GUEST FEES PAYMENT BOX

As per the AGC member rule number 31 "members may bring a maximum of four guests at one time. A fee of \$3 per guest will be charged for the additional non-family member guests and the member is responsible for payment. Members with guests can only use one shooting position on any rifle or pistol range." Rule # 30 states " A member may bring his/her spouse and children under 18 to the range plus one other guest free of charge." We have added a payment box at the north end of the caretaker house by the garage door. Members are now required to pay for their guest **BEFORE** shooting. Follow the directions on the lid of the box and deposit your envelope in the slot. The board of directors passed the following motion regarding payment. It will be strictly enforced by the club. "AGC members will abide by rules 30, 31, and 32 as written in the AGC General Member Rules. Guest fees will be paid **BEFORE** shooting at the Guest Fee Station. Failure to do so will result in the range officer or caretaker collecting **DOUBLE** fees from the member on the first offense. Repeated offenses will be referred to the BOD for discipline." Thank you for your attention to this matter.

CRO'S CORNER

This month I would like to remind every member of the AGC of Club Rule 13. Rule 13 states "Shooters are expected to clean their shooting areas when finished, including collection of spent brass." . Recently we have seen a large amount of spent cases and things like used cleaning patches laying next to the shooting positions throughout the range. Please be so kind as to police your own shooting position and help keep the range clean for all to use.

I would also like to remind all members to make time to re-read the range rules and re-double their efforts to abide by the rules. At the last BOD meeting we had the unfortunate event of having a member appear before the board for a major safety violation. The violation involved the use of a target at the 25 yard position on the 100 yard range that had too short of a target stand. The short stand caused the bullets to striking the ground at about the 45 yard point after passing through the target rather than striking in the center of the back berm. Bullets that strike the ground at a shallow angle have a high potential for ricochet. Before you ever pull the trigger or even handle your firearm, please "eyeball" your targets from the position you will be firing from and make sure the path of the bullet will meet the center of the back berm after passing through the target.

Finally, I would like to pass on a suggestion from R. Silva for those hunters out there: Depending on the weather conditions & lighting it may be difficult to blood trail; especially for people who are color blind. Carry a small spray bottle with hydrogen peroxide when blood trailing and if you think there is blood on a the ground, leaves, branches etc., spray some hydrogen peroxide on it; the blood will react and foam up confirming you're on the right track!

Thank you Mr. Silva for the input. If any AGC members wish to submit an idea or suggestion to me for future consideration in the CRO's corner please do so.

I CALL TO ORDER

II MINUTES

07/10/07 Board Meeting – Approval of minutes. Bill Chin did not receive any notification of errors, minutes stand as reported. Motion to approve minutes, seconded, motion passed.

III PRESIDENT REPORT

Welcome back Dave Dankowski to the club. Good to see speedy recovery. Unfortunately, Dave's vision has not completely returned, but he is doing well.

Election: Members need to get out the vote for the upcoming election for our quorum. We are losing some excellent talent. For those that are remaining, please begin thinking now about new officers following the election.

V FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer's report, Michael Miller:

June 30, 2007 - \$105,915.28 revenues, \$85,840.15 expenses, net change: \$20,075.15. Mike passed out a financial statement to the Board of Directors from our accountant. **08.14.07.b Motion: To accept the financial report. Seconded. Motion passed.**

Boy Scouts of America: Tyler Scott (working on a service project for Eagle Scout project) to rebuild 200 yd range overhead, propose partnership for funding of it. The roof is sagging, and he proposed to rebuild it. He wants to provide free labor & recruit volunteers (with safety instruction), and salvage re-useable parts. Would like to rebuild entire structure. The longest he can make it is 16 feet, but the most feasible is 12 feet. He submitted prices for supplies/lumber: \$820-\$850. It will take about 4 days to build, start date is unknown at this time. AJ suggest that we look at it and decide at the next meeting. **08.14.07.c Motion: we authorize up to \$1200 for materials, with the supervision of AJ, Rob Rathburn and Martin Visnak on the design, and approve the project. Seconded. Discussion. Motion passed.**

VI OLD BUSINESS

1st Vice President, Terry Humbargar:

Guest Fees: Last month, Terry asked the Board to think about the guest fees drop box. Terry showed the box. Inside the

lid are instructions, envelope and ticket stub, envelope fees are dropped in a second drop box (which our caretaker will pick up). Terry would like a penalty for not paying guest fees. **08.14.07.d Motion: That guest fees will be paid in drop box on the north side of the caretaker's house as posted. If a member fails to pay and is asked by the range officer or caretaker for his/her ticket and has not paid they will be charged double. Secoded. Discussion. Motion passed.** Terry would like to thank Randy & Russ for their help getting the box & sign together.

Chief Range Officer, Martin Visnak:

Range Violation hearing from last month: 07/07/07, projectiles were not hitting impact area. Martin asked the caretaker & the offender to tell their sides of the story. Questions, from the Board, were answered for clarification. Martin recommends some sort of action. Rob recommends some kind of suspension, length TBD by the board. Bill Chin recommends at least a 2 month suspension of all range privileges. The offender mentioned that he has not been on the club property for the past 6 weeks since the violation. Terry can personally speak for the reviewing of the rules during new member orientations. The first 4 rules are also printed on the back of everyone's membership card. Terry recommends a suspension starting 08/14/07 through 11/14/07 (three months from tonight's meeting), with reinstatement on 11/15/07. **08.14.07.e Motion: that based on range infractions, offender, should be suspended from the AGC until 11/14/07, reinstated 11/15/07. If this passes and you are found on the property during the suspension time, you will be considered a trespasser. Secoded. Discussion. Motion passed.**

Alex Ragulsky

In response to the above email sent to the Board of Directors (BOD)/Aurora Gun Club (AGC) from Mr. Ragulsky, dated August 18, 2007:

First a few of your misconceptions about the AGC need to be cleared up. The AGC is a non profit organization, owned and operated by its members. We depend upon volunteers to run their own disciplines. In many ways your email details a crisis of your own making due to a lack of communication with the AGC BOD and lack of volunteer staff. All successful disciplines spend countless hours in order to run a successful event.

All club disciplines who wish to have funds and services provided send representatives to BOD meetings. Over the past months, attendance by ATA participants at the monthly BOD meetings has been poor to nonexistent. If ATA sanctioned shoots are to survive at AGC, volunteers have to step up to the plate. Also by attending BOD meetings, the participants will know the facts instead of rumors and untruths.

The board of Directors has a duty to treat each shooting discipline equally and fairly. Each discipline is represented by a chairman who is a AGC member. The AGC will not simply provide monies for trophies or for goods that the ATA may use. If the ATA wishes the AGC to provide anything a representative from the ATA discipline must come before the board with a formal proposal, just as all other discipline chairpersons do, where upon the board will consider the proposal. Traditionally the BOD has not turned down reasonable and appropriate requests.

Since there appears to be no current ATA chairperson, in order for the upcoming ATA shoots to occur in September and October, it is the ATA discipline's responsibility to appoint an AGC/ATA member to serve as discipline chairman and to attend the September 11th BOD meeting to address the ATA's concerns and problems.
