MINUTES OF THE AGC BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING

MINUTES JUNE 13, 2006

Meeting called to order at 7pm by President Rob Rathburn.

Absent: Sudduth & Visnak (both excused)

I CALL TO ORDER

Meeting called to order by President Rathburn at 7pm.

II MINUTES

No additions or corrections reported to the Secretary. Minutes for last month's meeting stand as reported.

III PRESIDENT REPORT

D-Day Match: The D-Day match was a success. Twenty-six shooters participated and \$180 was raised and will be sent to the Bore Snake Co. Bore Snakes will then be sent to troops in the Middle East. Greg Sether was thanked for having the D-Day t-shirts made up. AJ was thanked for having the trap storage trailer moved.

Rezoning: Rob asked all members and AGC supporters to take a more active role in fighting the rezoning issue proposed by Murphy Creek.

IV MEMBERS FORUM

No members participated tonight.

V FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer's report: No financial statement available tonight. Karen is absent due to illness. Treasurer explained that an additional \$5000 needs to be added to our budget to cover increased expenses. **06.13.06.a Motion: to add an additional \$5000 to our budget to cover legal expenses. Seconded. Motion passed.**

VI OLD BUSINESS

President, Rob Rathburn:

Range Usage: Rob requested additional input on FCA's (First Choice Armor) request to use our range mid-week. BoD felt that fee should be raised to \$3500 a year with a maximum of 10 range visits per calendar year. Use restricted to Magnum handgun berm and classroom trailer. Use restricted to mid-week with adequate notice to BoD. Proposal referred to Jess Adams and Range Usage Committee. There will be no refunds. Flat fee.

1st Vice President, Terry Humbargar:

Swap Meet: Swap meet was held June 10th. All Swap meet participants complied with the BoD request concerning no firearm sales or transactions. Another Swap meet may be held in September.

2nd Vice President, A J Davis:

Trap Storage Trailer: Trap storage trailer has been moved to the west parking lot. Dean Betz moved the trailer and did not want any compensation. AJ would like to give Mr. Betz a gift certificate. **06.13.06.b Motion: to give Mr. Betz a \$100 gift certificate for dinner for helping us. Seconded. Motion passed.**

Berm Usage: Disciplines are to use berms 3-4-5-6.

Clubhouse Injury: Last weekend an elderly lady fell in our clubhouse. EMTs responded. The lady did not want treatment and refused to go to the hospital. She injured her head and there was a lot of bleeding. Her husband was notified and took her home. Reports are on file.

Board of Directors, Harold Lee:

Hunter Safety Insurance: Hunter safety insurance under the DOW only covers the instructor and his assistants – not the students. We currently have a liability waiver that must be signed by non-members using our range. The liability waiver needs to be reviewed by our attorney. Waiver will be forwarded to our attorney. Jess has state statutes regarding liability issue.

VII NEW BUSINESS

1st Vice President, Terry Humbargar:

Smoking Ban: House bill banning smoking will be in effect on July 1, 2006. This affects our clubhouse and classrooms. Notice will be in this bulletin for statutory compliance with state law.

Safety Violation Greg Williams: Violation: using a personal trap and violating the one shell rule (date of violation 05/26/06, 1:50pm). Additional violation: shooting in a pistol match while suspended. Mr. Williams was caught violating the aforementioned rules by our caretaker Cal Shipley. Mr. Williams apologized for violating the rules. He has been a member for approximately 1 ½ years. He is primarily a pistol shooter. ***06.13.06.c Motion and recommendation: permanent suspension. Mr. Williams will no longer be allowed on the grounds of the AGC. (If found on our premises, he will be prosecuted for trespassing.) Seconded. Motion passed. (1 opposed/1 abstained).***

Safety Violation Tom Sweetser: Violation: allowing his guest to handle a firearm on the 100 yd range while the range flag was down. Witness: Terry Humbargar and two new members. Mr. Sweetser has refused to sign for the certified letter requesting his presence before the BoD. ***06.13.06.d Motion and recommendation: permanent suspension. Mr. Sweetser will no longer be allowed on the grounds of the AGC. (If found on AGC premises, he will be prosecuted for trespassing.) Seconded. Motion passed.***

Safety Violation Pete Chiodo: Violation: commercial use of the facility for personal gain. Giving CCW class and instructions without BoD approval. No insurance, no certified instructors card in possession. Mr. Chiodo apologized to the BoD for not being completely truthful about what he was doing. Chiodo had three students waiting to use Berm #5. ***06.13.06.e Motion and recommendation: permanent suspension. Mr. Chiodo will no longer be allowed on AGC property. (If found on AGC property he will be prosecuted for trespassing.) Seconded. Motion passed. (3 abstained).***

Board of Directors, Gary Ames:

Range Officer Classes: Range officer classes will be held July 8th, 12:30pm-3pm and July 16th, 11am-2pm. Requirement to become a range officer is two years prior membership in good standing. Note: range officers that have not worked as a range officer for the last year must recertify. New and current range officer's card will be issued. ***06.13.06.f Motion: Range officer classes will be held July 8, 2006 (12:30pm-3pm) and July 16th, 2006 (11am-2pm). Seconded. Motion passed.***

2nd Vice President, AJ Davis:

Range Officer: AJ feels we need to explore the possibility of having a full time range officer. Too many safety violations are occurring. Tabled for later discussion.

Board of Directors, Randy Still:

Non-Member Trap: Members should have priority to shoot over non-members. Non-member trap fees should be raised to \$4 per round (Wednesday shoots). Sign-in sheets for Wednesday trap shoot should not be pre-signed before the shoot. Sign-in should occur at the time of the shoot.

AGC Member, Sonny Young:

Roller and guide system are needed for all five traps. Complete update approximately \$2000. ***06.13.06.g Motion: to spend up to \$2000 for parts to update all five traps. Seconded. Motion passed.***

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Executive session called 9:10pm. BoD needed to discuss a personnel matter. At 9:20pm the general meeting reconvened.

2nd Vice President, AJ Davis:

AJ would like to raise Cal Shipley's monthly salary to \$600. This would be the salary level of the last caretaker. AJ advised the BoD that Cal has been doing an exceptionally good job. He is very knowledgeable, helpful and available for ranger maintenance problems. He has brought a number of safety violations to the BoD. **06.13.06.h Motion: to raise Cal's salary to \$600 per month. Retroactive to last Monday's pay period. Also to provide Cal with NRA/AGC membership. Seconded. Motion passed.**

VIII ADJOURNMENT

Motion to adjourn. Seconded. Motion passed.

PETITION TO THE CITY OF AURORA PLANNING DEPARTMENT 15151 E. ALAMEDA PKWY AURORA, CO 80012

We, the undersigned, oppose the rezoning request of Murphy Creek North, for the following reasons:

- The original master plan zoned this parcel of land for commercial use, not residential, to preserve a good mix of residential and commercial property in the area.
- Residential housing (1020 homes on 219 acres) is not compatible with the existing rural low density housing.
- Building residential housing adjacent to an existing and long established (60 years) gun club is irresponsible.
- Housing in this area is a threat to air operations and the continued 1 billion dollars of annual economic benefit from Buckley AFB.
- Established home owners are already complaining about the backlog in school and firehouse construction and the shortage of water.
- Increased traffic congestion.
- Loss of property for roadway construction.
- This is a flood zone.
- Dioxane has been detected in water samples as far north as Jewell Ave.

- The Aurora City Planning Commission does not support the rezoning of this parcel to residential.
- The Aurora City Zoning Commission voted 6 to 1 against rezoning this parcel to residential.
- Loss of wildlife habitat.
