ANNOUNCEMENTS

CRO'S CORNER

Recently, the question was asked of me if members could engage iron/steel targets with 22 Long Rifle, rimfire, "jacketed" ammunition at the AGC. I did some research and found that to the best of my knowledge, there is really no such thing as a 22 Long Rifle, rimfire, "jacketed" bullet in current production. There are .22 Long Rifle rounds that look to be jacketed but are actually copper washed (also known as plated, coated, electroplated, clad etc.). An example of this type of ammunition is the CCI "Stinger". The copper portion of the bullet itself is a very thin coating used to help protect the rifling of the barrel from leading. Based on my research, I would like to make clear that the use of any current manufacture .22 short, .22 long or .22 long rifle ammunition is allowed to be used on steel targets at the AGC.

The main reason the "only lead bullets on steel targets" rule was instated was is to keep ricochet, splay, splash, whatever you want to call, it to a bare minimum. Jackets can and do separate from their lead cores and can create a potential hazard by ricocheting. Further, jacketed bullets usually have higher velocities compared to lead bullets. The slower the projectile the less likely it is to ricochet or break up. Further still, if a slower bullet does ricochet it will travel less of a distance than a higher velocity projectile. Please continue to use only lead bullets on all ranges when engaging steel/iron targets.

I would like to include this segment in the monthly newsletter from now on. If you have any suggestions for future CRO's corner topics, please contact me and we will try to get them in the newsletter. Thank you.

NEW FEATURE AT THE 200 YARD RANGE:

05/31/07 – revenues \$86,907.85, expenses \$69,917.36, net assets \$16,990.49. Motion to accept the financial report. Seconded. Motion passed.

VI OLD BUSINESS

1st Vice President, Terry Humbargar:

Training Proposal: Training proposal from Dan Agakian (came last month) to present his proposal to teach classes. Harold Lee would like to see members with at least one year's membership before they begin proposing activities. Recap: generic handgun & rifle class. Bill Chin was concerned with outside activities would be taking up the weekend berms. Also, the certificates given out would not be recognized by the NRA or concealed carries. Fred Hamblen would like to take a NRA course of “Basics of Personal Protection Outside the Home.” AJ doesn't think we should offer classes to our members so that the teacher would make a profit. Motion: That the AGC accept Dan Agakian's proposal to teach classes at the AGC. Seconded. Discussion. Motion failed.

2nd Vice President, A J Davis:

Work Party: Excellent work party, good turn-out. Work is scheduled on the 100 yard range. Kevin Martin will come out and bring his loader out and level it off.

Dirt Work: Met with the City of Aurora (erosion control/sewer people & their boss) and they are going to take off the silt barrier, re-cut the ditch, and the 100 yard range will be closed at times due to the dirt work. The City of Aurora is very conscientious and cooperative about this.

Mowing: We did mow the range on the Trap side.

Board of Directors, Harold Lee:

Bench Rest Trailer: Several of the members have tried to fix the roof on the Bench Rest Trailer. There is no need to spend any more money to fix it. He would like to coordinate, tear it down, and take it to the Arapahoe disposal site (\$1200 fee). Terry Humbargar talked to them and since we are neighbors, they will only charge \$400-\$450. In the mean time, Harold contacted a moving service for \$450 to move the trailer out of here (on Thursday). Jim Compton will have it ready on Wednesday night to be moved. Replacement trailers: still looking for a replacement. Mike Miller pointed out that the board authorized a replacement trailer last fall (pre-approved for \$5000). Randy Still recommends a Tuff Shed. Jim Compton didn't think Arapahoe County would accept such a large structure unless it was off the ground & portable.
