asked for an extension of time, regarding discovery issues.

Old Business: The lead mining person from last year has contacted AGC to see if AGC is interested in continuing the relationship with him to mine the lead from the AGC trap field. He wants to mine the field during the month of May, for a period of 4 to 5 weeks. Discussion followed regarding the issue. (time frames, price of lead, condition off his equipment) Wednesday Trap expressed concern of being interrupted. If the mining is pursued, a new contract would be required. Jess Adams is to contact Mid-Western Lead Company to discuss the possibility of this work.

AGC wishes to express thanks to Laverne Fritz for her hard work, and long hours filling in for Kathy Knapp during Kathy's absence these past six months. Thank you Laverne. Kathy is now back on the job. Welcome back Kathy...

Cary Smallegan addressed an issue involving damage to the front gate during a Hunter Safety Course. The gate was damaged (burnt circuit board) in the amount of approximately \$320. Hunter Education is to assume responsibility for the cost of the damage. This happened because the gate was chained open rather than held open correctly; because the gate was held against the motor, the motor drive board burnt up.

Website info: Roger Briden asks that any information that needs to be updated or changed on the AGC web page— Please, notify Roger of any changes that are required.

Terry Humbargar noted that A.J. has made progress on the manufacture and installation of rifle racks. AGC wishes to thank A.J. Davis for his hard work and dedication to AGC in this project. Thank you.

Fred Hamblen stated that the Firearms Coalition of Colorado meeting is on a date and time that Fred can't attend due to prior commitments. The Littleton Police have no insurance to cover the event proposed last month. That issue is to be considered, dead.

Al Doyle stated: Trap kids need to work, scoring shooters, on every trap that operates. No Exceptions.

Disciplinary: Mr. Watson presented his observations of an apparent rules infraction he witnessed on 22 February, 2004. In attendance: Eric Miller, Jimmy Holdsworth, and Blane West as President of Rocky Mountain 3-Gun. Eric Miller read his letter of response to the BoD. of AGC regarding the allegations. Jimmy Holdsworth spoke to the allegations. After discussion of the events; no further investigation/action is required. Issue resolved to satisfaction of BoD.
