V. FINANCIAL REPORT**Treasurer's Report, Michael Miller:**

Revenue for June 2010 was \$16,562.25 and expenses were \$22,857.87 with a negative net balance of \$6,295.35.

Revenue for July 2010 was \$19,490.88 and expenses were \$27,777.97 with a negative net balance of \$8,287.09.

NOTE: Our expenses for legal fees for the past 2 months have amounted to \$15,700.00.

Administrative Assistant's Report:

The wait list was updated to 158. We added 21 new applications since the last meeting.

VI. OLD BUSINESS**President, (Excused) 1st Vice President Emmanuel Boyd:**

On the Three Gun follow up: The member was not able to attend the meeting as requested.

09.14.10.c Motion to suspend the member's range privileges until he appears before the Board of Directors to discuss the Three Gun violation that occurred on June 19, 2010. Motion Seconded and Passed.

On AGC member Paul Wiggins four requests for the Board of Directors to consider:

1. Publish an itemized income statement each month in the newsletter to inform the membership of the revenues and expenses. It is not cost effective to publish an income statement on a monthly basis.
2. Publish an itemized balance sheet yearly to inform the membership of the assets and liabilities of the club. The yearly balance sheet is sent out in the March newsletter.
3. Purchase an Automatic Electronic Defibrillator (AED). Approximate cost \$1,250.00. In case of an emergency we have no qualified personnel to operate the AED. We also have to consider the civil liabilities to the club if something were to go wrong.
4. Purchase a gasoline operated golf cart style vehicle for range use. Approximate cost \$2500—\$3000. This is not a practical idea. Again the liabilities to the club outweigh the benefits.

1st Vice President, Emmanuel Boyd:

The Administrative Assistant and I are almost finished making the corrections to the membership roster and the wait list.

2nd Vice President, Joe Benskin:

We now have an orange temporary fence blocking off the construction area. The gate posts are already set and we should have a new gate installed soon. Because the shot from trap One will be landing in the construction area, trap number One is officially closed for safety reasons. Wednesday Trap will be using traps Three and Four.

According to the City of Aurora, the creek will have water flowing for four to six more weeks. The 100 and 200 yard ranges will be affected. If you are planning to use either of the ranges bring your waterproof boots, otherwise plan on getting your feet wet.

Secretary, Dave Bonner:

A new Dell laptop computer was purchased for the Administrative Assistant. The old problematic laptop will be sold and monies returned to the club.

The caretaker position has been filled. We have hired Dan Cochran as the new caretaker effective September 15, 2010. The AGC will be looking for a Club House Manager to replace Dan. Applications for the position are in the clubhouse.

The temporary Range Officers for the pipeline project have been selected. A.J. Wells and Joe Huber will be on duty during the construction.

CRO'S CORNER

This month I would like to relate an incident that was brought to my attention by another member of the club. As some of you may know the club offers the opportunity to fire shotguns on various ranges. There is also a patterning board located just north of the #4 trap house. In the club rules, #37 under the TRAP RANGES category states: "Patterning Board: the maximum shot shell load allowed is 3 dram with a maximum lead shot size of 7 1/2". That load is also the maximum load allowed while shooting on the trap ranges. Now let me ask you all a question. Why do you suppose we have any sort of limit on shot size or load on the trap ranges and patterning board? While you think on that, let me tell you what was reported to me. One of our illustrious and highly intelligent members and/or guests shot at the patterning board using what appears to be a shotgun slug load. Let me ask you another question. What do you suppose happened to the patterning board and the slug once it passed clean through the patterning board? I sincerely hope all of you reading this answered my questions correctly. I will not ask for or grade answers.

Ladies and Gentlemen, we simply have to be smart, safe, and conscientious when we use our club every time and all the time. Any infraction like shooting at the patterning board with slugs could literally close the club or worse kill an innocent person! Please watch what you do at the AGC. I know I sound like a broken record, but also please watch others (when at the AGC we are all Range Officers!) and read the range rules again if you have read them before or for the first time if you have not. It is actions like the one I have highlighted that have caused the range rules to be so many and so specific. The incident may also mean that the patterning board will be removed, therefore denying all the other club members its use. If any member wishes to "pattern" their shotgun with a load larger than what is allowed they may certainly do so! The member does however HAVE to pattern more powerful loads in the pistol berms or on the magnum handgun range using their OWN patterning board. That way the larger or faster projectiles impact harmlessly into the berm after they have passed through the patterning board. If anyone has any information on the use of slugs on the patterning board please report it to the BOD. If the individual who shot the patterning board with slugs happens to be reading this and has enough intestinal fortitude please also notify the BOD and identify yourself. I will close by wishing you all a very safe, enjoyable fall and hunting season for those who partake in that activity.

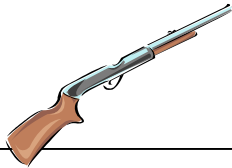
