BOARD MEETING MINUTES 6/12/2018

Meeting called to order at 7pm by President Tom Desmond

Present: Artzer, Baker, Desmond, Faingold, Kohler, Leiker, Mead, Quiring

Absent: Mead -excused

I. CALL TO ORDER

Pledge of Allegiance

II. AGENDA

6.12.18 a. Motion to approve agenda – 2 items were added – Girl Scout Archery and NRA Seminar under New Business

Motion seconded and passed with approved changes

III. MINUTES

6.12.18 b. Motion to approve minutes from May 8th meeting.

Motion seconded and passed

IV. MEMBERS FORUM

AGC Member, Bill Edick– Would like to propose a Cowboy Action Shooting (CAS), discipline to be held at the club. Would like to hold the event on the 2nd Wednesday of each month from 8:00 – 1:00. Would like to reserve 2 berms and conduct 2 stages per berm for a total of 4 stages. Approximately 20 – 25 shooters per month. Funds collected would go to the club at \$10.00 per shooter. All steel targets and props for the event will be owned by the club. Bill will get it started and will recruit another member to co-chair the event.

6.12.18 c. Motion to approve the CAS shoot on the second Wednesday of each month in berms 5 and 6 from 8:00 AM - 1:00 PM and up to \$1500 for target purchase for the CAS.

Motion seconded and passes.

AGC Member, AJ Davis – Nice handgun left on a berm – if the RO's were taking names of members at berms, it may have been easier to find the owner. The board understood the perspective, but said that they are not going to change the RO policy at this time.

AGC Member, Willie Chatman – had several topics:

- 1) Why is the gate not programmed to be open for 200 YD matches? Richard replied that he was instructed to not have the gate programmed to be open for those matches by the match chairman.
- 2) What's happening with the Safety Video initiative? Board Member David Faingold replied that it is still in work – he is still seeking people to take part in the production of the video.
- 3) Why can't we offer Hunter Safety courses? There has been a lot of talk about past issues with unsupervised children – are we past that? The board will consider this at a later date.
- 4) The condition of the Archery Range is terrible – what happened to the initiative to purchase new targets? With the resignation of Berry Patton from the board, that is an item that is pending. Board member Michael Quiring agreed to follow up with the members who were working with Berry to help make the purchase.
- 5) What ever happened to the proposed cover for the 100 YRD range? The board explained some of the history behind that initiative and will take another look at seeing if it can be done.
- 6) The Club Rules are simply too much! Why do we have so many rules? Why can't it be simpler? The board explained some of the history behind the current set of rules. There was agreement that it would be nice to make it a simpler set, however, the membership has shown in the past that a simple set of rules does not work.

V. OLD BUSINESS

Financial Report — AGC Treasurer, Loren Kohler — May revenues were \$19,224 and our expenses were \$18,286 leaving a gain of (\$938). Our YTD revenue is \$93,673 and our YTD expenses are \$93,834 leaving a loss of (\$161). Account balances: Checking Account \$120,746; Payroll Account \$16,964 and Savings Account \$696,438.

Maintenance – It was announced that Berry Patton has, for personal reasons, resigned from the board. Need to put together a to-do list for the Work Party on July 7th. Range will be closed this day. Archery range needs new targets. Board Member, Michael Quiring, will run the Work Party. Silhouette range cover is still in process, there has been a delay in getting the electrical pole removed to extend the cover.

Conceal Carry Class – AGC Board President, Tom Desmond – There were 19 members who attended the class and were very excited to have the class take place. Nate will brief at the July board meeting.

Discipline Open House – AGC 1st VP Membership, Chris Baker – We currently have 40 people from the wait list that have signed up for the Open House. They have been instructed to sign-in at the clubhouse and get a Visitor sticker and attend a safety training. The Open House is scheduled for Sat., June 30th from 9 – 12.

Rules Committee Review – **Proposed changes to the rules were as follows:** Will add to the rules that no one is to approach someone who is actively shooting or in the position to shoot. Self-sealing targets must be framed and not unsecured or on the ground. Nothing close to the ground where a bullet might skip, it is more about impact of the bullet in the center of the berm. Steel targets are prohibited on the 100-yard range at any distance other than 100 yards. Under Guest Section: Allow members to bring grandchildren. Grandchildren and children are free. Allow spouse members to bring grandchildren/children. All grandchildren/children must be supervised. Member spouse cannot bring grandchildren/children's friends.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

Incident Report – Members are reminded that being on the side berms (to include driving on the side berms) is prohibited.

Girl Scout Archery – The board put this topic off until next month when the member proposing the shoot can attend the meeting and explain what is desired.

NRA Seminar - Looking to hold in October on Election weekend. Cost would be \$500 before a certain date. Need to get more information on the conference. Could benefit the club.

Membership Cap – There was discussion on this topic and the prevailing decision was to leave the membership cap as it is.

Board Opening – There was a reminder of the announcement regarding Berry Patton resigning from the board – and that there is an immediate opening available. No one present expressed interest in filling the opening that evening.

Review of July Calendar – No changes made.

AGC Treasurer, Loren Kohler – Received a bill from Xcel for \$2,700, will call and find out what this amount is for. Steve will pull records from last year for the financial review.
