PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I wanted to update and brief the membership on the progress made since last November.

First the pipeline project: We got ahead of this problem last year thanks to the hard work and foresight of **Jess Adams** and **Dave Allen**. Initially the City of Aurora wanted to install the line during the summer months. This would have jeopardized several multi-day shooting events held during the summer, including the week-long *Rocky Mountain Regional Raid*. Rather than fight City Hall, we entered into negotiations and worked with them. We convinced the city to change their plans and begin work on our portion of the pipeline in the late winter/early spring. In addition, they agreed to furnish all signage, stay off our property during the weekends and notify us in advance of their construction dates so we could remain open when they were not working. The project was completed on time and we benefited from approximately \$150,000 - \$175,000 of berm work. Special thanks to **A.J. Davis** and **Terry Humbargar** who rode herd on this project and saw it through to a very successful conclusion.

Licensing agreement: This project was undertaken to provide a working contract with entities that use our facility for large multi-day events. **Mike Miller** has hammered out a "boilerplate" agreement that can be customized to the specific event and discipline. This will prevent the misunderstandings and misuse of our equipment that has occurred in the past. The document clearly lays out the insurance requirements that must be provided to protect our club and membership, and what facilities may or may not be used.

New Club By-Laws: Our club has a long and distinguished history, which is good. What is bad is our operating By-Laws are also historic and have never been updated to place us in compliance with Colorado law. **Bill Chin** has been working with an attorney who specializes in non-profit corporations and these revised By-Laws will be distributed, for your approval, in the November election.

Check out our new improved, updated and absolutely gorgeous website. These improvements come courtesy of **Richard Immel** and webmaster, **Refugio Silva**. Good job, guys!!!

The Range Rules have been revised and updated by **Joe Huber**, and **Gary Ames** has implemented the Personnel Performance Review for all AGC employees.

Also in no particular order; we have new roofing on all outbuildings and a new awning on the clubhouse. Our facility has never looked better. A committee has been formed to look at the addition of a skeet range on our property which would make a wonderful addition to our club. We are looking at streamlining the membership renewal process and repairing and refurbishing the caretaker's house.

Last, but certainly not least, thanks to you, **the members**, who make the AGC the largest and finest private shooting facility in the State of Colorado.

In closing and on a sad note, as this is being written past President **Dick Hebert** is in the hospital. Please remember him in your thoughts and prayers for his quick return back "to the line."

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## MINUTES OF THE AGC BOD MEETING MINUTES 06/14/05

Meeting called to order at 7pm by President Rob Rathburn.

Present: Rob Rathburn, Terry Humbargar, Bill Chin, AJ Davis, Michael Miller, Joseph Huber, Gary Ames, David Dankowski, Steve Fowler, Richard Immel, Bill Hall, Greg Sether, Randy Still, Martin Visnak Absent: Cary Smallegan (no notification for absence or reason given).

### I CALL TO ORDER

### II MINUTES

Minutes Corrections: 05.10.05.d Motion should read the rules go into effect... Motion to accept minutes. Seconded. Minutes stand as read.

### III PRESIDENT REPORT

I recently received a letter from Cheryl Wilson. Ms. Wilson is the president of the Sand Creek Raiders (SCR) and is not a member of the Aurora Gun Club (AGC). Her letter was a request to address the AGC Board of Directors (BoD) meeting about recent berm restrictions and other BoD decisions she felt were directed at her organization. I advised Ms. Wilson that we currently had a full agenda and that I would personally attend her BoD meeting at 7pm on 06/13/05. Ms. Wilson did not reply. Monday evening—myself, Gary Ames, Bill Chin and AJ Davis came to the AGC clubhouse to address the membership meeting of the SCR. Ms. Wilson advised me that she did not want us to attend their meeting and asked me and the other three BoD members to leave. Ms. Wilson said she did not receive my email and said we would have to leave our own clubhouse because the SCR were going to strategize about recent AGC BoD decisions. We left the SCR's meeting because our purpose was to clarify our recent BoD decisions—not to disrupt their meeting. Hopefully, we will be able to open a line of communication.

### IV MEMBERS FORUM

Benoit – explained he has been unable to make AGC BoD meetings because of his work schedule. He expressed his concerns about being shut out of his club by the SCR one week out of every year. He does not participate in Cowboy Action events. He has noticed that, occasionally, all the berms have been shut down to other members and is concerned about closing the range down the afternoon before a Cowboy event for set up. The rationale is that the larger numbers have precedent. Pete pointed out that this is a private club, and members should have priority. He would like the Cowboys to share the club fairly with dues paying members and has never asked the SCR for a dues refund for the last 9 years. Hall said that they would try to work with the membership. Pete also questions the reason why some of the SCR set up team are wearing range officer's (RO) hats while they are not active as ROs. Pete thanked the BoD for their good work. Davis asked Harold Lee if our insurance was invalid during the raid. Lee said the AGC insurance is valid.

Silva – Refugio had a question regarding the procedure for paying for guests during the week. He wanted to know what the charge is and where we pay. How do we, as a club, make sure guests actually pay? Humbargar said that if you bring guests out during the week, the member is responsible for payment to Kathy on the weekend. It is not a good system. We are thinking of doing things like the park service: depositing an envelope with payment into a box outside the clubhouse.

Ashmore – emphasized that the BoD's main responsibility is to represent the AGC. When we represent someone else, we have a conflict of interest. We went through a lot with the legal issues that transpired in the past. If we do not excuse ourselves knowing that we have a conflict of interest, our liability insurance does not cover you in a lawsuit and you may be in violation of state law.

McPheeters – My comments have nothing to do with any discipline, but I am addressing the BoD: In the past 3 months, more good work has been done than in all the years I have been a member. Buildings painted and the range fixed up. I would like to express my appreciation. Miller responded stating that several buildings were painted and the parking lot was striped under the last BoD. Mike wanted people to understand that this is a continuing effort to improve the facility each year.

Siegel – Siegel began addressing the BoD as the club member who wanted a dues refund because of the pipeline project. Siegel resented the fact that the SCR's could not set up their steel in the Pistol berms early Saturday afternoon. He feels Rathburn has no authority to challenge him because the new motion dictating set up time (Saturday after 7pm) did not go into effect until June 15, 2005. Jess Adams and his wife were using one of the berms. Jess tried to talk to Siegel at the time, but said Siegel did not want to talk to him. Jess also said several members of the SCR were wearing RO hats that give members the impression that they have to leave the berms they are using. Rathburn responded, telling Siegel that they

are violating a courtesy agreement for set-up. Complaints have come from several members regarding the SCR's early set up—in effect, it limits berm usage for the general membership the day before the SCR's have their shoot. The June 15th date was given to the SCR's so that they had adequate time to notify their set-up crew. Apparently, the set-up crew was not notified. All other disciplines set up on the day of their events to prevent conflicts with the general membership's usage of the range. Siegel then stated "Facts are immaterial!" which caused a great deal of laughter. Siegel subsequently walked out of the clubhouse saying he wanted his words recorded (word for word).

## V FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer's report—Mike Miller: Our expenses are still under the authorized levels. We have had an audit of the workman's compensation, and because of an additional \$4000, our accountant is doing some investigations on that figure. Mike plans on meeting with a CPA for the audit of the 2004 books. **06.14.05.a MOTION TO SPEND UP TO \$1000 FOR THE AUDIT. SECONDED. DISCUSSION. (CPA IS A THIRD PARTY, FOR NON-PROFITS.) MOTION PASSED.**

Administrative Assistant's Report: New copies of Range Rules for BoD manual handed out tonight.

## VI OLD BUSINESS

2<sup>nd</sup> VP: Jim Compton has repaired the tractor. The radiator was bad and we owe \$221 to Compton. No labor was charged the AGC. The Work party was a success. Davis reported on some of the improvements that were made. Insurance claims (regarding the BoD's approval to have the roof repaired) we owe the roofer \$280. The insurance company paid the balance (\$900). Caretaker's house: AJ mentioned that it is pretty shabby inside, poor cabinets, carpet, countertop, and tile glued to the wallpaper in the kitchen. The kitchen cabinets & countertop would cost approximately \$1600. The drywall needs to be repaired and the interior painted. Davis wondered if there were any objections to fix up the caretaker's house. Total cost to renovation is approximately \$2500. Hall asked if we were actively looking for a caretaker. Davis has 3 applications, from our members. Davis would like an applicant that has some mechanical/maintenance skills and would approach members in a professional manner. Hall recommends that we give our caretaker a place that is livable. He recommends we spend the money. **06.14.05.b MOTION: TO FIX THE CABINETS, CARPETS, ETC. IN THE CARETAKER'S HOUSE, NOT TO EXCEED \$3000. SECONDED. MOTION PASSED.**

Licensing Agreement – Miller has received the information from the SCR and has put it into the standard approved licensing agreement. Exhibit B is the payment schedule, proposing 10% down with the signing of the contract with 90% due 7 days prior to the event. Regarding Exhibit H, the Range Rules, some rules were lined out that affected the AGC members only (wearing the AGC membership badges—closing or locking the range gate). Regarding Approved Events, Exhibit E, no changes to this information. Humbargar asked for clarification of which range rules (the SCR's SASS rules)? Bill Hall stated they will follow the AGC's range safety rules. They are the same as the AGC rules. Davis asked if he could come out and watch the event because he finds it interesting. Response from Hall—yes. **06.14.05.c MOTION THAT THE BOD APPROVE THE LICENSING AGREEMENT. SECONDED.** Discussion: Huber would like more time to read it over. Humbargar asked if this was what we had previously approved. Miller confirmed that this is the blank agreement—filled in with the SCR's information. Fowler also has not had a chance to read this. Cheryl Wilson, president of the SCR, would like to have a committee meeting, to discuss any issues and finalize it. Huber is concerned with some of the rules that are crossed out. Hall verified that nothing is fired in the northerly direction on the trap range. Joe is concerned about shotgun shot size. Davis pointed out that the SCR are on a tight schedule and we should get this over with. 10-Y, 1-N, 2-abstain. **MOTION PASSED.** Miller would like Fowler to take it to the SCR meeting. They exchanged tentative dates, 06/22/05, 7pm at the AGC clubhouse. Hall and Fowler, SCR BoD, abstained from voting because they acknowledge having a conflict of interest due to their involvement with the SCR.

## VII NEW BUSINESS

1<sup>st</sup> VP: Work hours & 2006 dues: Humbargar would like to close off the Work hours for 2005 by September 30, 2005. That would allow Karen to work on membership in October to figure the Work hours, with the correct information in November's newsletter. It should not affect anyone in any way. Work hours volunteered in October, November, and December will count the following year towards 2007 Work hours. It allows administrative simplicity. In past years Work hours had to be computed up to December 31st. Fowler asked about the members that work the hunter sight-in to pay for their dues. Humbargar thinks that they will have the entire month of September to get those dues worked off for next year.

Secretary: Dan Simon Target Stand Construction for 100 yd line: In the past, Simon was granted his senior dues for exchange for his services. Recently, we noticed that we only had 3 useable targets. Bill Chin contacted Dan who is willing to make targets in exchange for his \$75 yearly dues. **MOTION THAT DAN SIMONS HAS HIS 2006 DUES WAIVED AND HIS 2005 DUES REFUNDED.** Hall would like to amend this motion to refund his 2005 dues and give him a lifetime membership so he won't be overlooked again. **06.14.05.d MOTION TO REFUND 2005 DUES TO DAN SIMONS AND MAKE HIM A LIFETIME MEMBER. SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.** Committee work on the By-Laws: Chin has worked on the amended By-Laws and has a draft. Bill would like each BoD member to review the amended By-Laws and make comments to the committee (Ames, Adams or Chin). He would like to get it done this year. Bill pointed out some changes: Section 3.6 – Members entitled to vote: spousal members are not entitled to vote. He would like ideas to improve this we should add, delete or amend. Section 2 – our attorney recommends we reduce the size of the BoD to either 9 or 11 members. The BoD size is our decision to make. Realistically, if the AGC is closed, Chin's suggestion is that the assets go to the membership. We need to make a determination of how those assets are distributed to the members. It should be based on the length of years that a member has belonged to the AGC. Who would handle the distribution: accountant, attorney, etc.? If we don't have this listed in the By-Laws—the AGC will run into difficulty. Facility Usage will be addressed in Executive Session.

Steve Knoll – Matt Hess is representing PSAC. Matt is requesting a date to put on a safety clinic. He will collect fees for members & non-members, June 19<sup>th</sup>. He is expecting 10 people and would like to use berm 5, from 8am-5pm. Immel checked the calendar and only one event is listed (Magnum Handgun). **MOTION TO ALLOW THE PSAC SHOOTER'S CLINIC. SECONDED.** Discussion: Hall pointed out that it was mandatory for PSAC to have a safety clinic for their shooters. It is something that was mandated by a previous BoD. Hall recommended that PSAC advise the event's coordinator annually, to schedule the safety clinic as originally mandated by the BoD. That way, no motion to hold the clinic is needed yearly. This year's safety clinic is approved. Motioned is pulled off the floor.

Benoit – 200 yd Range Shack: Pete came up with idea to build a storage facility. He runs the CMP marksmanship program and is seeing increased usage on the 200 yd range (e.g., Military Rifle, CMP, 3-Gun, sighting-in.) There is no storage shed on the 200 yd range for targets and target equipment. Permanent target numbers have become targets. Frames have been damaged and constantly need to be replaced. We would like a shed to store our gear. John Kelley has offered \$300 towards it, and we are asking the BoD to match it. Rathburn interjected that it is an additional safety issue, because the numbers are being used for targets. Having the removable numbers will take temptation out of the way. Pete and John will head the project (AJ to oversee). Benoit requests every member in this meeting to report shooters who are damaging the structures and range property. If anyone comes out here without an approved target, please turn them in or stop them. Benoit is concerned about bullets leaving this range. Humbargar wants clarification that Pete is asking \$300 from the club, and that John is donating \$300. Reply-yes. Pete said they will use a contractor or build the shed themselves. Pete will supervise the project. **MOTION THAT WE APPROPRIATE \$300 FOR THE MATERIALS FOR THE 200 YD RANGE STORAGE.** Motion removed from the floor. Benoit will get an appraisal and bring it before the BoD next month.

Davis – AJ mentioned that the city will need to modify the ditch above the 100 yd range. Water is overflowing, causing an erosion problem on the west side. The club might need to be shut down for one day but the City will schedule repairs to limit a conflict with normal shooting hours.

Hall – Gate: The gate was hit by a ground lightning strike. The touch pad board was not in stock. We should be up and running by Friday. Bill would like to approve a circuit breaker in the box, which might prevent future problems. Davis said that Huber can make the gate almost lightning proof. Cost is a factor. It has cost the AGC \$350 each board, and we have lost 2. Labor was exchanged for a year's worth of dues. Bill said he has received a number of complaints from club members wanting a refund on their dues because of the club closure during the construction project. Bill would like to see the AGC refund \$36 to each member. Bill said it would only amount to \$3600. **MOTION: BECAUSE OF THE LARGE NUMBER OF COMPLAINTS FROM MEMBERS, DUE TO THE RECENT RANGE CLOSURE—ALL MEMBERS WHO RENEW SHOULD RECEIVE \$36 OFF THEIR DUES.** Discussion. Several BoD members pointed out to Bill that his figures were wrong. We would not be refunding \$3600—it would be \$36,000. Rathburn asked Bill if we could table his motion until next month. Bill agreed to table his motion.

***EXECUTIVE SESSION***

Executive session called at 8:15pm. Ended at 8:40pm. ***06.14.05.e MOTION: KAREN SUDDUTH, ON RECOMMENDATION OF THE PERSONNEL COMMITTEE, SHALL RECEIVE A 3% COST-OF-LIVING INCREASE ON HER SALARY, RETROACTIVE TO JANUARY 1, 2005. SECONDED. PASSED.***

**OTHER BUSINESS**

Still – Inquired on the status on the port-o-let usage. Randy was advised the new restroom facility was being used and the members appreciate it's location on the range.

Immel – Richard has requested a dues reimbursement for the webmaster, Refugio Silva. ***06.14.05.f MOTION TO REFUND REFUGIO SILVA'S 2005 DUES AND GIVE HIM FREE DUES, FOR WEBSITE UPKEEP, EVERY YEAR THEREAFTER. SECONDED. MOTION PASSED.*** Visnak inquired as to a way to contact the webmaster. Silva confirmed the information is on the webpage.
