IV. MEMBERS FORUM

Pete Benoit – Plans to run 6 AR-15 matches - 3 bench rest & 3 positioning matches, alternating each of them beginning in April and going until September. Any AR-15 will be allowed and the rules will be fairly basic. Target will be scope or iron targets. Bench rest to use same format as Military. Minimal fee. This match will be designed to be just for fun! Pete is also going to be holding 3 classes during the month of Dec. and Jan., with the first on Dec. 8th from 9 – 12 for 1903 Springfield. More information to be emailed out to members and in the next newsletter.

Matt Hess - Wanted to know about the repair of the berms and where the club was at with that? David Faingold took an action to work on the issue and will report back next month.

Fred Smith – Just wanted to wish the US Marine Corps a Happy 243rd Birthday on Nov. 10th.

AGC CRO, Terry Humbargar – Safety cones! Terry proposed to the board that a shooter on the 100-yard range should be required to place an orange safety cone on the bench when a member is in a shooting position that may not be easily visible to other shooters. The club will provide the cones and they will be available in front of the black powder shed. Range Officers will be notified to let members know to use them. This new safety measure is for the 100-yard range.

V. OLD BUSINESS

Financial Report — AGC President, Tom Desmond — October revenues were \$19,198 and our expenses were \$36,167 leaving a loss of (\$16,970). Our YTD revenue is \$201,269 and our YTD expenses are \$249,889 leaving a loss of (\$48,620). Account balances: Checking Account \$118,322; Payroll Account \$14,134 and Savings Account \$568,704. Money market account \$301,771.

CD or other Investment Update – Will put on next month's agenda.

Dissolution Plan – AGC President, Tom Desmond – There is a site that I searched regarding dissolving a non-profit. <https://www.councilofnonprofits.org/tools-resources/dissolving-nonprofit-corporation> If the club would have to close and dissolve the funds, the funds would have to be given to another non-profit. The club could also have the funds transferred to a new club if that option were to open up.

Christmas Party Update – Manny Boyd – Come one and come all! Door prizes are going we'll and we will have a good variety of items to give as prizes. Would like an email sent out reminding members of the Christmas Party.

No Incidents to report this month.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

Conflict of Interest Policy – AGC President, Tom Desmond - Board members that were present signed the agreement. The 2 board members that were absent will sign next month.

Pipeline Easement – AGC President, Tom Desmond - Company interested in easement on the western edge of the property to run pipeline from the oil rig. Easement is 50 feet by 781 feet running north and south. The proposal was for a payment of \$39,050 with 20% up front, and 80% upon completion. This offer is coming in about ½ of what the property would sell for, based on price per square foot of the sale of the 10 acres north of us. The contract is up for negotiation. Several different sizes of pipes would be laid. They would need access to the property at different times, not exactly sure how often. Pipes would connect with other land owner's easements and pipelines. The board will have the company's representative come to next months board meeting for discussion. Property would need to be deeded or leased. It was discussed that leasing might be an option.

New System for Recording Work Party Credits – AGC President, Tom Desmond – There have been a few problems with members not getting credited with all of their work party hours. It was discussed in a previous board meeting that the Chair Disciplines can schedule work party hours and will need to be responsible for sending that information to the Administrative Assistant. Richard and David Faingold are also authorized to have members do work at the club. Dave can organize members to do some work and notify Richard who can sign off that the work was completed. The board would like to see a 2-step verification when it comes to work party credits. A form will be made and distributed to those who can authorize work credits.

Review 2019 Range Activity Schedules – Most all of the 2019 Range Activity Schedules have been submitted. Steve will get the calendars ready to review next month. Next month Work Party and Swap meet dates will be determined.

2019 Renewal Process – Carla reported that 292 members have completed the renewal process, still waiting for 20 that paid online to send paper-work, 1 member to send in updated NRA information, 2 to send checks and 4 that have notified that they are moving.

Terry Humbargar wanted to add a Big thank you to Greg Sether who worked on the targets and the archery range. It was asked how things were going with Cabela's? Tom stated that they have the art work approved, but things are moving slowly right now. They have had some personnel changes that may be contributing to the slow process. We will hopefully have items available next year.

Discussion about planting some Rocky Mtn. Junipers on the northern property line to provide a barrier between us and the RV Storage facility. These trees are native to the area and hearty trees.

David Faingold – Mentioned that Richard recently took a CPR class and would like to see other staff members take it as well.

NEW SAFETY MEASURE—Orange Safety Cones

The decision was unanimously approved by the board and will be an enforceable rule. The club will provide the cones which will be located in front of the Black-powder/CMP shed. 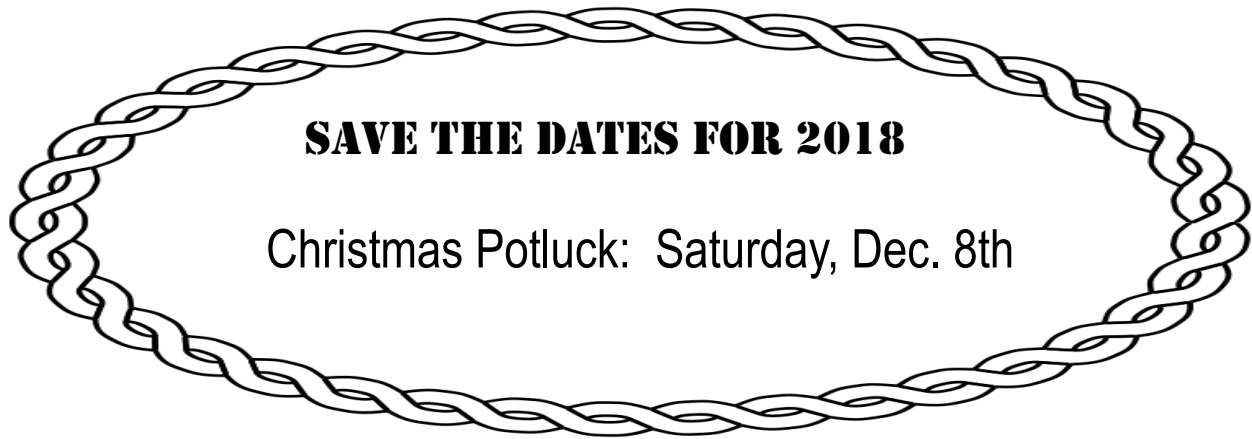
