BOARD MEETING MINUTES 11/8/2022

Meeting called to order at 7pm by 1st VP, Chris Baker

I. CALL TO ORDER

Motion seconded and passed

III. MINUTES

11.8.2022 b. Motion to approve minutes from 10/11/2022 BOD meeting Motion seconded and passed

IV. MEMBERS FORUM

Mike Benskin – Mike commented that at the September board meeting, the contractor said the clubhouse would be completed by the end of October and it's not done yet.

Rich Dimisko – Rich said he reviewed the meeting minutes from several newsletters and quoted the Clubhouse Renovation Status from the following Meeting Minutes – May 2021, June 2021, July 2021 and August 2021. Rich brought up different action items that were supposed to be done but were not done. He feels that AGC keeps getting excuses from the contractor and no results, and it's a stain on the club and has added tension with the members. He asked why the old cabinets have not been removed or placed in the onsite dumpster? Chris Baker said that taking legal action has been talked about and the board is aware of the progress. Rich asked if the contractor has given a recent update about the status of the clubhouse. Chris then said the board is waiting until all board members are present at a meeting to discuss the next steps. Willie Chatman said he would like to interject as he has read through the contract 10 times and it has been explained to him 3 different times legally. He said if we take legal action, it will only push back the completion date and cause more delays. David Faingold said that the contractor told him that the electrician cannot do any work until November 21st which will cause delays. David said we have member, Scott Mackenzie that does electrical work for the club or hire a larger electrical company to do the work.

Fred Smith – Fred mentioned that Friday is Veteran's Day and said to Thank a veteran for their sacrifices.

V. OLD BUSINESS

<u>Financial Report</u> — 2nd VP, David Faingold – October revenues were \$23,393 and our expenses were \$19,219 with a net gain of \$4,174. Our YTD revenue is \$258,097 and our YTD expenses are \$234,461 with a net gain of \$23,636. Account balances: Chase Checking Account \$63,937; Chase Payroll Account \$16,128 and Chase Savings Account \$282,022; Bank of the West Money market account \$208,559.

<u>Maintenance Update</u> – 2nd VP, David Faingold – David said he would like to call out for members to help with regular maintenance at the club and they will get work party credits for their time. Dietrich asked about the caretaker's house. David said the inside storage area has been cleaned up and organized. There was only one room painted in the house. The club is still looking for a caretaker. David said the porta potty services have recently been taken over by Honey Bucket and they will service them on Fridays. It was asked if the caretakers house bathroom can be available to members and David said yes, the door is unlocked and they can use it through the winter if they need to. Matthew Hess asked about the larger porta potties and David said he didn't want them to freeze so they were removed from the property.

<u>Clubhouse Renovation Status</u> – 2nd VP, David Faingold – The clubhouse renovation status was discussed during Members Forum – see above.

<u>2023 Membership Renewals Update</u> – Admin Assistant, Nicole Quiring – Nicole said she has received 299 completed renewals back and they were in the process of being entered. She said there have only been a couple that needed additional information, members are sending updated NRA verification and members seem to like they can send their paperwork back electronically by email if they pay by credit card.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

<u>Incident Reports</u> – 1st VP, Chris Baker – No reports.

PSAC Discussion – Member/Chairman, Matthew Hess – Matthew said he would like to ask the board if his discipline can add an extra PSAC match to the 4th Sunday of each month next year. He explained that one of the PSAC clubs located in Clear Creek is being shut down because their county is not renewing the lease so the whole club will eventually be shut down. They are looking for another location to shoot that specific match and asked if they could do so at AGC the 4th Sunday of each month in berms 4 – 7. He would still be the discipline chairman for this match but may have a different crew than the other monthly match. Chris Baker asked about berm 7 and if there was any concern for shooting in that berm on the west side as it goes towards the highway. Willie Chatman said he spoke to Dave Hay and Dave's concern that the reason they can't use berm 7 was because of the trap trailer, 470 being in view and possibility of ricochet. Matthew said he looked at it on Sunday and it seems lower than the other berms and you cannot see the highway from berm 7. Dietrich said he would like to make a point about PSAC previously wanting to forfeit the 5th berm for the 4th Sunday match. Willie said his only concern is taking up so many berms from members on back-to-back weekends for 2 matches. Terry Humbargar (in attendance) asked if this match would be an AGC sponsored event and Matthew said yes, he would be the AGC member to sponsor as he does for the other monthly match. The board agreed to allow PSAC to hold an additional match on the 4th Sunday of each month starting in 2023.

Review December Calendar – Nicole Quiring reviewed the December calendar.

Deitrich Whitesides – Dietrich asked on behalf of the NRA Action Pistol discipline if they can hold their regional match in October 2023. Willie Chatman – Willie had a member that asked him to discuss with the board possibly creating an online forum on the website so members can talk and discuss AGC/shooting related topics. There could be someone to monitor the posts. In addition, Willie said he was also stopped by a different member over the weekend, and they had asked about the fumes coming from the clubhouse. He said if we have propane tanks in the clubhouse and it goes off, we are responsible for the damage. They were being used to keep the pipes from freezing. Chris Baker asked David to look for the water shut off valve and just turn the water off so the pipes won't freeze. It was also asked who is paying for the onsite dumpster and David said it is being paid for by the contractor at \$600 flat fee to have it removed. It has been removed one time so far.

Chris Baker – Chris announced there would be an executive session after the meeting.
