III PRESIDENT REPORT

This last month at least 24 folks came to Terry and spoke about how nice the club looked and how they noticed the additions to the club. People are noticing and are taking pride in the club. IV MEMBERS FORUM

Rich asked: if there was a possibility of outside firearms trainers be allowed to come into the club to provide training to members and non members. Terry stated a specific proposal would need to be presented to the BOD for consideration for each "event".

Paul noticed that the trap range was a mess after the last ATA shoot. Boxes and shells were left everywhere on the ground. Cleaning up the shooting areas by the members and guests is part of shooting at the AGC.

The new perimeter fence is 99% done. Twenty five "No Trespassing" signs were hung all around the perimeter on the fence by AJ and Randy. 25 more signs will be purchased and hung. The gun rack was anchored under the club house patio. Picnic tables and benches were assembled but need to be installed. Any volunteers will be appreciated.

Treasurer, Michael Miller:

The Eagle Scout candidate, Tyler, asked for a total financial report on the materials for the 200 yard shelter to add to his report.

Secretary Martin Visnak:

Would like to have Sealant applied to exposed wood on the 200 yard shelter hopefully before the first snow. Randy to purchase the materials volunteers to apply the sealant.

Other old business:

A high bid of \$1,700.00 was accepted for the barrel of lead. The sale was finalized and the barrel has been removed from the AGC garage. The lead mitigation project is now complete.

Rich Immel requests from 2008 discipline chairs their 2009 schedule of events by October 31 for presentation to BOD by Nov. meeting. If the event is not on the proposed calendar the discipline will have to come to the BOD meeting and make a request. NO exceptions. All schedules should be typed when presented so that there will be no mistake in reading the schedules.

VII NEW BUSINESS

President, Terry Humbargar:

Randy stated that the new 2nd VP has a great deal they could do with/for the AGC. He encouraged the new 2nd VP, whom-ever they are, to be proactive immediately once they take office.

New birds were ordered (25 pallets), the cost of birds increased by 25% amounting to about two cents per bird increase in cost to the AGC. Transportation is now \$2.71 per mile! The AGC will have to increase fees to cover the cost of the birds.

Deb introduced Chris the new clubhouse cashier. Chris asked for any suggestions to be offered directly to him for improvements to the club house or how it is run.

Bill Chin reported that he and Kimberly had made a timetable for the election processes. We are on schedule for the tasks that need to take place for the election. Postings will be made at the club and in the news letter about the election. Bill also requested \$100.00 for the end of year military rifle match plaque purchase.

09.09.08.d Motion to allocate \$100.00 for the purchase of plaques for the military rifle match final match. Motion seconded and passed.

A request was made by Bill Newman and Cary Smallagren to use the classroom building at the AGC for the purpose of holding hunter safety / education classes. The Division of Wildlife funds these classes. There would be approximately 25 students per class with around 12 classes held per year.

Terry stated again that this is a private club and not a training facility. Liability is a big issue. Concern was also voiced about the condition the clubhouse was left in from previous year's classes. The hunter safety students are to clean up after EVERY class not after the 3 class session.

09.09.08.e Motion to allow the remaining three 2008 hunter safety classes to be held at the AGC under a trial basis. Classes for 2009 will be considered by the BOD in early 2009. Motion seconded and passed.

CRO's Corner

This month I would like to suggest a few "extra" things that you might want to include in your range box or bag besides the "usual" targets, glasses, ammunition, stapler etc:

- 1) A small Allen and/or Torx wrench set to tighten down scope mounts or make adjustments to electronic sights.
- 2) A small first aid kit, or just some Band-Aids and a couple alcohol wipes
- 3) Sun screen
- 4) Insect repellent
- 5) A rag and some wet wipes
- 6) A set of flat head and/or Phillips screw drivers
- 7) A small multi tool like Leatherman etc.
- 8) An extra set of ear plugs
- 9) A sectional cleaning rod
- 10) A small section of wooden dowel perhaps a couple different diameters to drive out a stuck bullet
- 11) A small rubber or plastic mallet
- 12) A small container of oil
- 13) A small container of grease
- 14) A small container of some solvent of your choice
- 15) A few cotton tipped swabs in a zip-lock bag
- 16) A small note pad and a writing implement
- 17) A ruler (if you like to measure groups)
- 18) A couple feet of tape (you can just wrap some around a pencil for example)
- 19) A copy of the AGC range rules

The above list is by no means comprehensive or mandatory. I just wanted to suggest a few things that I have found useful and you may too. Have a safe month of shooting.

Emmanuel Boyd

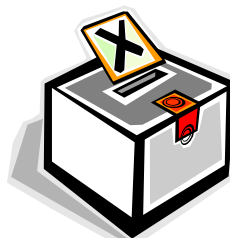
