MINUTES OF THE AGC BOARD OF  
DIRECTOR'S meeting minutes  
05/10/05

Meeting called to order at 7pm by President Rob Rathburn.

Present: Rob Rathburn, Terry Humbargar, Bill Chin, Michael Miller, Joseph Huber, Gary Ames, David Dankowski, Steve Fowler, Richard Immel, Bill Hall, Cary Smallegan, Randy Still, Martin Visnak

Absent: AJ Davis & Greg Sether (excused because of previous engagements).

I CALL TO ORDER

II MINUTES

Minutes Corrections: In the last paragraph of last month's minutes, Bill Hall advised the Board our shooting hour cannot be changed. The word comment was mistakenly used for cannot. *05/10/05.A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES CORRECTIONS. SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.*

III MEMBERS FORUM

Lassen - Again questioned the profitability of ATA. David would also like to have input on board discussions during the meeting, not just in the Member's Forum. Rathburn advised him the new board is running the meetings in this fashion to allow membership participation and also allows the Board to conduct business without constant interruptions.

Siegel - wanted compensation for the range shut down for 1/3 of the year. Rathburn told him that we have kept the membership informed of the construction project in the newsletter. The AGC has benefited by receiving \$150,000-\$175,000 worth of dirt work. Humbargar said that we had the option to work with the city or have the city condemn our property. Adams has documented pictures of what the range looked like before the construction. Aurora did not advise the county of the project, which slowed down their construction. Siegel said the construction project should have been done at night. Rathburn offered to refund Siegel's total dues but he refused to accept them.

Mrs. Lassen - She had a question on limiting berm use for the Sand Creek Raiders. She would like to see the ATA leaving two traps open for members. If there is a vote to limit berm use for the Sand Creek Raiders, the ATA should be treated equally. Al Doyle pointed out that a trap is always open for people to shoot, during ATA shoots and that the ATA has never received any complaints to his knowledge.

Boyd - (chairman of magnum handgun) wanted clarification on family membership. Who is classified as a family member, who is not, do they pay member rate, or non-member rate? Hall explained that a membership is a husband, wife, and children under 18. The subject will be discussed later in the meeting.

Barnes - Is currently involved in the Arapahoe County 4-H shooting Sports Program. He has kids interested in shooting. He presented a proposal for the 4-H to use AGC for shoots on our range. Barnes would like the board to consider finding room on our calendar for range usage. Kids currently registered: 12-15. Ten kids are registered for shotgun, 8 for archery, 3-4 for rifle. Some are registered for more than one discipline. Smallegan mentioned that he has been through some of the 4-H training programs, and vouched that they have qualified supervision. Cary would be more than happy to work with them. Rathburn asks for a more detailed proposal and tabled the matter until next month. Bob McPheeters said this falls in the same category as the non-member air marshal program that was discussed 1-2 yrs ago. He thinks it would continue to create problems involving non-member usage. Barnes would be open to using the range during weekdays. Fowler thinks that we should encourage the future of our shooting sports. Hall suggested that Barnes write a letter & submit it in the newsletter for further input.

IV PRESIDENT REPORT - Rob Rathburn

Thanked the Board for their hard work - particularly all of those who worked on the pipeline project. He also appreciates the members' patience with the project. No one is more frustrated about the closures that he is. Jess Adams & Dave Allen put in a lot of work negotiating this project last year. We are dealing with the government and the contractor (who ran into weather & dirt problems). He apologizes for the length of time it has taken, but, it could have been much worse. The project could have been during this spring or summer.

#### V FINANCIAL REPORT - Mike Miller

Balance Sheet has been published. CPA has been contacted for an audit of the 2004 books. The account transfers are still being worked on.

Administrative Assistant's Report: We need to renew our antivirus software. **05.10.05.B MOTION THAT WE RENEW THE \$40 ANTIVIRUS SOFTWARE FOR THE NEXT YEAR. SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.** Karen passed out letter from Karamaroudis. Our books are up to date, have been looked at by our accountant and all money except for \$32 is accounted for.

#### VI OLD BUSINESS

1<sup>st</sup> VP: Clarified the city & county problems we have experienced with the pipeline project. Also, we will have a Workparty on Sunday. The city has until May 23<sup>rd</sup> to be off of our property or they will begin paying a penalty. We will receive a formal notification when they are finished working. Also, there is now a construction & utility easement. The city is required to provide notice upon coming on the property.

Chin: The overhead outside the clubhouse has been painted. Jim Compton has been doing tractor work/repairs/welding on the AGC property and is authorized by AJ Davis to do so now and in the future.

CRO: A copy of the new range rules was passed out at last month's meeting. **05.10.05.C MOTION TO ACCEPT THE NEW RANGE RULES. SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.** Joe Huber doesn't want a vote on the match exceptions, and questions the necessity of match exceptions because they have not been brought before the board. If there are exceptions, they need to be brought before the board by the discipline chairmen. Hall suggests that we have an off-site meeting with discipline chairmen. Humbargar would like a copy of the new rules in the next newsletter. The Board is open to membership feedback. Fowler recommended putting the new rules into effect June 15, 2005 so that all members have a chance to read them and the new rules and violations would be enforceable. **05.10.05.D MOTION THAT THE REWRITTEN RULES TO INTO EFFECT JUNE 15, 2005. SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.**

Licensing Agreement: Mike Miller stated the boilerplate has been modified and is being sent to each of the board of directors. Miller has a list of items and documents that are required from the Sand Creek Raiders which was given to Fowler. SCR would like to complete the signing of contract for the Raid and will submit the documents requested by Mike.

#### VII NEW BUSINESS

Ames: Gary has received complaints from AGC members who have not had an opportunity to shoot on the weekends. He would like to open up discussion of non-member use of the range to the Board. Humbargar mentioned that non-member usage in cowboy shoots runs 65%-70%. **05.10.5.E MOTION: DUE TO THE NUMBER OF COMPLAINTS, AND IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE AGC, THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF BERMS (A DISCIPLINE OR EVENT MAY HAVE FOR A NORMAL SCHEDULED EVENT) BE 4. LEAVING BERMS #1, #2, #7 AND MAGNUM BERM OPEN TO THE AGC MEMBERS COMING OUT TO THE CLUB FOR OPEN SHOOTING. ALSO THAT SET UP/TAKE DOWN BE DONE THE SAME DAY OF THE EVENT. SECONDED. DISCUSSION.** (Magnum handgun shoots will occur in the magnum berm). **AMENDMENT: THAT COWBOY SHOOTERS USE 4 BERMS (3, 4, 5, 6) AND CAN SET UP THE NIGHT BEFORE (AFTER 7PM) AS LONG AS THEY DON'T INTERFERE WITH ANY MEMBERS THAT ARE SHOOTING AT THAT TIME. SECONDED. Y-7, N-5. MOTION PASSES.**

**05.10.05.F MOTION THAT SCR WILL BE ALLOWED TO USE 5 BERMS FOR MAY, AND THAT THE PREVIOUS MOTION GOES INTO EFFECT JUNE 15, 2005. SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.**

OTHER BUSINESS

Definition of family membership: **05.10.05.G MOTION THAT FAMILY MEMBERSHIP IS DEFINED AS THE CARDHOLDER, THEIR LEGAL SPOUSE (SPOUSE IS DEFINED BY STATE LAW) AND ANY CHILDREN IN THEIR IMMEDIATE FAMILY UNDER 18. SECONDED. DISCUSSION. MOTION PASSES.**

Miller announced that a trap usage study will begin this week.

Still said that the porta potty is on site and available for use.

Match is open to any *as issued* Military Rifle used by the Allied Forces during the Normandy Invasion. Examples are: M1 Garand, 1903 & 1903A3, 1903A4 (Sniper) Springfield, M1 Carbine, Browning Automatic Rifle (BAR), No.4 Mk 1 Lee-Enfield, No.4 Mk 1(T) (Sniper) or Mk. III Lee-Enfield. M1941 Johnson and M1917 Enfield Rifles are also acceptable.

Course of fire will be announced at the shooter's briefing to be conducted in the classroom building at 0800 Hrs. 35 rounds of service ammunition (Military ball or equivalent) will be needed to complete the match. *Please* no match ammunition.

This match will be CMP sanctioned and certificates for a purchase of an M1 Garand or 1903 rifle will be issued to participants at the end of the match.

## AURORA GUN CLUB MEMBER RULES

1. Treat all guns as if they are always loaded.
2. Never let the muzzle cover anything you are not willing to destroy.
3. Keep your finger off the trigger until the sights are on target and you are ready to fire.
4. Always be sure of your target and what is behind it.

### GENERAL RULES ALL RANGES

5. Range officer commands are to be obeyed immediately. Failure to obey the order of a range officer, major safety violations, or destruction of club property, will be cause for revocation of club membership.
6. Club members shall display their membership card on their person at all times.
7. Members are to make sure the gate is closed when entering or departing the range except on weekends (9am to 3pm) or during a scheduled, weekday event.
8. Eye protection is required on all ranges. Ear protection is recommended.
9. Hunting or harassing wildlife on club property is prohibited.
10. The use of alcoholic beverages is not permitted on AGC Property
11. Walking or otherwise being on the dirt banks, sand banks or berms is prohibited.
12. Vehicles are not to be parked inside of any berms or on any ranges.
13. Shooters are expected to clean their shooting areas when finished, including collection of spent brass.
14. All projectiles are to impact and come to rest on AGC property. No projectile is to be allowed to leave the AGC property.
15. The side berm is there to protect people and objects in the area to the side of the berm area and is not to be used as an impact area.
16. On flagged ranges, the range is open only when the flag is up and closed when the flag is down. There is to be no handling of fire arms while the flag is down. Flagged ranges are the 100 & 200yard ranges & the silhouette range.
17. Sanctioned matches take president over casual shooting.
18. There is to be no steel jacketed ammunition used at the AGC.

### FIREARMS

19. All uncased longarms are to be carried, unloaded, with the muzzle pointed up or down.
20. All long guns shall have the action open when not on the firing line. No long guns are to be shouldered accept on the range firing line and then they are to be pointed only down range. No pistols are to be pointed accept on the firing line and then only down range.
21. All shooters will exercise muzzle control at all times, ensuring that they never cover any person with the muzzle of their firearm.
22. Holstered pistols will be carried empty. Semi-autos will have the magazine removed and the hammer down on an empty chamber or the action open.
23. Firearms shall only be loaded on the firing line, or loaded and holstered on the firing line under the direction of a range officer, for "from-the-holster-events."

24. Toy guns and BB guns are to be treated as real firearms. Persons handling such arms shall comply with all club rules.
25. Members may not use full-auto firearms on the range until certified to do so by the club President or his designee.

## TARGETS

26. Proper/appropriate targets must be used at all times. All members/visitors are to furnish their own targets, stands, and sandbags, except for sanctioned shoots in which they participate. Items such as cans, bottles, bowling pins, golf balls, etc., are not permitted as targets. Shooting at tires or range equipment is forbidden and is a major safety violation. Proper/Appropriate targets include approved steel targets, paper targets and Clay Pigeons.
27. All targets are to be positioned so all projectiles fired will impact into the impact berm (Exception: Trap and Sporting Clays). Any round fired that skip or otherwise leaves the facility constitutes a major safety violation and the member is subject to loss of club privileges.
28. Steel targets are prohibited on 50 yard berms #1 and #7.
29. Steel targets on the 200 yard range must be positioned to the far right side of the impact berm so all rounds fired will impact safely. Only lead bullets are allowed for 200 yard steel targets.
30. Use of approved steel targets on the 100 yard range, or the 50 yard ranges #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, and the silhouette range, must be positioned and angled against the end berm so all projectiles fired will impact the proper berm or be driven down into the dirt.

## GUESTS

31. A member may bring his/her spouse and children under age 18 to the range plus one other guest free of charge. Children must be supervised at all times.
32. Members may bring a maximum of four guests at one time. A fee of \$3 per guest will be charged for the additional non family guests and the member is responsible for payment. Members with guests can only use one shooting position on any rifle or pistol range.
33. Club members bringing guests to the facility are responsible for the guest's compliance with all range rules.

## TRAP RANGES

34. The maximum shot shell load allowed on the trap range is a 3 dram 1 1/8 ounce trap load with 7 1/2, or smaller shot. NO HUNTING OR FIELD LOADS ARE ALLOWED.
35. Trap shooters must load only one shell at a time. (Exception: two are allowed when shooting doubles).
36. No shooter-owned traps are allowed.
37. Patterning Board - The patterning board is CLOSED when Trap 4 or the sporting clays are in use.
38. Patterning Board - The maximum shot shell load allowed is 3 dram with a maximum shot size of 7 1/2.

## SPORTING CLAYS RANGE

39. The sporting clays range is used for sanctioned shoots only, see the person at the trap counter to set up a sanctioned shoot. Otherwise the sporting clay range is closed.
40. The maximum load allowed on the sporting clays range is 3 1/4 dram, 1 1/8 ounce of #7 « or smaller shot. NO HUNTING OR FIELD LOADS ARE ALLOWED.

## 50 YARD RANGES

41. All rounds fired must impact the end berm. Targets should be placed as close to the end berm as practical.
42. All firing on 50 yard ranges will be forward of the markers on these ranges.
43. Berms #1 and #7 are for handgun, shotgun, and Rim fire rifle only. No steel is allowed.

44. Berms #2, #3, #5, and #6 are for all rifles, handguns, and shotguns (Exception: full auto firearms, see #25).
45. Berm #4 is closed to rifle shooting, rifle caliber firearms and rifled slugs, except for sanctioned events/matches taking place under the direction of a range officer.

## MAGNUM HANDGUN RANGE

46. The magnum handgun range can be used as an overflow berm for Handgun rifle and shotgun and steel targets when the other berms are in use and no magnum handgun matches are in session.

## 100 YARD RANGES

47. The range flag shall be used at all times. NO EXCEPTIONS. When the flag is up, the range is OPEN. When the flag is down, the range is CLOSED and there is to be no handling of firearms.
48. Firing shall only be allowed from the designated firing line off hand and from the bench except during scheduled events under the supervision of a range officer.
49. Firearms will not be handled for any reason when the range is CLOSED and/or when persons are forward of the firing line. Shooters will stand back and away from their shooting position and behind the white line during this time. This includes casing and uncasing or moving firearms to and from the shooting benches. All firearms remaining on the firing line will have their actions open with no live rounds in them prior to anyone going down range. (Exception: During sanctioned bench gun matches, participants shall be allowed to set wind flags and clean guns while the range is closed. Bolts must be removed from the firearms during this process. This exception applies to match participants only.)
50. Firearms on shooting benches shall have the muzzle pointed downrange, action open in such a fashion that all concerned can see the firearm is unloaded and safe.
51. Black powder firearms are to be charged with the muzzle pointing up and at the tables furnished for that purpose. They shall not be capped or primed until on the firing line with the muzzle pointing down range.
52. There shall be No smoking within 20 feet of black powder while black powder is in use.

## 200 YARD RANGE

53. This range is for 200 yard shooting only. Only center fire rifles are permitted on this range.
54. All 100 yard range rules apply to this range. The range flag shall be used at all times. When the flag is up, the range is OPEN. When the flag is down, the range is CLOSED.
55. Due to the length of this range, members are allowed to sling their rifle and take it with them when changing targets. Rifles will be carried muzzle up or down, and empty with the action open. Members must ensure that they control the muzzle of their firearm when changing targets.
56. TARGETS: Steel targets on the 200 yard range must be positioned to the far right side of the impact berm so all rounds fired impact safely. Only lead bullets are allowed for 200 yard steel targets.

## SILHOUETTE RANGE

57. Only pistol caliber firearms using lead bullets and rim fire firearms are allowed on this range. All shooting is to take place from the established covered firing line. Paper and approved silhouette targets may be used only when placed at each of the berms so that bullets impact into the berm. Proper use of the flag is required.

## SANCTIONED MATCHES

58. All sanctioned matches are to be run by an AGC club member in good standing. The AGC member is responsible for seeing to it that all AGC rules are followed.
59. Match Exceptions: Exceptions to these rules during sanctioned matches as approved and published by the AGC Board of Directors.
