CLARIFICATION ON GUN SHOW LAW

Statute CRS 12-26.1-101 et seq.

Summary—AN event is not a gun show

Unless -

1. It is organized or sponsored in whole or in part in order to facilitate the purchase or sale of firearms.
2. There must Either be at least 25 firearms offered for sale Or at least 3 vendors present. So as a technicality, during a swap meet, AGC would need to take down the gun ads on the bulletin board, then replace them after the swap meet is over.

There is no motion of a rule/regulation that prohibits putting a gun on the rack with a "For Sale" sign during a regular/non swap day at the club.

III PRESIDENT REPORT

New Employee: Matt “Rhino” – welcome to AGC

Misuse of Club Property for shooting props: 200 yd range, we found our bench with a bullet hole in it. If he hears of any more club property misused (forward of the firing line) Rob will personally make a motion to have those members ostracized from the club. In addition: Randy Still brought in golf balls & bowling pins are included in misused targets

Position shooting: Rob would like the board to consider thinking of some way we can allow position shooting back on the 100 yd line. Martin Visnak had a suggestion from a member of the club that every member of the club goes through a refresher class every few years. Martin would like to add a tip-of-the month in each newsletter.

V FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer's report, Michael Miller:

Financial Draft: Mike passed out March financial preliminary draft to the Board members. Revenues as of 03/31/07 \$48,721.50, expenses \$40,478.08, difference \$8,246.42 increase.

Proposed Budget: Mike reviewed operating budget with the Board. **05.08.07.a Motion that the Board approve the operating budget at this time so that normal bookkeeping can take place. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed.**

VI OLD BUSINESS

1st Vice President, Terry Humbargar:

Membership Update: We finished the last orientation class on April 29th. We are at our 1000 member cap. Pretty much everyone on the waiting list was contacted. Karen does a great job of staying on top of the membership records. Membership is closed. We do have a couple of deployed military and will hold their spots and give orientations when they return.

2nd Vice President, Terry Humbargar (for AJ Davis):

Lead Removal: This contractor does the land mining for Buckley, Golden, and all of the Trap clubs in the area. He will be with us late May or June. He estimated our shot landing zone and marked off one square foot, dug down 4 inches, and analyzed it to see if it was worth his time. We don't think our lead has been mined for 10-12 years. So he came back and said it was worth his time & AGC's time to do this. He guarantees the 1st three truck loads which will cover his cost. After that, the remaining truck loads are 60% him, 40% us. He will not sell his shot to the Trap shooters because he has been sued by previous Trap shooters for shotgun barrier scratches. He guaranteed to leave less than 10% of the lead on the property. There will be no noise to disturb the neighbors – only the lights on the machines. He will do this at night and

estimated 4-6 weeks. He sells the lead to China.

Tractor: AJ wanted to thank Cal for all the work he has done with the tractor. The 50 yard berms look fantastic. Rob also wants to acknowledge Cal's attention to range safety.

Board of Directors, Rich Immel:

Bench Rest work party: We would like to have a work party fixing the trailer roof and replacing some ceiling tile. Rich would seek Board approval. Terry had mentioned this to AJ and he is comfortable. Rich said it will not require a range closure and won't put it on the calendar. Terry recommended staying in communication with AJ. Mike recommended contacting AJ about the materials since they will come out of his budget.

VII NEW BUSINESS

President, Rob Rathburn:

Pam Bennett: running for Aurora City Council. She wanted to stop by and chat with us about encroaching development. Her main platform is changing her focus to old Aurora. Rob thinks it would be beneficial to our club to have an ally in the City Council. Rob would like permission to contact her and invite her to the next meeting.

2nd Vice President, Terry Humbargar (for AJ Davis):

Work Party: AJ requested a Saturday in June upon Board approval with the least amount of impact on disciplines. He was thinking either the 16th or the 23rd of June. Discussion about keeping part of the range open, and Terry reiterated that you cannot have anyone shooting during a work party. Rich pointed out that there wasn't anything scheduled on the 30th. That's the time he plans on having the railroad ties delivered. **05.08.07.b Motion to have the work party on June 30th.**

Seconded. Motion passed.

Sporting Clays: AJ & Jess would like to see the sporting clay stands from 10 stand to a 5 stand. This would save money and become a more productive area for the AGC. Also add a picnic area. They would like the Board to think about it and come up with something in June

Board of Directors, Harold Lee:

Clarification on Gun Show Law: Long time club member with a gun in the rack with a "for sale" sign on it. Harold passed out a copy of the State Statute Gun Show law # CRS 12-26-101. During our swap meet, the AGC would need to take down the bulletin board items. But there is no prohibition of putting a "for sale" sign on a gun on a rack.

Insurance review: Harold did a review of the various insurance policies and they need some work, additions, deletions, etc. He passed out his comments on all 5 insurance policies for the club (property, general liability, equipment, directors & officers, and workers compensation). Rob would like to know what the total savings is with our adjustments. Harold recommends changing the address from Admin Asst to the Club's physical address.

Board of Directors, Gary Ames:

CSTA & ATA: 47 shooters total for Sunday's shoot. \$23/100 birds. AGC received \$18. He will email the final breakdown on that. Gary said the club received approximately \$1700.
