MINUTES OF THE AGC BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING MINUTES 07/12/05

Meeting called to order at 7pm by President Rob Rathburn.

I CALL TO ORDER

II MINUTES

Minutes Corrections: Cary Smallegan was excused from last month's meeting due to illness.

Minutes stand as corrected.

III PRESIDENT REPORT

Kathy Knapp will be absent 07/16 & 08/20. Laverne will cover for her.

Rattlesnake alert: The construction project may have effected a nearby den. AJ has found one rattlesnake already tangled up in the erosion net.

Rob has received many compliments from the members about the condition of the club. He wants to pass on the positive feedback to the Board. He appreciates the Board's hard work and dedication.

IV MEMBERS FORUM

Doyle – has not seen the results of the trap trophy shoots in the bulletin lately and would like to make sure that they are reported.

Winchester – wanted to provide the BoD with an update regarding the lawsuit against the City of Denver. Colorado Springs (El Paso, Co) the NRA and the Rocky Mountain Gun owners have filed amicus briefs during this appeals process against Denver's position. *Amicus Brief: A brief usually at the appellate level and filed by an amicus curiae with the courts permission. Amicus curiae: a person who is not a party to the lawsuit but who petitions the court or is requested by the court to file a brief in an action because that person has a strong interest in the subject matter. (Ref: Black's Law Dictionary*

8th Edition). Jim also said his wife participates in Cowboy shoots. He as attended these shoots and has seen open berms that they could be using. Jim feels that member complaints regarding berm usage are overblown and feels the Cowboy's should have 5 berms. Jim suggested that other AGC members could guarantee themselves a place to shoot by making a reservation to use the left-over berms.

Kelley – *Disbursement of assets in case the club folds*: We need to be actively looking for a new range site. Safety should be our primary concern. Recommends a set of baffles on the 100 yd range and limited position shooting, etc. We have to be concerned for our future. Steve Fowler pointed out that he has brought up that point in the past. Four months ago Steve found a site, 33 miles east of our property. It is the closest land he has found. It's on Kiowa Road. AJ points out that we can't afford anything closer. ("Wolf Creek Ranches" \$170,000 each for 2 parcels). Bill Hall recommends that we need to purchase a new site and develop the property slowly while we are still able to operate at our current location.

Compton – Jim and Terry witnessed a ricochette coming from the Silhouette range over into the 100 yd range. Jim is upset because he feels it's a safety issue and nothing was done.

Benkin – would like to respond to Jim's comments. He shut the range down, talked to Terry & Bill. Terry checked the targets and it was recommended that they continue with their match. Joe observes that a lot of the problem is ground impact ricochettes. Digging down in front of the berm, and have a square impact area would cut down a lot of the stray shots. Ideas were brainstormed on the problem and possible solutions by various members. Hall suggested we send Huber to the NRA range development seminar for training. Rob delegated that Terry, AJ & Joe form a committee to determine the seriousness of the problem which may involve banning the use of steel targets on our range..

V FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer's report: Explained the financial statements. We're in good financial shape. The club has put away money to accommodate a move. The Skeet committee is still underway. We have to go through ¾ of the year to balance out the highs & lows in regards to the cost of the targets. We have increased non-members to \$5 for shooting trap as a temporary measure to balance out

VI OLD BUSINESS

2nd VP: Caretaker's building remodeling is progressing. Cabinets are coming in this Friday. Don Phillips, Joe & AJ have been working on filling the holes. Range shed for 200 yd rifle range: AJ will level the dirt as soon as they are ready. An 8x10 shed from Sheds R Us \$1208 will be delivered & set-up on the site. AJ pointed out that these sheds can be moved in case of relocation. If the shed was constructed on the site, it would not be portable. **07.12.05.a MOTIONS THAT THE AGC BUYS THE 200 YD RIFLE RANGE SHED. SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.**

Licensing Committee: The SCR have met and have requested a few changes to the licensing agreement. Mike Miller is bringing these changes back for the Board to vote on.

Item 1 - Item 9 – vendor liability requirement – our licensing agreement requires workman's comp and commercial general liability insurance. Because of the number of small vendors that attend this event, the SCR requests that the vendor indemnation & release be itemized (in place of item 9a). **MOTION THAT WE APPROVE THE ABOVE MENTIONED CHANGE. SECONDED.** Discussion: Bill Chin doesn't think this affects the vendors because it affects employees. Points out that the contract was drawn up to protect the AGC. He thinks the SCR should be liable for this and is against this amendment. Clarification was discussed regarding AGC's agreement. **MOTION FAILS.** Cheryl Wilson (President of the SCR Raiders) then stated—"You don't have to bother with the rest of the changes, I won't be signing the

licensing agreement” and left the building. President Rathburn decided to continue voting on the requested changes regardless of Ms. Wilson’s statement. **MOTION THAT WE TAKE THE SCR RAID OFF THE CALENDAR IF THE AGREEMENT IS NOT SIGNED. MOTION WITHDRAWN.**

Item 2 - Correction on line three, item 10 – changing removal to remove. Item 10 – SCR requested 72 hours to complete the removal of ice machine, port-o-lets, dumpsters. **07.12.05.b MOTION THAT WE APPROVE 72 HOURS FOR THE SCR TO PICK UP THE LARGE ITEMS. SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.** Item 3 – payment schedule – SCR request that instead of the 90% due 7 days prior that we split 45% payable 7 days prior and 45% on August 4th of the event. **MOTION TO APPROVE THE MONETARY CHANGE. SECONDED.** Discussion: AJ points out that the SCR should have the money. Hall points out after expenses they make \$230 per shoot. The SCR is a non-profit organization. All SCR Board members kicked in money to keep the club going. Humbargar inquired about registration monies. Fowler pointed out that they are behind on registration because of the business that has been going on at the AGC meetings. Chin points out that his licensing agreement has already been approved by the Board. **MOTION FAILS.**

Item 4 – Exhibit D Permitted Activities Correction to lines 8 10 14 to include silhouette instead of SOLE. The SCR are requesting that the following be added to the activities list: Dry camping is permitted by participants and vendors with no open fires. On August 8, 2005 licensee may utilize the entire club for purpose of clean-up. Fowler recommends that “the licensee may enter upon the entire club property for purpose of clean-up. **07.12.05.c MOTION THAT THE ABOVE CHANGES BE MADE. SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.**

Item 5 – Exhibit E Prohibited Activities The SCR and the negotiation committee request the following changes: Remove “(add other prohibited activities)” and add “No licensee or shooter owned traps or launchers are permitted.” Be added. **07.12.05.d MOTION TO APPROVE THOSE CHANGES. SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.**

Item 6 – Board of Directors was increased and changed: Cheryl Wilson, Jane Nelson-Rud, Beverly Chappell, Ettie Siegel, Bill Hall, Steve Fowler, Matt Walker, Gary Carpenter, Frank Knight, Dave Lassen, Brian Lehmann, Gary Smallegan, Scott White-

head. Miller mentioned that it was a correction and does not need a motion.

Fowler would like to know how to appropriately protect both the SCR and the AGC. Davis thinks that the SCR should accept the responsibility for their events and not the AGC. Steve Fowler would like Bill’s comments that the SCR are responsible under their insurance to protect their vendor - public record and listed in the minutes. Humbargar would like to put on public record the amount money spent to draw up this contract and that it was voted on by the AGC Board and that the boilerplate was given to the SCR in February. Mike Miller suggests an alternative approach: to have the 2 million liability policy, also cover their vendors. It would also satisfy Item 9a. Rathburn questions that if the agreement is simply placed in the minutes – would it be legally binding? Hall said that everything that happens at the raid is covered by their insurance. Rob wants to know if this agreement can be corrected by our attorney and have the licensing agreement signed by the end of the week. Mike agreed to take it back to the lawyer for discussion. To allow Mike Miller to get advice from the attorney and accept the attorney’s decision or have a Board phone vote. **07.12.05.e MOTION THAT MIKE CONTACTS THE LAWYER AND HAVE HER ADDRESS ITEM 9A, POSSIBLE RAMIFICATIONS, POSSIBLE ALTERNATIVES, AND GET HER LEGAL OPINION AS TO HOW TO APPROACH IT – WAIVER, INSURANCE COVERAGE, ETC. MIKE WILL GET IT IN WRITING AND HAVE ROB SEEK THE PHONE VOTE.** Fowler suggests that the SCR has an attorney (that their president works for) that could write out an amendment and the SCR incur the majority of the cost. Humbargar recommends that the answer should come from the AGC’s attorney. **SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.** Fowler also agreed to incur half the cost for having to go back to the attorney representing the AGC for the SCR.

07.12.05.f MOTION THAT THIS WILL BE DONE BY THURSDAY AFTERNOON, WITH A DEADLINE OF FRIDAY EVENING, 8PM OF SIGNING THE LICENSE (ASSUMING THE LAWYER IS AVAILABLE). The AGC President will be available for the signing of the contract at that time. Fowler will check the availability of the SCR President. **SECONDED. MOTION PASSES.**

New Club By-Laws Draft: Bill Chin passed out a draft at last month’s meeting. He asked for comments or amended. He has not received any comments and would like to open it up to discussion tonight because he would

like to vote on it at next month’s Board meeting (to expedite it to the membership for approval/disapproval). The law firm that drew up the pipeline contract and the licensing agreement recommended the attorney that wrote up the By-Laws Draft. She specializes in non-profit organizations. We are a 501C4 in the non-profit category and the By-Laws were written up in accordance to this category. Items we addressed were spouses could not vote, limiting the number of Board members, and legal disbursements of how the club would be divided if it is shut down, etc.. Hall recommends that members be vested according to their length of membership and disbursements will be given out in that manner. Also, the disbursements should be done by an attorney, not the AGC. Fifteen-twenty years would make a member fully vested. Chin also suggests that the club could also invest its funds in another facility.
