8.14.18 a. Motion to approve agenda – adding Cowboy Action Update

Motion seconded and passed

III. MINUTES

8.14.18 b. Motion to approve minutes from 7/10/18 BOD meeting - with correction - the July newsletter did not have the money market account listed in the financials.

Motion seconded and passed with correction noted.

IV. MEMBERS FORUM

Stuart Davis - Would like to hold a Hunter Safety Class with internet conclusion courses. They will have 2 instructors for each class. CMP will pay the club \$1.50 per student. Would like to have classes in March, August and September (1 class per month) depending on the enrollment.

8.14.18 c. Motion to approve the Hunter Safety Class.

Motion seconded and passed.

Bob – I would like to recognize Willie, who worked on the 100-yard range cutting the weeds down. Thank you Willie!

Dave Bonner – I'd like to make a request for \$350.00 to purchase trophies for the NRA Silhouette Match.

8.14.18 d. Motion to approve \$350 for trophies for the NRA Silhouette match.

Motion seconded and passed.

Willie Chatman – I'd like to recognize and say Congratulations to Dave Bonner for winning a National Championship. At the 2018 National Silhouette Championships held in Raton, New Mexico on August 19th through the 21st. David Bonner won the High Power National Championship with a score of 88. The targets have to be shot offhand. The targets distances are 200, 300, 385 and 500 meters. Congratulations Dave!

Willie Chatman – If new board members knew what their predecessor on the board did before they took over, I think it would be helpful. Something like a check list, especially for work parties.

John Mead – Richard and I had a conversation about some of the equipment at the club that needs replaced. We looked at a machine by DR, I did review the Billy Goat, which is a String Trimmer. It's a good mower / trimmer that is self-propelled with self-starter. I'd like to ask the board to approve approximately \$1200.00 to purchase one for the club.

8.14.18 e. Motion to approve buying the string trimmer at approximately \$1200.

Motion seconded and passed.

V. OLD BUSINESS

Financial Report — Board President, Tom Desmond — July revenues were \$21,949 and our expenses were \$27,254 leaving a loss of (\$5,305). Our YTD revenue is \$137,040 and our YTD expenses are \$149,736 leaving a loss of (\$12,696). Account balances: Checking Account \$115,961; Payroll Account \$10,420 and Savings Account \$678,578. Petty cash of \$500; Money market account \$300,823.

Maintenance Update – John Mead – Road closure for road work. As stated in the email that was sent out, SEMSWA had a meeting which included SEMSWA, it's contractors & other government agencies. They made the decision to close the section of Gun Club Rd., just south of the club entrance, from Sept. 7 – 10th for construction. They will be putting up signage before it takes place. We will send out a few more email reminders.

The work should not impact the 200-yard range at any time.

The next work party is on Saturday, Sept. 29th.

Update on Archery targets –Board Member, Michael Quiring – The archery targets are in. Someone at their shop thought one of them was a shop target and took it out and shot it up. They have ordered a new target and they will be installed this Friday.

New proposal from Xcel energy – It will be approximately \$1,300 to take out the electrical wires pull the pole out. Post-meeting update: The power pole was removed on Wednesday, August 22nd.

Pavement of club entrance – Bids came in from \$43,000 - \$88,000. This was for going from the street to the back of the clubhouse. Using 2 ½ inches of recycled repurposed asphalt, packing it, then putting down another 2 inches and packing it, then another overlay. Bids for the entrance to end of white fence came in from \$6,000 - \$16,000. Measurements were very different from each company that submitted a bid. Chris brought up concerns about some of the areas that have big holes and would like to see those get filled. It was discussed that a decision needs to be made as to exactly what area needs to be done, measurements need to be taken and then new bids done for the specific areas. Once that takes place a decision can be made. Dave Leiker will get new bids.

Matt Hess mentioned a member that could work on the berms – He would work on the berms as they are open. The silhouette chicken berm needs cleaned up as well. A question came up about insurance coverage to have someone operating their own equipment on the club property. Would need to check on this before allowing the work to be done.

Member Rules Review – Board President, Tom Desmond - The Board made just a few changes to the rules and they will be posted on the website. The rules will also be mailed out with renewal invoices.

8.14.18 f. Motion to approve the new proposed rules, to be dated with today's date.
Motion seconded and passed.

Election Information – Board President, Tom Desmond - We currently have 4 openings on the board. If we do not have at least 5 people running, we will not be holding an election. Bios to run for the board are due two weeks from today, which is August 28th. Carla added that only one Bio has been sent in at this time.

Opening on the Board – AGC President, Tom Desmond – Announced that there was still a vacant spot on the board. Emmanuel Boyd asked that if he were to put his name in for the open spot would he have to do the paperwork. Emmanuel was told that he only needed to declare his interest in filling the open spot. Emmanuel put his name in to fill in the spot for the remaining year and a half.

8.14.18 g. Motion to approve Emmanuel Boyd to fill the vacant board opening.
Motion seconded and passed.

**There are now 3 spots to fill on the board.

Review of Cabela's Logo Art — AGC President, Tom Desmond – Shared new logo art from Cabela's. This art would be used on hats and could go on shirt pockets. They will also be sending samples for art work for cups. Board approved the artwork.

Cowboy Action Update – AGC President, Tom Desmond – Informed everyone that William Edick could not stay for the meeting, due to a storm related problem at his home. William did say, before the meeting, that he purchased targets and is looking for someone that can do some welding with the targets. The club will reimburse him for the targets, as the targets were purchased to be AGC property. The first shoot was held on August 8th, and the next one is on Wednesday, Sept. 12.

When: September 8, October 13, November 10 and December 8.

Where: Aurora Gun Club. The 100 yard range.

Cost: \$5 for AGC members, \$10 for non-members. Cheap.

Time: Registration starts at 8:30, shooting starts 9:00 AM sharp.

What you need: A .22 rim fire magazine-fed rifle (The Ruger 10-22 is the most common) in either bolt or semi-auto configuration. The rifle may have a scope, but you are restricted to 6X. Bring a couple spare mags. You can use a work glove on your support hand, don't need a pricey shooting glove. Something to lie on, piece of carpet or shooting mat, doesn't have to be fancy. A spotting scope is nice and a sling helps, but are not necessary. NO SHOOTING JACKETS. We furnish the range, targets and target stands, that's where your entry fee goes.

Course of Fire:

Fired at 50 yards:

Unlimited sighting shots in 5 minutes shooting prone.

10 shots slow fire prone in 10 minutes.

10 shots rapid fire (2 stages of 5) prone in 25 sec. for autos/30 sec. for bolt guns.

10 shots slow fire sitting or kneeling in 10 minutes.

10 shots rapid fire (2 stages of 5) seated in 25 sec. for autos/30 sec. for bolt guns.

Fired at 25 yards:

10 shots slow fire standing in 10 minutes

10 shots rapid fire standing (2 stages of 5 rounds) in 25 sec. for autos/30 seconds for bolt guns.

Awards: Winners receive a hearty handshake, peer adulation, and a round of applause.

August 2018 Action Pistol Match

It was a great August morning to be out shooting. Not too hot and a little breeze. Of course, we knew that it would get warm up as the day went on but that didn't stop 11 shooters from enjoying the NRA Action Pistol match.

Our Match Director, Bob Daneker, was concerned with everyone having a good time and being comfortable. In furtherance of this goal Bob offered to eliminate the Speed Barricade event but by unanimous vote the shooters decided to shoot all four events. No recounts, no hanging chads, the people had spoken. There weren't even any demands for a recount!

I'm a pretty fair marksman but I remember when I first started shooting the NRA Action Pistol program. My scores were embarrassing, and I wasn't really learning or improving, mostly because I was pretty frustrated. Well today we addressed those concerns by, of all things, following the NRA rules. There are provisions for "probationary courses" for newer, less-experienced shooters. You know, like you and I were a long time ago when it seemed so hard to do anything right. The probationary courses are modified and designed to allow shooters to get the experience and grow in the sport. Much quicker than having to stand on the line and have the local "hot shots" beat up on you.

No one is forced to "drop down" if they don't feel like it's the right thing and if a newer shooter feels like they want to shoot the normal course, well, that can happen, too. And even some of our more experienced shooters, feeling like they could benefit from some meaningful target experience, can shoot the probationary course. We had a few shooters actually do that today and it worked out well.

Really, it's not all that hard to hit it, it's just so darn easy to miss! The standing invitation is always open for you to come out the first Saturday of the month and have some fun. And you won't be embarrassed as a new shooter, either.

August 18th & 19th Carey, "Evil Scott," Glenn, Dietrich, Steve, Andy and Alex will shoot the Steamboat Challenge. This is an NRA regional match and Wyoming State Shoot held in Cheyenne.
