## CRO's CORNER

This month I do not have one specific subject rather a few bits of information I would like to suggest to you. It is winding down to the end of the traditional hunting/shooting season. Most of us put our guns away at least for a few weeks until warmer weather hits. Prior to storing your firearms consider giving them good cleaning and placing them in silicon impregnated "sock". The socks will keep them rust free and protect your firearms from contact with other guns in your safe, cabinet or closet. Brand names are varied but include Bore store, Cabala's and Cheaper than Dirt. These socks are very inexpensive and they work.

Speaking of storage, please consider safe storage of your firearms. The holidays more often than not, include children in the home. You may not need (or be able to afford) a Fort Knox safe but there are many much less expensive alternatives. Aside from keeping your weapons from being stolen, safe storage could prevent an unspeakable accident when children are in your home. I am sure most of you have already introduced the children in your lives to firearms. Doing so encourages a new generation of sportsmen and women and shooters, it also takes the mystery out of "dad's or mom's guns". Children are much less likely to want to play with something that they already know about rather than something dad said "don't you dare touch!". The last thing I wanted to talk about was the 200 yard target frame. This old frame seems to take the brunt of many a bullet. When you shoot the 200 yard please place your targets in-between the horizontal 2x4 supports on the ply wood back panels. That way when your bullets pass through the target they do not pass through the horizontal 2"x4"s as well. If everyone did this simple task the 200 yard frame will last much longer between rebuilds. ## GUEST FEES PAYMENT BOX

**As per the AGC member rule number 31 "members may bring a maximum of four guests at one time. A fee of \$3 per guest will be charged for the additional non-family member guests and the member is responsible for payment. Members with guests can only use one shooting position on any rifle or pistol range." Rule # 30 states "A member may bring his/her spouse and children under 18 to the range plus one other guest free of charge." We have added a payment box at the north end of the caretaker house by the garage door. Members are now required to pay for their guest BEFORE shooting. Follow the directions on the lid of the box and deposit your envelope in the slot. The board of directors passed the following motion regarding payment. It will be strictly enforced by the club. "AGC members will abide by rules 30, 31, and 32 as written in the AGC General Member Rules. Guest fees will be paid BEFORE shooting at the Guest Fee Station. Failure to do so will result in the range officer or caretaker collecting DOUBLE fees from the member on the first offense. Repeated offenses will be referred to the BOD for discipline." Motion to accept the minutes. Motion passed.

Terry introduced a door prize at the BOD meeting, prize was awarded that evening.

*Administrative Assistant's Report:*

Nothing to share this month. Terry added: Just a note that there were 2 women interviewed for the position of admin asst. for the AGC and a difficult final decision was made last week. Kimberly Miller was finally chosen.

#### **VI OLD BUSINESS**

**1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, Herald Lee:**

Suggested that the AGC provide Karen with a retainer to allow Kimberly to ask questions and seek assistance from Karen should help be needed. Treasurer reported that Karen had agreed to be on retainer for 2 weeks to help Kimberly.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Randy Still:**

Doors West has been retained to maintain the front gate of the club. The old gate has been replaced along with the electronics associated with the gate. The gap on the new gate will remain as is for now. Cal is familiar with the operation of the new gate.

The old shed was torn down next to the caretaker's house as well as the old fence between the house and the 22 silhouette range. Cal now has clear view of the front gate from his home. Deck on the new trailer has been completed with donated lumber and man power donated primarily by Mr. Cromie. It looks quite professional. Tree contractor was contacted and the sporting clays area was cleared out nicely. All the sporting clays sheds will be trashed and new ones to be rebuilt. All the machines were locked up. Fencing around the club needs to be rebuilt/updated.

**Lead recovery:**

Motion made to resend last motion that placed 100% of the moneys obtained from the lead mining to the relocation fund. New motion, to split the money between the relocation fund and range improvement 50/50.

Motion seconded and passed.

Mr. Miller added : Normally around \$25,000.00 to \$30,000.00 required per year for club maintenance.

**Secretary, Martin Visnak:**

Nothing to add. Mr. Visnak was asked to contact Mr. Scott on status of 200 Yard shelter rebuild (Eagle Scout Project). Provide BOD with status next meeting. Terry is to purchase new First Aid Kit to replace contents of the kit stolen from the silhouette range last month.

**VII NEW BUSINESS****1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, Herald Lee:**

Horse tracks have been seen on range grounds. Concern over poor condition of fencing and of proper signs posted on the fence to deter trespassing.

Motion made to contact a fence contractor to estimate cost for new fence and signs placed around AGC.

Motion seconded and passed.

Range Survey was provided by Jess. Only one copy of the survey remains in BOD's possession. Members or former BOD members are asked to return any copies of the survey they may have to Jess.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Randy Still:**

Would like BOD's opinion to raise fee for weekend trap for non members only to help cover fees for birds. Fuel prices are up and are reflected in bird prices. Perhaps have different color tickets for member and non members. Makes it easier for the trap personnel to recognize difference between the two types of weekend trap shooters. Again, this is proposed only for non member fees.

Motion made to increase non member fees for trap on weekends to \$6.00 a round, using the 2 colored tickets that are date stamped to differentiate between member and nonmember.

Trap personnel were made to wear safety glasses and hearing protection while on the field.

**Secretary, Martin Visnak:**

200 Yard frame needs to be rebuilt. Range flags need to be replaced. AJ said he has additional flags and building materials in the shed. No specific date slated for rebuild of the frame. Various members volunteered to assist in rebuild. Spoke with Cal and was informed that he is counting the barrels daily from the lead mining.

**BOD member Gary Ames:**

Mule Deer Foundation would like to place 1 year membership up for auction as a fund raiser. Minimum bid was asked to be \$150.00. Herald Lee stated that legally the AGC is disallowed to participate in such a venture.

Point of order by Terry: When a motion is made and seconded the motion no longer the motion of the individual making it and becomes the motion of the organization (AGC). Therefore be cautious as to seconding the motion if there are any unresolved issues.

**AGC Member Rich Immel:**

Passed out tentative AGC calendar for 2008, for BOD members to approve at next BOD meeting. 146 items on the AGC calendar for 2008

**Anonymous AGC Member:**

Would like to donate a popcorn machine to the AGC clubhouse. AGC to pay for any bowls, liners and or bags and popcorn, supplies and maintenance.

BOD to table the idea for 1 Month.

## MATCH RESULTS

### MBABR

The year is over for MBABR and I think we had a great year. I want to thank all of my fellow shooters that stepped in and helped out by running matches that couple of times I could not attend.

We finished of the season with a new match....Outlaw Sniper. I picked this format to allow the guys that shoot the 200 yd sniper match a chance to sight in and to allow those that do not shoot the 200 yd matches a chance to see what goes on at the other military rifle match. We did allow conventional iron sight shooting for those that wanted to shoot our standard format.

We had four shooters in the MBABR and eight shooters chose to shoot the outlaw sniper format.

Rob Spurrier shot well enough with iron sights to keep pace with most of the scoped shooters. Small group in the first string was Richard Immel with a 1.110" ( folks that is a ten shot group at 100 yds!) and Rob shot a 1.577" with iron sights which replaces out previous record. In the second string Richard proved it was not a fluke with a 1.165"! In iron sight Rob was first with a 2.467" in score shooting we had several shooters step up a notch. Terry Humbargar shot a 99-1x followed by Kent Beach with a 98-3x while Rob tied Richard with a 97-1x. In the second string Richard and Kent tied with a 100-7x, followed by Terry's 98-2x. In the final stage I some how managed to top out with a 98 followed by Terry with a 97-3x.

Overall Rob Spurrier won iron sight with a 283-4x followed by Charles Farah with a 271 and third place was Randy still with a 267-2x. In the Outlaw Sniper class Terry took first place with a 294-6x followed by my 287-3x and third was Marvin Smith with a 283-2x.
