Meeting called to order at 7pm by 1st VP Chris Baker

Present: Artzer, Baker, Boyd, Faingold, Kohler, Leiker, Mead, Quiring

I. CALL TO ORDER

9.11.18 a. Motion to approve agenda Motion seconded and passed

III. MINUTES

9.11.18 b. Motion to approve minutes from 8/14/18 BOD meeting. Motion seconded and passed

IV. MEMBERS FORUM

Terry Humbargar – Presented a request from Bill Chin to purchase trophies for the Military Match in the amount of \$275.00. **9.11.18 c.** Motion to approve the purchase of the trophies for the Military Match Motion seconded and passed

Harold Lee – Expressed concerns about the encroachment around the club and if something should happen, that the club would be forced to close, then legal documents need to be in place. The club's funds could be setup to go to another non-profit. This is something that the board should investigate setting up, it was a topic that was discussed a few years ago. It was determined to establish a committee and seek legal counsel to put together the appropriate documents. Would like a notice in the newsletter looking for a couple of attorneys and any member interested in helping with this important issue.

A few members expressed that they would like to see a professional company come out and really spray the weeds and clean up the berms. Having only 2 work parties a year is not getting the job done.

Richard – Informed those in attendance that the gentleman, Sean, that does the snow plowing has the equipment to also do the weeds and will contact him for more information.

Dave Bonner – Asked who is responsible for the maintenance of the club? Only a handful of people work on the range when work parties occur. The board will fill the VP of Maintenance position after the election.

Willie Chapman – Is the club policing and enforcing the pickup of 22 brass? - The reply was "No". There was a lot of discussion about the 22 casings not being picked up and would like to encourage all members to pick up all bullet casings after shooting. Also, asked about the cover for the 100-yd. range. He stated that only a small percentage do not want the cover. However, there is a much larger percentage that would like it. Suggested having members vote on it, or to cover a certain section to start with and see what the response is. It was agreed that David Faingold will follow up with the architect to discuss a possible cover for the 100-yd. range.

Another member shared their concern about the rule on being respectful. He suggestion that all members need to treat each other with the same respect that they would show their grandfather or grandmother.

V. OLD BUSINESS

<u>Financial Report</u> — AGC Treasurer, Loren Kohler — Aug. revenues were \$22,146 and our expenses were \$31,234 leaving a loss of (\$9,088). Our YTD revenue is \$159,186 and our YTD expenses are \$180,972 leaving a loss of (\$21,786). Account balances: Checking Account \$111,053; Payroll Account \$15,157 and Savings Account \$658,622. Money market account \$301,142.

Maintenance Update – Next work party is on Sept. 29th. Richard has a list of about 20 different items. Board members, John Mead, Dave Leiker and Steve Artzer will run the work party. It was determined that this may not be the best time of year to have a professional company out to spray the weeds. Richard will talk to Sean to see what can be done at this time. Would like an Email blast sent out about the work party and what tools are needed. It was mentioned again about having the work parties in the Spring and Fall and not in the middle of the summer. April & Sept. are good months. Archery targets have not been installed yet, Michael Quiring will follow up with them.

Board member, Dave Leiker - Update on pavement – He felt like the board needed to define the project that needs to be done. He had sent an email to the board members to come out on a Sat., but no other board members met him. He has bids from a few companies. Will need to get permission from the county and get a permit. Some road base was put down for now in some of the holes. Dave again shared the bids that he had received. It was discussed and determined to go with the bid to pave to the back of the clubhouse. Pavement from the back of the clubhouse to the street was bid at \$44,000

9.11.18 e. Motion to approve the pavement from the road to the back of the clubhouse

Motion passed 6 to 3 (abstained - John Mead Opposed - Baker & Desmond approved - Boyd, Faingold, Kohler, Quiring, Leiker, Artzer)

<u>Election Information</u> – Dave Carriker – Looks like the club will have an election this year. The ballots will be printed at the end of this week and mailed by the middle of next week.

Members that are running for the Election that were in attendance to briefly speak were: Dietrich Whitesides, Loren Kohler, Chuck Dunbar and Chris Baker. Tim Hall – Was in attendance but left and withdrew is name from the ballot the next day. He felt that he may be better suited to help the club in other ways.

The names on the election packet were randomly drawn. There was discussion about the wording on the ballot that "If more than 3 names are circled, only the first 3 will be counted". It was determined that it should not be up to the people processing the ballots to make that decision and the ballot would be reworded to state: "If more than 3 names are circled, and you DO NOT draw a line through the name/s that you do not want to choose and put your initials at the end of the line, your ballot will be void.

9.11.18 f. Motion to approve if more than 3 names are circled, and not crossed out and initialed, the ballot is void Motion seconded and passed

VI. NEW BUSINESS

Incident Report – AGC CR Terry Humbargar – Reported that an incident occurred on the 100-yd range on Aug. 19th between a member and range officer. A cease fire was called due to deer crossing on the top of the 100-yd range. Another member also yelled cease fire, everyone remained behind the line and waited for an all clear. A while later the deer came back through and another cease fire was called. The member was then speaking with the RO about not being able to clear his gun when the cease fire was called. He understood the cease fire but had great concerns when the RO went down range to place clay targets with live rounds on deck. That is a safety violation to go down range with live ammo involved. The conversation got a little heated, as the member was upset about the situation. There was then some name calling between the member and another member. The CRO was then asked to intervene and asked the member and family to pack up for the day and leave the range. CRO said the member was getting very agitated and angry about the situation. The member said that he was trying to talk about the situation but the CRO was yelling at them and belitting them and there was no real good communication that could be done at that point. The member and family left, and their badge was deactivated. A letter was then sent to the member to appear before the board.

Motion to give a 6-month suspension was made – Motion for a 1-month suspension was made

Loren asked Steve to withdraw his motion. Discussion about what was reasonable. Manny made a motion to split the difference and do a 3-month suspension. Member will not be eligible to vote in this year's election.

9.11.18 g. Motion to suspend the member for 3 months from Aug. (Michael abstained due to personal relationship) Motion seconded and passed

Independent Work Parties – Dave Bonner had 5 people work on the silhouette range for work party credit. Dave made plans with Richard in advance. He stated that the Golden Gun Club held monthly work parties. Maybe holding more than 2 a year might get more interest. Hiring a professional company to come out 2 or 3 times a year to clean up the range might also be a good idea. There was discussion about the Chair Disciplines being able to hold their own work parties to clean up their ranges and no one on the board indicated a problem with this decision.

Ceasefire vs. closing the range to set targets

Due to some confusion in the past months I would like to clarify and set the standard for a cease-fire and a closing of the range to set targets. When a ceasefire is called by a range officer or any member you are to immediately clear your weapon (unload/make it safe), put it down (on the bench or in a rack) step back away from it and wait for further instructions.

To close the range the person lowering the flag whether it be a range officer or member should clear the range both to the left and the right and wait for a signal from the shooters that it is OK with them to lower the flag and close the range to set targets or pick your target up. I hope this helps clarify the difference between a cease-fire and a range closure. Thank you! CRO Terry Humbargar
