V. ELECTION RESULTS – Election Chairman, Dave Carriker - Dave read the election summary - top vote goes to Willie Chatman, Manny Boyd came in 2nd and Tom Desmond in 3rd. The other candidates were Cyrus Sarmast and Michael Brunson. Dave read through the list of ballot counters – Mike Benskin, Steve Chagolla, Dave Leiker, Don Jensen, Don Philips, Charles Clemenson, Fred Smith and Tom Wengh. He thanked all the counters, Nicole and volunteer, Carla Smith for their help.

VI. APPOINTMENT OF EXECUTIVE BOARD – 1st VP, Chris Baker – Chris asked each executive board member if they would like to remain in their current positions and each person said yes. Chris also mentioned that Tom Desmond said he would like to remain as President, and everyone agreed. Board positions will remain the same as follows – Ron Dobbs - Secretary, Loren Kohler - Treasurer – David Faingold - 2nd VP of Maintenance, Tom Desmond – President and Chris Baker – 1st VP of Membership. Dave Hay, Willie Chatman, Emmanuel Boyd and Dietrich Whitesides – Board Members.

IV. MEMBERS FORUM

Steve Chagolla – Steve said he would like to ask the board for \$200 for trophies for the military rifle discipline on behalf of Bill Chin. The board agreed that it was in line with what is normally asked for. Then Steve said he collected over \$1,200 from members in honor of Randy Still that he would like to present to Jan Weber (in attendance) from Quilts of Valor. Steve also invited Randy's wife Christine to join the meeting for the presentation of money to Jan. Jan thanked everyone for recognizing Quilts of Valor and Randy for all his hard work over the years he did for her organization. She said if there is anything they can do to recognize a vet to please let her know.

Fred Smith – Fred mentioned that he would like to remind the membership that this coming Thursday, the Navy is celebrating their 247th birthday. Happy Birthday Navy!

Rich Dimisko – Rich said he asked Nicole to forward the board an email he received from White Flyers regarding the increase in cost for trap targets. He said the cost increase would be effective Monday, October 7th due the increase in materials. He said White Flyer did not give any firm numbers yet but wanted the board to be aware of the increase and more information would follow later. Sonny told him that we have about 7 pallets left. Chris Baker asked about lead time issues for orders and Rich said about 3 weeks.

V. OLD BUSINESS

Financial Report — Treasurer, Loren Kohler – September revenues were \$22,297 and our expenses were \$25,419 with a loss of (\$3,122). Our YTD revenue is \$234,704 and our YTD expenses are \$215,242 with a net gain of \$19,462. Account balances: Chase Checking Account \$59,592; Chase Payroll Account \$9,620 and Chase Savings Account \$322,017; Bank of the West Money market account \$208,558. Loren said he looked over the financials and nothing looked abnormal.

Maintenance Update – 2nd VP, David Faingold – David said he wanted to thank all the members that attended the work party and would like to reach out to those that would like additional time, cleaning up the branches or mowing. He said they were not able to do the painting in the caretaker's house as the main area and bedroom needs cleaning up. The garage was cleaned up nicely. David said he has added a check-out/in sheet for members to borrow tools from the garage. They will need to list their name and date for when tools are checked out. David also mentioned that the trailer toilet has been removed before temperatures drop below freezing. He mentioned again that he has only received 2 applications for the caretaker position. Dave Hay asked if we can post other places. Chris Baker said yes that Tom can post online.

Clubhouse Renovation Status – 2nd VP, David Faingold – David said there has been some nice progress in the clubhouse. The supply line is going to be completed this week as well as some electrical and plumbing. The roofing will also be done this week and inspection is scheduled for Friday. There were 6 more inspections on Monday and Tuesday and the gas line will also be installed and pressurized this week. David also said the bathroom window will be installed and the contractor has been keeping him posted on work.
