Administrative Assistant's Report:

AGC has 110 people on the wait list for new memberships. We also need the resumes from members interested in running for the Board of Directors, by the newsletter deadline. Any change of address or email by club members should be sent by members to Kimberly. She is getting many returned newsletters and email.

VI OLD BUSINESS

President, Terry Humbargar:

The new 200 Yard shelter is complete.

1st Vice President, Harold Lee

Nothing to add.

2nd Vice President, Randy Still:

The perimeter fence is almost done. There is only a small amount of barbed wire remaining to be hung. The new concrete pad for the clubhouse is also complete and looks very good. The well water sample was presented to the city of Aurora for testing.

Mark received a letter from the lawyer of property owner to the North of the club. The responsibility of the AGC for any further action is absolved by the letter. Both the property owner and the AGC are satisfied by the work done by the AGC to mitigate the lead from the property. Once the letter is signed by the AGC president the issue will be closed.

Treasurer, Michael Miller:

Nothing to add.

Secretary Martin Visnak:

Martin asked the question: How the normally collected club fees are handled with regard to "special" benefit or charitable matches or events. Specifically, does the AGC place the AGC match fees in the club account as with all other matches or does the club add the collected fees to the donation that will be presented to the benefit/charitable organization?

The subject was not found in writing in the club bylaws. The answer provided was that ANY sanctioned match would always have the normal range fees collected by the AGC and placed into the AGC account.

08.12.08.c Motion to place all collected range fees from charitable or benefit matches in the AGC general fund/account. Motion seconded and failed.

VII NEW BUSINESS

President, Terry Humbargar:

Terry read a letter from Rob Rathburn which stated that Rob is resigning his position on the BOD. Terry thanked Rob for all he has done for the club. Best wishes to Rob, he will be missed.

1st Vice President, Harold Lee

Harold spoke to the reduction of the BOD from 15 to 11 members. Many area clubs have BODs with substantially less members than the AGC. Discussion ensued; the BOD carefully examined the proposal to ensure such a motion would follow the AGC bylaws.

08.12.08.d For the purpose of efficiency, a motion was made that the BOD adopt a resolution to reduce the board of directors (BOD) of the AGC from fifteen members to 11 members effective midnight prior to the 2008 election date. Further, to retain 11 members on the BOD through 2009 then in 2010 to further reduce the number of board of directors from 11 members to 9 members effective midnight prior to the 2010 election date.

Randy wanted to say the picnic tables have arrived and are waiting to be unloaded from Randy's trailer. Randy asked for assistance to assemble the benches Saturday 16 Aug. 2008.

Treasurer, Mike Miller:

Center fire bench rest requested \$337.61 for trophies.

08.12.08.e Motion to appropriate \$337.61 for the purchase of Center fire Bench rest trophies. Motion seconded and passed.

One remaining barrel of lead mined from the trap field was left on the AGC property by the contractors. Executive board made a decision to make the entire barrel available for open bid to AGC members. Members that wish to inspect the barrel may do so by calling Cal to arrange an appointment to look at the lead.

08.12.08.f Motion: The barrel of scrap lead, expecting to weigh 2,700lbs but guaranteed to weigh 2,500lbs will be sold by sealed bid to a member in good standing of the Aurora Gun Club. A minimum bid of \$1375.00 is required. The bid must be mailed to:

All Bids must be received by September 2, 2008. No failure of the post office to deliver will be accepted. The highest bid will win the purchase of the lead and the payment must be received by September 7, 2008. The lead must be removed from the garage no later than 6:00 PM MDT September 7, 2008. No guarantees or warranties are conveyed by the Aurora Gun Club or its Board of Directors other than the minimum weight. If a minimum bid is not received by the Board of Directors by September 2, 2008 the lead will be sold to a local scrap dealer. Motion seconded and passed.

Other New business:

Suggestion was made to have a general work bond for ALL members of the AGC. This suggestion is due partly to the complete lack of interest by the majority of club members to attend work parties or help with tasks at the AGC. During the last work party, Terry saw 7 cars drive up to the range closed sign at the gate and ask why the range was closed. After being informed that there was a work party that day, the same cars turned around and drove off, rather than helping with the work. It is a pity these people did not get out and help. This type of action by members is insulting. The BOD is seriously considering the work bond.

Gene asked to finish out the year as trap chairman. A marathon shoot will be the next trap event. Gene asked for guidance from the BOD as to the fee to be charged for birds at the Marathon Trap Match, aware that the cost of birds has been raised dramatically due to fuel/transportation/materials costs by the clay bird manufacturers.

08.12.08.g Motion that the AGC charge \$20.00 per 100 birds for the ATA "Marathon" shoot to be held Saturday 16 July 2008. Motion Seconded and Passed.

Emmanuel added, Larry Watson was placed in a hospice last week after a severe stroke. Please remember Larry with cards and prayers.

BOD retired to executive session, members were dismissed.

CRO's Corner

Well, September is here and the summer is gone! I hope all the AGC members and their guests had a good season of shooting. This month I wanted to remind all members and their guests to please check all your targets for proper alignment with the back berms prior to firing your first shot. Once you have placed your target/s, walk back to the firing line and get into the position you will be shooting from. Look "through" your target/s and make sure that the path of the bullet through the target/s will end up in the CENTER of the back berm of the range you are shooting at. This simple exercise will ensure there are no rounds leaving the AGC property. Also, if you use the 200 yard range, please place all targets on one of the five 4' x4' plywood backers in such a manner that the bullets passing through the target do NOT also pass through the upper or lower horizontal 2" x 4" rear backer support beams. This practice helps keep the 200 yard target frame in good form longer. Thank you!

Emmanuel Boyd

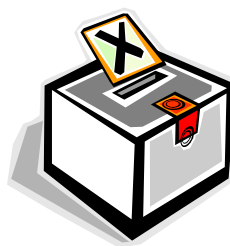
