III. PRESIDENTS REPORT

I have received the final evaluation of the Aurora Gun Club property from our assessor. Our assessed value is higher than the City of Aurora's so the lawyers on both sides will meet again to agree on a new dollar amount for the easement property. We have approximately \$80,000 in an escrow account from the city. The monies are for the easement, moving and relocation of the Archery range and a new cover, and for the relocation of trap one. \$42,000 is monies to be used for a new trap house and/or a skeet range. I would like to thank the members for all of their support.

IV. MEMBERS FORUM:

Mr. Gerald Johnson - Three Gun Match Director: Read a statement to the BOD and the members present at the meeting. The synopsis of the letter is that he felt that they did **not** violate any safety rules concerning the not lowering of the flag during a match when going down range when under the control of an experienced 3 Gun range officer. Five other ranges have contacted the 3 Gun match director to move regular matches to their range. The 3 Gun discipline shot a match in September at a new range with no safety issues. They have chosen another range to conduct their monthly match and will no longer hold matches at the Aurora Gun Club. (Note: The entire letter as written will be posted in the club house for the membership to review.)

Pete Benoit wants: To use the Education trailer to hold classes on the M1 Garand and on the 1903 Springfield. The classes will be in January and February on the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month. They will start at 9:00 AM and be finished by 12:00 PM. The classes will be free.

Rebuttal to the Rocky Mountain Three Gun (RMTG) representative's comments at the Last Board Meeting

The Person representing the RMTG made a number of statements at the last AGC Board meeting prior to stating that RMTG would be leaving AGC. Since the representative left the meeting prior to giving the board a chance to respond, I believe the board needs to rebut.

1. Match directors do not have the authority to ignore AGC safety rules. Target's, target frame, and safety flag rules established by the club have always been maintained by match directors. Generally speaking, the match director's enforce the match rules while maintaining club rules.
2. Furthermore, all club members are responsible for maintaining club rules. If a member participating in a match recognizes that the match director is violating a club rule it is every member's duty to notify the match director immediately.
3. We do not believe that any hostile requirements were levied toward RMTG matches.

CRO'S CORNER

We have had an eventful fall at the club. The city construction project reminds us just how fragile our position is in the community. We should heed that reminder and act as safely as possible while using the AGC. Please look over the range rules yet again and practice safe shooting at all times while at the club. Muzzles should always be pointed in a safe direction. The four basic rules of gun safety include "NEVER let your muzzle sweep anything you are not willing to destroy". We recently had a situation where a shooter was carrying an over and under shotgun that was open (in safe condition) under his arm. While the gun was indeed in a safe condition, the muzzles were pointed straight out much to the consternation of the shooters whom he swept with the barrels. When approached by an RO with a correction the shooter "informed" the RO that the gun was in an open state. That member was acting irresponsibly, disobeying one of the 4 rules of gun safety, disobeying the AGC rules and just plain being disrespectful to all the members to whom his barrels swept. He was apparently willing to destroy all those whom his barrels swept! I see no need for such behavior, do you want to shoot with a person who sweeps you with the muzzle of their gun and does not care? I certainly do not! Keep your mind in the game folks, think about what you are doing and going to do. OK enough harping just be safe and respectful please.

The 200 yard frame is looking worse for the wear. The plywood backers need to be replaced. If any member wishes to do so please just do it. Keep track of your time and materials and you can be compensated at \$8.00 an hour off next year's dues. Let me know how long you worked and I can get the hours to the right folks. Have a wonderful Thanksgiving and a good fall season!

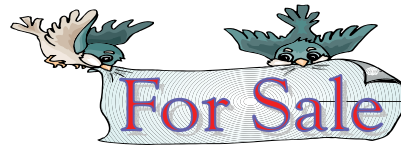
