CRO's Corner

Happy 4th of July to you all! This month I would like to suggest (this is not a mandate) that the shooters at the AGC consider using an OBI or open bolt indicator. These are the little, brightly colored devices placed in the action of a firearm to assist those using the range in identifying a firearm in the safe or cleared condition. OBIs may be purchased, made or had easily. Many places actually give them away. If you don't have one, a pencil or drinking straw, cut to length with a piece of brightly colored cloth, paper or tape attached to one end works just fine. With the action open, magazine removed (if applicable) and an OBI in the chamber, there is no question whether the weapon is safe and it takes only a glance to verify a safe condition.

I also wanted to tell you all we now have almost 40 members certified as Range Officers (ROs). If you are at the range and are approached by an RO they should show you respect and courtesy, however you as an AGC member or guest must also respect them and do as they instruct. There will be one last class this year for RO's. It will be held Wednesday, July 16, 2008 at 7:00 PM in the classroom trailer. We have had a great turn out this year for the RO classes. In addition, all but 2 disciplines have sent their chair person or designated representative to the mandatory classes so far. Thank you all for your interest and concern. Remember, really every AGC member is an RO, if you see an unsafe practice/action stop it politely but immediately! Have a safe and enjoyable July.

SWAP MEET

An AGC swap meet will be held June 28, 2008 beginning at 9 a.m. Members are welcome to display their sporting goods, shooting accessories, reloading components, and other shooting paraphernalia from the backs of trucks, cars or tables. It will be located along the northern side of the entrance road across from the rim fire silhouette and 200 yard ranges. Due to Colorado gun laws, absolutely no firearm sales are allowed during the meet.



GUEST FEES PAYMENT BOX

As per the AGC member rule number 31 "members may bring a maximum of four guests at one time. A fee of \$3 per guest will be charged for the additional non-family member guests and the member is responsible for payment. Members with guests can only use one shooting position on any rifle or pistol range." Rule # 30 states " A member may bring his/her spouse and children under 18 to the range plus one other guest free of charge." We have added a payment box at the north end of the caretaker house by the garage door. Members are now required to pay for their guest **BEFORE** shooting. Follow the directions on the lid of the box and deposit your envelope in the slot. The board of directors passed the following motion regarding payment. It will be strictly enforced by the club. "AGC members will abide by rules 30, 31, and 32 as written in the AGC General Member Rules. Guest fees will be paid **BEFORE** shooting at the Guest Fee Station. Failure to do so will result in the range officer or caretaker collecting **DOUBLE** fees from the member on the first offense. Repeated offenses will be referred to the BOD for discipline." Thank you for your attention to this matter
