MEETING MINUTES

AGC BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING MINUTES 06/12/07

Meeting called to order at 7pm by President Rob Rathburn.

Present: Adams, Ames, Chin, Cromie, Dankowski, Davis Hamblen, Humbargar, Lee, Miller, Rathburn, Sether, Still.

I CALL TO ORDER

Meeting called to order at 7pm. Absent: Immel, Visnak, Sudduth (all excused).

II MINUTES

05/08/07 Board Meeting – Approval of Minutes: Corrections: The word barrier should be barrel in reference to barrel damage from using recovered shot (T. Humbargar). No other corrections.

06.12.07.a Motion made to accept minutes. Seconded. Motion Passed.

Minutes stand as reported with the above correction noted.

III PRESIDENT REPORT

Annual D-Day Match: The D-Day match was a great success. Forty-eight shooters participated. Approximately \$650 was raised to purchase bore snakes for our troops. Anyone who knows any military personnel serving can have a bore snake sent to them by contacting Pete Benoit. Rob wanted to thank Pete and all the volunteers who organized and ran the match. Also, the re-enactors had very interesting displays. Thanks to Dave Bonner for photographing the event. Dave has photos available for a very nominal fee.

IV OUTSIDE PRESENTATIONS

Club Accountant, Frank Mihoda:

Questions from the BoD: Expenses to trap have been isolated for this year to April. Currently, all salaries except Cal's and Karen's are listed under trap. Weighing exact expenses for the allocation of time is not always accurate or possible. I would discourage the allocation. Trap is operating at a profit. Mike Miller stated the raw numbers he has seen correlate with the CPA's assessment. A further breakdown of salaries is possible if the BoD wants assessment: 1) club is operating in a financially prudent manner, 2) current financial situation very strong, 3) no weak areas detected, 4) would not suggest any major changes at this time. Currently our income is spread throughout a 12 month period. Will discuss separation of cooks salary, counter sales and other employee salaries with Mike. Terry asked if there was an accurate way to examine profit and loss for decision making. CPA responded, yes, but you have to be very careful of acct. changes. CPA will refine expenditures upon BoD request (trap and sporting clays). Jess mentioned his time allocations of trap personnel lean towards a 30/70% split. Final assessment: The AGC is providing a great value to its members. Continue conducting operations as is.

Pam Bennett:

Candidate for Aurora City Council: Currently running for Aurora City Council (at large). Strongly supports the AGC and redevelopment of old Aurora. She supports controlled and sensible development. She would like to see a preservation of open areas.

AGC Member, Dan Agakian:

Defense Firearms: Dan has been an AGC member for 1 ½ months and is currently a defense firearms instructor. He would like to hold 2 day training classes (8-9 hours) similar to Gunsite. Class size 10 or less. \$300 per student. Classes open to non-members. He will provide his own liability insurance. Program will be for profit. Upon successful completion of program a certificate will be issued. Certificate not recognized by NRA or State of Colorado for CCW. Discussion of Dan's program. Tabled for a later time.

V FINANCIAL REPORT

Administrative Assistant report, Karen Sudduth:

None. Karen absent due to illness.

VI OLD BUSINESS

1st Vice President, Terry Humbargar:

One of our club members is deployed in Iraq and missed the membership date. Membership will be granted.

2nd Vice President, A J Davis:

City of Aurora: The City of Aurora will remove the erosion Net on the 100 yard range. They will back fill the 100 yard bank and will clean the drainage ditch above the 100 yard bank. No date set.

Tractor: Tractor use will be controlled by AJ. AJ must approve any tractor operator.

Work Party: Work party is set for June 30th. Main issue is to replace the split rail fence, painting, clean up – attempt to repair roof of bench rest trailer.

President, Rob Rathburn:

Position shooting on 100 yd range: Rob would like to re-establish position shooting at the 100 yd range at 100 yd targets.

06.12.07.c Motion: To allow prone and sitting shooting positions on the 100 yd line at targets posted at the 100 yd bank. Shooters cleared by the chief range officer may shoot sitting or prone at targets posted at 25-50-75 yds. (These shooters must have an approved sticker signed by the chief RO on the back of their membership card.) Seconded. Motion passed.

AGC Member, Dave Olive:

Upcoming Club Elections: Discussed recommendations to make the election procedure more efficient and establish strong guidelines for further elections in compliance with our ByLaws. Motions made by Bill Chin:

06.12.07.d Motion: The annual membership meeting and election for 2007 and after will be held on the Sunday prior to the regularly scheduled October Board meeting. Seconded. Motion passed.

06.12.07.e Motion: that for 2007 and thereafter, expenditures are authorized by the BoD for (a) copying the election bulletin to be mailed to each member in good standing so they can have it for 15 days prior to the election (b) for necessary postage and (c) other expenses as required. Seconded. Motion passed.

06.12.07.f Motion: Candidates for the BoD must declare their candidacy in writing to the Secretary 8 weeks prior to the regularly scheduled September Board meeting. Seconded. Motion passed (pending approval by our attorney). 06/18/07: our attorney advised me this is a legal motion which she classified as an administrative change that the BoD can make. A confirmation letter will be sent for our files.

06.12.07.g Motion: to standardize our election bulletin and ballots unless changes are deemed necessary. Seconded. Motion passed.

Other recommendations will be tabled for discussion at a later time. Dave Olive was thanked for all his hard work in establishing and solidifying our election process. Dave has done a great job for us.

VII NEW BUSINESS

2nd Vice President, A J Davis:

Roadway Barrier: We need county approval for the dirt work to build a roadway barrier. Eventually we will also build a barrier on the north end of our property. The barriers will not affect water drainage.

BoD, Jess Adams:

Proposal for clarifying trap finances: Jess has been doing an 8 month study on time allocation of trap personnel and cashier (usage allocation). Results 38% non trap/62% for trap. Motion: Remove from schedule of trap and sporting clay expenses: 1) 50% of the cashier's wages, 2) 50% of the cook's wages, 3) 38% of the trap personnel (kids wages). Add all the above expenses to SCHEDULE OF MANAGEMENT AND GENERAL EXPENSES. Seconded. Discussion followed regarding current accounting practices and detailing cost expenditures of trap so that future fee increases could be justified. Terry noted that there is no plans to increase weekend trap fee at this time. Motion withdrawn by Jess.

VIII ADJOURNMENT

Motion made to adjourn meeting. Seconded. Passed at 9:25pm.
