INTENT OF THE LETTER:

TO COMMUNICATE TO MEMBERS:
WHAT ACTION WAS TAKEN AND WHY.

At the August BoD meeting several actions were taken by majority vote of the BoD members to re-establish that the BoD (acting in the best interest of the Club) governs, and not the President. And to address the President's actions that were interpreted to be intended to inappropriately influence the election of Board members.

Unfortunately, one of these actions was to rectify a miscarriage of the AGC 2003 election proceedings in filling the vacancy on the BoD resulting from Tom Matthews resignation. The filling of that vacancy by the President's appointment was in error. The appointment was based on the support of erroneous information which subsequently caused misguided support of this action by the BoD; which has proved to be wrong, as it was not filled by the process established by precedent and the Bylaws. It should be understood that this action was in no way intended to be a negative reflection on Mr. Chin. He is in fact encouraged to run for a Board seat in the new election.

It was felt that actions by the President had compromised the ability for a fair and impartial election process to occur and therefore the August 15th election was cancelled and a new election was scheduled to allow time to communicate to the membership information concerning the lawsuit and the Board's actions.

Even though none of the candidates declared their position on the lawsuit in their write-ups, this issue is felt to be a key issue driving how members would vote. The actions of the President - in two back-to-back newsletters - presented a slate that had a predetermined position regarding the lawsuit (as some members don't take the time to fully understand the issues and therefore are easily led by such an endorsement). This action has biased the election process. Such an endorsement was an inappropriate use of his position, and inappropriate use of the AGC newsletter to promote a personal forum. There was a clear decision of the BoD to publish information about the lawsuit in the August newsletter and that did not occur. A serious family crisis of one of the two BoD members assigned to assemble this document negated the possibility of the two members coming to agreement on the attempt to get out the information mandated by the BoD. The President directed that the newsletter be distributed without the mandated lawsuit information, thus leaving insufficient time to get information to the membership that would allow them to vote from an informed position. It was felt necessary to reschedule and start the election process anew.

Part of that process is to issue this information letter in the September newsletter and to include in the new election process: a balanced presentation of the lawsuit information, as well as to present the options for proceeding in the form of a referendum, so that members can ultimately determine the path forward. The obvious options are to continue the lawsuit with additional funding, continue the lawsuit without additional funding (would require the shooting community or other resources to fund the action), or AGC to drop participation in the lawsuit.

The intent is to publish an information sheet about the status of the lawsuit as well as present both sides of the issue. Member comments are requested. They will be summarized and presented in a balanced way.

The specific actions taken can be found recorded in the minutes of the BoD meeting. It is unfortunate that such actions were felt necessary by the majority and it is understandable that not all Board members felt these actions were warranted or appropriate. It is hoped that the referendum will put this polarization issue to rest and that the Board can rid itself of the emotional baggage it has been carrying and return to a focus on running the club.

**MINUTES OF THE AUGUST 10, 2004
AURORA GUN CLUB B.O.D. MEETING

Meeting called to order at 7:03pm by President Rob Rathburn.

1st V.P. Report: **08.10.04.a Motion: Pursuant to bylaws, Article 4, Section 10, and past precedent, Mike Jorgenson - first runner up in the BoD elections held on August 12, 2003 - is declared elected to fill the vacancy on the BoD created by the resignation of Tom Matthews. Seconded. Motion passed.**

*** This action does not express any criticism of Mr. Bill Chin, who was incorrectly seated in the Board by the President.**

*** This motion is noted to be under protest by Mr. Jim Ashmore, under Article 8, clause B.**

*** The president declared the motion invalid.**

*** A Roll Call vote was called for: Rob Rathburn – No, Steve Fowler – Yes, Jess Adams – No, Jim Kochenour – Yes, Dave Allen – Yes, Jim Ashmore – No, Roger Briden – Yes, Bill Chin – No, Al Doyle – No, Bill Hall – Yes, Fred Hamblen – Yes, Terry Humbargar – No, Cary Smallegan – Yes, Matt Walker – Yes, Jim Winchester – Yes. Roll Call Vote: 6 – No, 9 – Yes. Motion passed.**

President Rob Rathburn declared that this action is invalid, as a $\frac{3}{4}$ vote of the BoD is required to remove a member.

08.10.04.b Motion: Seating Mike Jorgensen as a BoD member, should take place immediately. Seconded. Passed.

Al Doyle requests that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded. Motion Failed.

At this point of the proceedings, a very angry temper flared by a BoD member. After this outburst, Rob Rathburn, Jim Ashmore, Bill Chin, Terry Humbargar, Jess Adams and Al Doyle walked out of the meeting. Shortly, Jess Adams and Al Doyle returned to their seats. At this point, Steve Fowler, the 1st VP, took control of the meeting and proceeded with BoD business.

Mr. Jess Adams presented a paper, stating that: per 10.07.03.a: That all legal transactions involving lawyers must go through executive committee and Mr. Sternberg.

08.10.04.c Motion: Resolved: That the Board of Directors of the AGC has no confidence in the ability of BoD president, Rob Rathburn, to fairly and impartially administer all the business of the AGC.

1. It is the duty of the president to carry out the business of the AGC as authorized by the BoD. The office of the president is an administrative position, not a policy making position. Nor is it a position which provides the president any authority to use that office to promote his personal views on any subject not purely administrative in nature or to undermine the authority of the BoD to make all policy decisions.

2. Mr. Rathburn has used the AGC newsletter to further his personal agenda by using the AGC newsletter to endorse his own slate of candidates in the upcoming election, in order to take control of the BoD with BoD members more to his own liking

3. Mr. Rathburn has tainted the upcoming election of new BoD members to a significant degree by Mr. Rathburn's endorsement of candidates in the last newsletter.

4. Mr. Rathburn has been insubordinate in the BoD's decision to pursue litigation against the City and County of Denver, in that he has agitated members against the suit, and attacked the integrity of another BoD member who supports the suit.

5. Mr. Rathburn has an irreconcilable conflict of interest between his employment as a Denver Police Officer and obedience to the BoD regarding the case of AGC & AGC member John Sternberg versus City and County of Denver, as indicated in many ways, but most importantly his refusal to communicate and cooperate with the AGC's attorney on the case.

Therefore, Mr. Rob Rathburn is called upon to voluntarily resign as president and a member of the AGC BoD.

Seconded.

Discussion: Mr. Jess Adams presented his observations of the occurrence which prevented agreement, on the facts of Mr. John Sternberg's letter, between himself and Mr. Dave Allen. Jess Adams stated that he had objection to preceding resolution. So Noted. Vote Results: 10 – Yes, 2 – No. Motion passed.

08.10.04.d Motion: That the annual election of members of the BoD, currently scheduled for August 15, 2004, be cancelled and all ballots cast voided. Because, in the opinion of the BoD, the president has improperly used his office, without precedent, to endorse in the official club newsletter, his personally preferred slate of candidates, which has created an unfair election. The elections should be rescheduled to November 7, 2004, and the membership should be notified of this action. **Seconded.** Vote Results: 10 – Yes, 2 – No. Motion passed.

08.10.04.e Motion: Include in the newsletter, a letter of information and intent; also include notice that there will be a referendum vote on the funding/involvement, etc. of/by AGC in the lawsuit. Both pro's and con's are to be published. **Seconded.** Vote Results: 12 – Yes, 0 – No. Motion passed.

08.10.04.f Motion: Moved: All control and management of the AGC newsletter is vested in the Secretary of the AGC BoD and no other member or officer of the BoD. The Administrative Assistant to the BoD reports to the Secretary regarding all matters pertaining to the newsletter and is directed to publish nothing to the membership which does not have prior approval of the Secretary, or in his absence or unavailability by the 1st Vice President. **Seconded.** Vote Results: 10 – Yes, 2 – Abstained. Motion passed.

BoD Directive: official business of the BoD will not be conducted via the internet.

08.10.04.g Motion: Moved: At the BoD meeting on May 11, 2004, the BoD passed motion 5.11.04.d, which directed that the membership list of the club is confidential and shall not be used by any member of the AGC for any purpose except those specifically authorized by the BoD by motion. To assure that this order of the BoD is complied with, the BoD directs that all copies of the membership list of the AGC held by any member, or officer of this BoD shall be turned in immediately to the 1st Vice President (in charge of membership), except that the Secretary and the Administrative Assistant shall have a copy for the purposes of managing the newsletter and other club business, such as elections. Further, no member of this BoD may send any written communication to the membership unless specifically approved by the BoD. **Seconded.** Vote Results: 12 – Yes, 0 – No. Motion passed.

08.10.04.h Motion: Moved: That there is hereby created an election committee to develop rules and procedures, which shall be in conformity with the AGC bylaws, for the rescheduled election on November 7, 2004. Members of this committee shall be Jim Kochenour (Chair, as Secretary), Jess Adams, Fred Hamblen. The committee shall report proposed rules to the BoD at the September meeting and manage the conduct of the election. **Seconded.** Vote Results: 12 – Yes, 0 – No. Motion passed.

08.10.04.i Motion: Form a committee to intake and critique all information in regard to tonight's BoD action and members input both pro and con on AGC's involvement in the lawsuit. This committee is only for this initial information release to the membership for the September newsletter. Members of this committee are: Jess Adams, Jim Kochenour and Roger Briden. **Seconded.** Vote Results: 12 – Yes, 0 – No. Motion passed.

08.10.04.j Motion: Hire a window contractor to size and manufacture vinyl double pane windows, then install them along with a new replacement of both front and rear door to the Dick Hebert Clubhouse. Jess Adams, (2nd VP), has the authority to purchase the windows, doors, and installation. **Seconded.** Vote Results: 12 – Yes, 0 – No. Motion passed.

1st VP Report: Club membership is full.

2nd VP Report: **08.10.04.k Motion:** Chuck Ward was contacted by Jess Adams regarding a high speed incident in the parking lot of AGC. This incident occurred on 17 July, 2004. A registered letter is to follow from the BoD to notify Chuck Ward that he must appear before the BoD at the 14 September, 2004 BoD meeting for disciplinary action. **Seconded.** Vote Results: 12 – Yes, 0 – No. Motion passed.

Club property was slightly damaged in the rainstorm/hailstorm/flooding of July 20, 22, 23, 24, 2004. I.e., broken windows, siding damage, garage doors, all roofs of buildings on property. Also, the trap houses flooded.

Treasurers Report: The new Peachtree computer program is now operational.

AGC has received a check from Friedlaw as a result of the arbitration with our first lawyers.

AGC has spent to date: \$16,524.29 in total on the lawsuit. The NRA has contributed: \$16,000+ to date. The trial is still set for October 12, 2004.

Pipeline negotiation: AGC has received a Memorandum of Intent, from the City of Aurora. Our lawyer has mailed the AGC response and we have no response as yet.

NOTICE **** Dick Hebert is/has been in the hospital at St. Joseph's. He had his gallbladder removed and has undergone some complications.

NOTICE **** Sammy Taddonio, reportedly 82 years young, was recently in the hospital. Sammy is fighting the Big "C."

Old Business: The Rocky Mountain Regional Raid has completed and was a success. The club has been cleaned up and is back to normal operations.

Jess Adams and Fred Hamblen are to contact the NRA in regard to the club's berms. Jess feels that AGC needs an NRA range consultant to make recommendations as to AGC's land use and berm design.

The Sand Creek Raiders will be making payment to AGC for the use of the Aurora Gun Club facilities during the RMRR.

New Business: NONE

Observation to note: Several of the general membership stayed through out the meeting in its entirety and for that, we the BoD would like to formally say: "Thank you, for your patience and concern."

Motion to adjourn at 10:15pm. Seconded. Passed.

WHY IS THE AURORA GUN CLUB IN A LAWSUIT VS. DENVER?

1. The state legislature passed two pro-gun bills in the 2003 session, SB-24 which makes Colorado a "Shall Issue" concealed carry state, and SB-25 which preempted many local laws not in accordance with State law.
2. The City and County of Denver believe that they can still make their own gun laws as a home rule city and ignore recent changes in state law that support your gun rights.
3. The City and County of Denver is suing the State of Colorado, claiming that all home rule cities can make their own gun laws since it is an issue of "local control."
4. There are more than 80 home rule cities in Colorado.
5. If Denver wins their suit against the State of Colorado, gun owners in the state will be subject to a patchwork of local gun laws in home rule cities that could affect ownership, transportation, use, storage, possession and sale of firearms. Further, many gun ranges could be affected by local zoning ordinances, including hours of operation, types of weapons allowed, types of events that can be held such as cowboy action, 3-gun, trap shooting, training classes and other events.
6. The Attorney General of Colorado is supposed to represent gun owners in the Denver suit against the State of Colorado. If you think he is interested in defending your gun rights, please read his opinion that allows the University of Colorado Regents to ban those with concealed carry permits from carrying on the CU Campus.
7. The issue of local control is one of major importance to home rule cities in Colorado. So are your individual gun rights. An appeal to the Colorado Supreme Court is not certain if Denver prevails in their suit against the State of Colorado. This would leave a legal precedent in place that would affect your gun rights.
8. A separate trial: AGC and John A. Sternberg (as an individual member) versus the City and County of Denver, is scheduled for October 12, 2004; where the issue of your gun rights will be argued before a judge.
9. This is not a political fight, this is about gun control. The political fight took place at the capitol when concealed carry and preemption of local gun control was enacted. The AGC lawsuit is about protecting, in court, under constitutional principles, your gun rights from legal attack.
10. The final ruling in our lawsuit will determine future firearms regulation cases, including zoning and range protection. The litigation will also affect the gun rights of every member who lives, travels works, owns, sells, uses or possesses firearms in a city.
11. Litigation costs money, so does defending your freedom. The legal expenses for this lawsuit are monitored by the AGC BoD and the NRA. So far, one year after BoD authorized \$25,000 and the NRA Legal Defense Fund authorized a matching \$25,000 as a retainer, \$16,525 has been spent by the AGC and about \$16,000+ by the NRA to date. Of the AGC's monies spent to date, the cost translates to approximately \$16.50 per each club member.
12. No money for this lawsuit has been spent for any specific member's benefit. All money spent for this lawsuit is authorized by the BoD and is used for protecting your gun rights. PSAC, The Sand Creek Raiders each contributed \$500 to this cause, along with contributions by some individual members, put in out of their own pocket.
13. The NRA Foundation, an entirely separate legal entity from the NRA, carefully reviewed this lawsuit, it believes the lawsuit to be meritorious, and is co-funding the suit with a matching grant from its Civil Rights Defense Fund. The Foundation is funded by donations and Friends of NRA dinners, not NRA dues.
14. The club's first law firm did not perform at an acceptable level and was fired as soon as that problem became apparent. The AGC has received the full \$5,000 paid to the first law firm back through an arbitration process. That money is back in the bank.

15. Unlike the Attorney General in the other lawsuit of, Denver vs. the State of Colorado, AGC is asking Denver to produce evidence and explain how it rationalizes its gun control ordinances as an issue of local control and why the various municipal ordinances should not be preempted by state law. The City and County of Denver, like many home rule cities in Colorado, have many anti-gun ordinances in place that affect your gun rights. These include safe storage requirements, assault weapons bans, magazine capacity limitations, bans on local carrying of firearms, and one very strange law that states that any gun that will melt at a temperature of less than 1,000 degrees, is labeled a cheap gun (e.g. Glock) – and prohibited from retail sale.
16. The City and County of Denver has never had to defend these ordinances in court. As part of our discovery process so far, Denver is violating one of its own ordinances by failing to account to the Denver County Court the status of thousands of guns it seized or obtained from 1992 to 2002. Due to the potentially damaging information we are requesting in the discovery process, Denver is trying to resist giving AGC evidence.
17. The Denver Democratic Assembly is urging a change in state law that will require you to have liability insurance in order to purchase ammunition. Winning this lawsuit will put an end to this kind of gun control.
- 18. THE AGC STARTED THIS LAWSUIT BECAUSE A MAJORITY OF THE BOD BELIEVES IN THIS SUIT. SUBSEQUENTLY, THE BOD ASKED THE NRA TO JOIN US IN THIS FIGHT, WHICH THEY DID FINANCIALLY.**
