# MEETING MINUTES

OCTOBER 10, 2006

## I CALL TO ORDER

## II MINUTES

No notifications of corrections or amendments. Minutes stand as recorded. Motion to accept the minutes. Motion passed.

## III PRESIDENT REPORT

Rob had every intention of attending tonight's meeting, but his stamina is low and apologized for not attending. Rob wants to thank everyone for the elections. He will try to see us as much as he can, but is getting back on his feet.

## IV MEMBERS FORUM

*AGC Member, Bobby Shigemura:*

Non-members fee increase: it has been tabled at this time. It will be discussed at the November meeting. Terry wants to give the membership enough notice before discussing it.

Mike Miller would like to recognize and thank the election committee.

Bill Chin commented that working with this election group was one of the best groups he has ever worked with. They have volunteered a lot of time and did a good job. He wants to extend his thanks.

## V FINANCIAL REPORT

*Treasurer's report:*

Total income \$216,352.50. Total expense \$102,827.03. Net income \$62,734.88. This will be published in the next newsletter.

We have signed a letter of agreement with a new CPA firm. The accounting & CPA business will be transferred over by November 1<sup>st</sup>. The operation will stay the same up until that time, taking the time for a proper transition & procedures. One new procedure will be initiated is purchases for the club will require a purchase order (e.g., birds, large pieces of equipment, etc.) A purchase order will be issued based on the discipline chairman, wand will track through to the accountant. Current BoD members have authority to make purchases up to \$500. The new CPAs will be in attendance at the November meeting. Mike expects that they will attend the quarterly AGC BoD meetings. Randy Still asked what they would charge per month. Fee will be \$650-\$725 with an initial fee of \$1000. **10.10.06.a Motion to accept the treasurer's report as published. Seconded. Motion passed.**

## VI OLD BUSINESS

### *1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, Terry Humbargar:*

Memberships: Waiting list in the 70s. Fugi has the waiting list application on the website. We're asking for email address on 2007 membership application for quick contact opportunities.

### *2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President, A J Davis:*

New Mower: around \$1800. Concerns about the truck. 100 yard trailer's roof (\$3500). Terry mentioned the items on his agenda, but would like AJ to address this personally.

### *Secretary, Bill Chin:*

Rezoning: Draft letter addressing postponements – passed out to the BoD tonight. Will get together with Terry at the end of this week, requesting that the city no longer grant any more postponements.

Election: Expressed appreciation on all the election committee's efforts.

### *Board of Directors, Randy Still*

Debra Caldwell's request: She wanted to use the AGC and teach her classes for the shooting portion. Previously tabled because of insurance issues. She had contacted NRA and received information from them. There is some confusion on policy coverage. Also, policy cost is prohibited based on number of students that she teaches on a yearly bases. She has offered to compensate the club \$20/shooter. She would be interested in looking into another insurance policy. AJ & Bill are interested in getting Debra's program orientated into the club because she is willing to teach members of the AGC. She would be willing to take the AGC range safety officer class. Terry asked for a written proposal.

Trap, non-member pricing: Currently charging \$2/members, \$4/nonmembers. Would like to see that raised. Weekend rates, \$3.50/member, \$5/nonmember. Terry estimated that we were at \$8/case and we are just barely breaking even on Wednesdays. Harold recommends that we look into things, and double check our figures & expenses, discuss with trap leaders, before we make any proposed increases. Terry would like to table this until the December's meeting. **10.10.06.b Motion that we table this until December, and get numbers from the CPA, get a hold of the trap chairman, and get Gary's report of trap kid's time, and make a decision on trap prices. Seconded. Motion passed.**

### *AGC Member, Dave Olive*

Election: Quorum needed was 104. Statistics memo passed out to the BoD. In person ballots – 94. Proxy ballots – 67. Total valid ballots - 161. Last year, in person ballots – 90, proxy ballots – 114. Total valid ballots - 204. Speculated on why the lower turnout this year. Voting certification and election results was signed by the election committee. Also passed out a statistics report. Received invalid ballots – 23. Last year's invalid ballots – 33. Went into invalid ballot detail, invalid proxy ballots detail, etc. This election did follow the new ByLaws and would be extremely hard to contest.

## VII NEW BUSINESS

### *BoD of Directors, Gary Ames*

ATA review: Alex Ragulsky has resigned as of yesterday. Gary Ames will have ATA numbers. His biggest issue is loosing their insurance (which covers this club) and revenue that it brings in to the AGC. The person that runs it needs to be an ATA & CSTA member. Terry wants to hear from our CPA what profit we are making from ATA. The BoD would like to keep the ATA active at the AGC. Brainstorming on finding a new ATA chairman. Gary is actively talking to Sonny Young & Amy Rathburn.

Chief Range Officer: passed out a memo to the BoD, relinquishing his CRO duties. Bill Chin appreciates all of his efforts and is sorry to see him go.

### *BoD of Directors, Rich Immel:*

Range Calendar: has gotten some dates for the 2007 calendar.

### *BoD of Directors, Fred Hamblin*

Chief Range Officer: Fred would like to be the CRO. He is a NRA instructor. Fred will be teaching 2 new shooters so shoot. This will be his wife and a guest. Fred did not want this misinterpreted as a training class for profit.

# ANNOUNCEMENTS

## ELECTION

The Annual Members Meeting and Board of Directors Election took place as scheduled on Sunday, October 8, 2006, at the AGC Clubhouse. Five director seats were filled each to be served for a 3 year term. The four directors running for re-election: Rob Rathburn, Martin Visnak, Dave Dankowski and Mike Miller were re-elected. Russ Cromie was elected as the fifth director. There were no motions or issues on the ballot.

**We do appreciate and thank all of the 184 members who considered voting to be important and took the time to cast their ballot this year** Of the 184 ballots, 161 were valid (87.5%) and 23 were invalid (12.5%). Of the 161 valid ballots, 94 were In-Person (51.1%) and 67 were Proxy (36.4%), which enabled this year's quorum of 104 valid ballots to be met.

Of the 23 invalid ballots, 6 were In-Person (3 mailed in, 3 without member name, signature or number) and 17 were Proxy (1 not mailed in, 11 without a proxy name, 3 proxies who did not attend the meeting, 2 for proxies that are not members). There is evidently still some confusion about "proxies".

To the 850+ members who did not vote, don't be consoled by the fact that your vote wasn't needed to reach a quorum. The 161 members who cast valid ballots did it for you. Anytime you don't vote --especially for firearms and Second Amendment related topics-- your rights are compromised or diluted one vote at a time (your vote).
