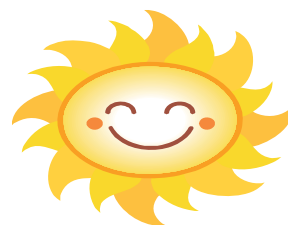

The update on the Aurora Pipeline Project along Gun Club Road: We have had meetings with the AGC's attorney and consulting appraiser in order to maximize our compensation and minimize our damages regarding loss of property to the city and future impact on the club facilities. Currently there are many items under review by both sides. The AGC and the City of Aurora are negotiating in a win/win approach to avoid the certain condemnation with it's resulting legal battle and all related expenses! At this time there are no concrete answers or conclusions to report. Next week we are meeting with city officials to discuss issues related to the pipeline project. When an agreement is reached in writing the BOD will vote to accept or reject the proposed agreement.

The full time Range Officer position tabled from last months meeting: We are in need of a full time Range Officer during the pipeline project. The R.O.'s primary function would be to maintain order and safety between the work crews and members using the range during construction. The R.O. salary will be paid by the city during the project. A committee of M.Benskin, Bonner, and Caldwell will determine the costs of having a full time R.O. and associated costs such a tuff shed (to be used as an office), running power to the shed, air conditioner / heater, etc, etc

CRO's Corner

Have you ever had times when you can hardly wait to do something and as the time approaches you put it into high gear getting everything ready for the event? I know I do! What I would like to ask you now is that when you are preparing to go shoot slow it down a bit. Take some time to look over all your equipment and make sure it is all in working order and where you want it. Pay particular attention to your firearms. Perform any preventative maintenance steps prior to heading out to the AGC. Check for things like retaining pin migration, scope ring tension, scope ring mounting screws and look for any loose screws on the firearm itself, stock or grip retention, both front and rear sights and over all condition of the firearm. Ensure your firearm is clean, has no obstructions in the chamber/s or barrel and is properly lubricated. Lastly, perform a function check on any unloaded firearms you intend to bring and shoot at the AGC prior to loading them in your vehicle. Don't forget to check the condition of your ammunition and magazines too. Finally, make sure you have all that you need in your range bag. When you load your valuable firearms in the vehicle, place them carefully and correctly in the so they do not shift or move. Make absolutely certain you are not transporting loaded weapons to the AGC. It is best practice to travel with weapons in a completely safe condition. Magazines should be removed if applicable, chambers cleared and checked and the actions open if possible.

If you are intending to bring a guest to the range, please take some time and make sure they are familiar with the firearms to be used that day and of basic firearms safety as well as the range rules at the AGC. It is the member's responsibility for all guests. Please take that responsibility seriously and properly prepare yourself, the equipment, the firearms to be used and your guest for the shooting experience that is about to happen. Ensure your guests are handling and using the firearms in a safe and proper manner. When you bring a guest to the AGC you as the member, are required to be with them at all times while actively firing. Have a happy and safe June, I hope to see some of you at the range myself!

Range Officer Class

The AGC offers the opportunity for members with two years of membership or more to become a range officer (RO). As an RO you will be helping to keep the AGC running safely. Every hour worked will reduce the RO's following year's dues by \$8.00. To become an RO one must attend an RO class, in so doing, the member becomes "certified" by the AGC as a Range Officer. This certification is by and for the AGC only and is not affiliated with the National Rifle Association (NRA) however, the AGC RO class I lead, is based upon the NRA CRO class materials. The final RO class for 2010 will be held Tuesday June 22, 2010 at 7:00 PM in the class room building or clubhouse at the club. Expect classes to last between 1 and 2 hours depending on number of people who attend and amount of questions asked. Classes are low key, informative and hopefully interesting. Be prepared to take notes for your future reference.

Please note: if you were/are an RO, your certification is valid for only 2 years. If you wish to continue to be an RO you must re-take the class every 2 years. The AGC BOD set a mandate in 2008 that from then forward, ALL discipline chairmen/women (or their designated representative/s) must also attend an RO class every 2 years. Attendance will be taken and recorded.
