CRO's Corner

I would like to come right out and say to all AGC members and guests, if you have a question of me, or the BOD please do ask it. Questions are important, especially if the question regards rules or safety issues at the club. We have such a huge wealth of knowledge at the AGC it would be a shame to waste it. If I do not have the answer to your query, which I may not, I will get one for you. I don't "know it all" about the AGC or guns; no one does! No one will be chastised for asking a question and no question is a dumb one. Knowledge is power! Let's be a powerful club and spread the knowledge. Frank Brownell wrote a great article in the June "WebBench" (look for these well written articles on the Brownells website). I will paraphrase but, Frank feels it is all our (gun owners and shooters) responsibility to educate ourselves and then to educate others. I can't agree more! We all have areas of the sport we enjoy perhaps more than others. So I challenge all of you to become truly educated in an area relating to shooting or guns and then educate others. Frank and I both believe we all have to appear rational and educated (in short: credible) in the eyes of non shooters/gun owners. We owe it to the next generation to pass on our passion for firearms.

I would also like to take this opportunity to answer one question put to me recently for everyone's benefit. Can a person pattern a shotgun at the AGC with shot larger than #7? Yes! If a member or guest wishes to pattern a shotgun with a load above the 3 1/4 dram, 1 1/8 ounce of #7 or smaller shot (required for use on the trap/sporting clays and patterning board) they may still do so. They simply must manufacture their own patterning board (do not use the club patterning board!), place your own patterning board in one of the berms **that allows shotgun use** and ensure **prior to firing**, that all pellets will impact in the center of the berm. I would suggest starting pretty close to your patterning board (say 20 feet). This will ensure the spread of the shot would not place any pellet in a trajectory other than into the center of the berm. Then work back to the range you wish to pattern at in steps, again making sure your shot pattern impacts in the center of the berm after passing through the patterning board. rocketmot@msn.com

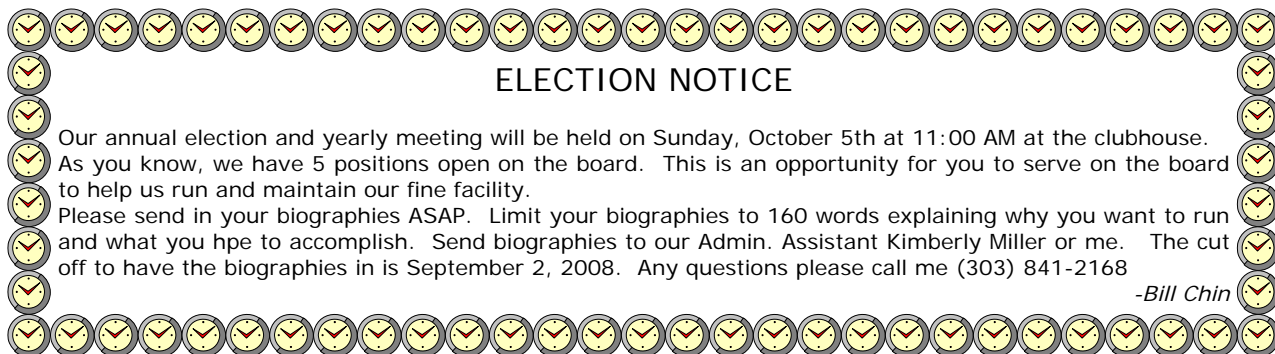
GUEST FEES PAYMENT BOX

As per the AGC member rule number 31 "members may bring a maximum of four guests at one time. A fee of \$3 per guest will be charged for the additional non-family member guests and the member is responsible for payment. Members with guests can only use one shooting position on any rifle or pistol range." Rule # 30 states " A member may bring his/her spouse and children under 18 to the range plus one other guest free of charge." We have added a payment box at the north end of the caretaker house by the garage door. Members are now required to pay for their guest **BEFORE** shooting. Follow the directions on the lid of the box and deposit your envelope in the slot. The board of directors passed the following motion regarding payment. It will be strictly enforced by the club. "AGC members will abide by rules 30, 31, and 32 as written in the AGC General Member Rules. Guest fees will be paid **BEFORE** shooting at the Guest Fee Station. Failure to do so will result in the range officer or caretaker collecting **DOUBLE** fees from the member on the first offense. Repeated offenses will be referred to the BOD for discipline."

Emmanuel Boyd

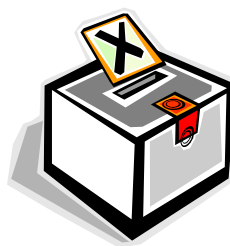
